

FM's Budget options are severely limited

Quite clearly a Budget is an imperative; otherwise a gov-ernment will drift along aimssly, though it often to be the case even with the minutely-specified most minutely-specified Budget. (Representational

The presentation of the Union Budget is more of a media event than a realistic statement of objectives and goals, and ways and means. The Budget is the basic blueprint that specifies what the government intends to do in the financial year to come, and how it intends to spend and raise the resources to do that. It doesn't use the occa sion to tell us what it did with the announced Budget the

Quite clearly a Budget is an imperative; otherwise a gov-ernment will drift along aim-lessly, though it often seems to be the case even with the most minutely-specified Budget. Having said that, one must wonder why there is such a fuss each year when India's finance minister is about to present the Budget. If one analyses each of the

65-odd Budgets that finance ministers have presented over the years, little seems to be anging in how they pro-ose to raise and spend each ear. This is not to say that the first Budget raised and spent revenues in the same way as inst brouget tasees of an speni revenues in the same way as this week's Budget will. The first Budget presented by RK. Shamnukham in 1947 was one that stayed within the means that were available, and did not nely very much on borrowings. The pattern of taxing and borrowing changed hugely over the years. The incidence of taxes has come down and the extent of borrowing has risen. So much so that the national debt has burgoened and the interest burden become heav-



ier. Let it not be forgotten that at the time of Independence India was debt-free and was owed a mountain of money by Britain

India's national debt now is gargantuan and burden-ome Rs 70,450,136,500,510 some Rs 70,450,136,500,510 — or Rs 70 lakh crores. The inter-est burden each year now is Rs 4,577,329,694,115, and est burden each year now is Rs 457729/64/115, and growing. Consequently, the debt per ditizen is Rs 859/4. Debt as a percentage of GDP is 49/0 per cent. So, one thing is for sure, interest has to be provided for. This is the second-biggest provision, accounting for 18 per cent of the Budget. New Type Of Botox Discovered From Animal Gut Bacteria

Scientists have discov-ered a new source of neurotoxin, known for its paradoxical ability to remove wrinkles yet cause an illness associatcause an illness associated with food poisoning from a strain of animal gut bacteria, a finding that can potentially expand its therapeutic applications. Clostridium botulinum toyin was able to jump. toxin was able to jump into bacteria called Enterococcus faecium. Enterococcus taecium, through plasmids, mobile structures that contain DNA independ-ently of the chromo-somes and can be swapped from one bac-torium to apother the terium to another, the study showed.

Enterococci are hardy

microbes that thrive in

tracts of nearly all land animals, including our own, and generally cause no harm.

cause no harm.

But their ruggedness has lately made them leading causes of multidrug resistant infections, especially in settings like hospitals where antibiotic use disrupts the natural balance of intestinal microbes. microbes "This is the first time

"Ins is the first time that an active botulinum toxin has been identified outside of Clostridium botulinum and its rela-tives, which are often found in soil and untreated water," said Andrew Doxey, a bioin-formatics professor at the University of

"Its discovery has implications in several fields, from monitoring the emergence of new pathogens to the devel-opment of new protein therapeutics -- it's a game changer," Doxey added.

Over the past 20 years, botulinum toxin type A, known as Botox, has been used for a growing number of therapeutic applications including atment for migraines leaky bladders, e

leaky bladders, excessiv sweating and cardiac conditions. In the study, which appeared in the journal Cell Host and Microbe, the researchers were able to sequence the genome of the E. faecium bacteria drawn from



ow faeces, and found the gene for botulinum toxin in the bacterial

botulinum toxin was likely transferred from C. botulinum bacteria in

the environment into the E. faecium bacteria in the cow's gut, showing that the toxin can be

transferred between very different species. "The botulinum toxin is a powerful and versatile protein therapeutic," said Michael Mansfield, said Michael Mansheld, a Biology doctoral stu-dent at the varsity. "By finding more versions of the toxin in nature, we can potentially expand and optimise its thera-peutic applications even further. further.



The Urban Warfare Front of Colombia's National Liberation Army (ELN) guerrillas on Sunday claimed responsibility for the bombing of a police station that killed five police officers and wounded 41. "The ELN, in legitimate exercise of the right to rebellion, carried out ... military action ... Police forces at the San Jose sta tion, in southern Barranquilla, were attacked," said the

tion, in southern Barranquilla, were attacked, said the group in a communique, the authenticity of which has not yet been verified.

The group added that it carried out the Saturday attack in the city of Barranquilla because it feels that the government "is refusing to give answers to the needs of the people, is inventing excuses for not guaranteeing their rights and is using the public (security) forces to their rights and is using the public (security) torces to repress the people", Eie reported. The government and the ELN last year launched peace talks in Quito, but the dialogue has been suspended since January 10 due to a wave of attacks by the rebel group after a bilateral cease-fire that had been in effect for 100 days ended.

The shooting was the result of a domestic dispute.
