Serious allegations of nepotism and favouritism have also cropped in MGNREGA where only the names and deans of ministers and legislators and the influential officers and engineers are being given important postings. A village level worker (VLUW), who is brother-in-law of another BJP MLA, was last year alleged to have been promoted as in-charge Inspector Panchayat (Grade -II) in own pay and grade and posted in Wanwan block against an available post. In July, 2016, a BDO posted him to handle the financial matters of MGNREGA even as there was already an assistant accounts officer to do this job. People feel that BJP, which had been criticising other political parties for encouraging politics of relationships, has now taken a U-turn, by employing relatives at prime posts. If it does not mend its ways, it is unlikely to repeat its performance in the next assembly polls in the state.

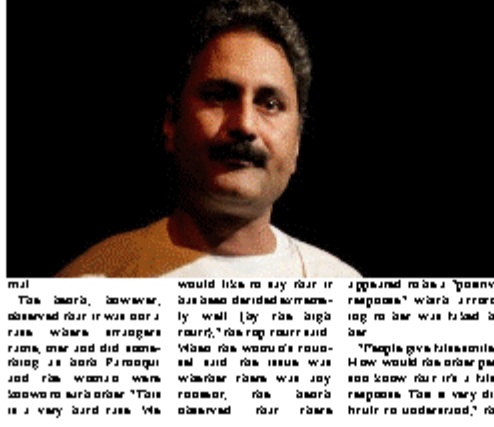
SC dismisses plea against 'Peepi Live' director Mahmood Farooqui's acquittal in rape case

India Ratings projects economic growth at 7.1% next fiscal

NEW DELHI: India Ratings and Research on Thursday projected the country's economic growth to improve to 7.1 per cent over the next fiscal year, buoyed by robust manufacturing demand and low commodity prices.

In its outlook for 2018-19, the agency said there will be a gradual pick up in growth momentum owing to structural reforms like GST and industrial policy. "While the implementation of GST is likely to boost the economy over the medium to long term, the same cannot be said about the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) and the Finance Bill, 2017," India Ratings & Research (IaR), a subsidiary of Paris-based Moody's, said.

IaR's report says the country's GDP is

projected to grow 7.1 per cent year-on-year in 2018-19, it said. The projection is a tad lower than the 7.4 per cent growth secured by Asia Development Bank (ADB) and International Monetary Fund (IMF) for another year.

IaR said the government's tax and social security measures would be a major boost to the economy in 2017-18. The global growth rate is projected to pick up, IaR says, but it is likely to remain below 3.4 per cent in 2018-19, adding to the risk of a global economic slowdown.
