SC: Collegium discussions can't be in public domain



NEW DELHI: Supreme Court Friday dis-missed a plea seeking a copy of decisions taken by missed a plea seeking a copy of decisions taken by its Collegium on December 12, 2018, saying no final decision was taken that day and, therefore, discussions which are part of a consul-tative process cannot be made public. "Some discussions might have taken place. But unless and until a final decision is taken after due consultation, and on the

consultation, and on the basis of such a final decision a final resolution is drawn, whatever discusdrawn, whatever discussions had taken place can-not be said to be a final decision of the Collegium. The actual resolution passed by the Collegium only can be said to be a final decision of the Collegium and till then at the most, it can be said to be a tentative decision during the consultation," the bench of Justices M R Shah and C T Ravikumar said

Dismissing the plea by Dismissing the plea by RTI activist Anjali Bhardwaj, the bench said "a final decision is taken by the Collegium only after due consultation. During the consultation, if some discussion takes place but discussion takes place but no final decision is taken and no resolution is drawn, it cannot be said that any final decision is taken by the Collegium" which, it underlined, is a multi-

underlined, is a multi-member body whose deci-sion is embodied in the res-olution that may be formal-ly drawn up and signed. Bhardwaj had cited a media interview by Justice (retired) Madan B Lokur, who was a member of the Collegium at the relevant time, to contend that the December 12, 2018 meeting had finalised recommending elevation of two High Court Chief Justices to the Supreme Court, but it was changed after his retirement.

However, the judgement

pointed out that in the Resolution dated January 10, 2019, "it is specifically mentioned that in the earlimentioned that in the earlier meeting held on 12.12.2018 though some decisions were taken but ultimately the consultation was not completed and concluded and, therefore, the matter/agenda items was/were adjourned. was/were adjourned. Therefore, as no final decision was taken which cul minated into a final resolu minated into a man signed by all the members of the Collegium, the same was not required to be disclosed in the public domain and that too under the RTI Act. Whatever is discussed shall not be in the public domain".

by Bhardwaj, the bench said, "So far as the reliance placed upon some of the news item/article pub-lished in the media in which views of one of the members of the Collegium is noted, is concerned.

Sexual abuse of children remains hidden problem, state must encourage families to report abuse: CJI

NEW DELHI: Sexua NEW DELHI: Sexual abuse of children remains a hidden problem as there is a culture of silence and therefore the state must encourage families to report abuse even where the perpertator is a family member, Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud said on Saturday. Speaking at a two-day national programme on the

national programme on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, the CJI said it is an unfortunate fact that the unfortunate fact that the criminal justice system functions in a way that sometimes compounds the victims' trauma and the executive must therefore join hands with the judici-ary to prevent this from hangening.

"The long-lasting impli-cations of child sexual abuse make it imperative for the state and other stakeholders to create awareness holders to create awareness regarding the prevention of child sexual abuse and its timely recognition and the remedy available in law. Children must be taught the difference between safe touch and unsafe touch. While this was previously couched as good touch and couched as good touch and bad touch, child rights activists have urged parents to use the word safe and unsafe because the word good and bad have moral implications and may pre-vent them from reporting



"Above all, there is an urgent need to ensure that the so-called honour of the family is not prioritised above the best interest of above the best interest of the child." He said the state must encourage the families to report abuse even when the perpetrator is a family member. "It is an unfortunate fact that the manner in which the criminal justice system functions sometimes com-

functions sometimes compounds drama, the victims' trauma. The executive must therefore join hands with the judiciary to prevent this from happening," Chandrachud said. CJI

Addressing the gather-ing, the CJI also urged the legislature to take into con-sideration the growing con-cern around age of consent

under the POCSO Act.

"You are aware that the POCSO Act criminalises all sexual acts among those under 18 regardless of whether consent is present factually among the minors, because the presumption of the law is that there is no consent among those below 18.

"In my time as a judge, I have observed that this category of cases poses diffi-cult questions for judges

across the spectrum.

There is a growing concern surrounding the issue which must be considered by the legislature in view of reliable research by experts in adolescent healthcare. I should leave this topic right here as this topic is very vexed as we see in courts everyday," he said. The CJI said the families

of victims are immensely

of victims are immensely hesitant to file a complaint with the police so one must be very careful about entrusting excessive powers to the police.

The slow pace of the criminal justice system is undoubtedly one of the reasons for this. But other factors also play a significant role in this. Issues concerning sexual abuse of children ing sexual abuse of children continue to be plagued by immense stigma. There exists a culture of silence which stems from shame and conceptions of family

honour.
"Too harmful stereotypes

only a girl child is likely to be sexually abused. The sec-ond stereotype is that the perpetrator is a stranger. Researchers demonstrate that boys are at equal risk of sexual abuse and the perpe-trator is known to the vic-tim in an overwhelming number of cases. Therefore, the problem of cases. the problem of sexual abuse of children remains a hidof children remains a hid-den problem. If the parents of the child do not wish to report the issue, the child is left without a voice...," Chandrachud said. The CJI said judges must remember that the children may not have the same vocabulary that adults do and may not discuss the

and may not discuss the details of the abuse in the same way as the adults do.
"But this does not mean

that they do not know what the perpetrator has done to

them.

Children of different ages may express themselves differently. But the essence of what they are communicating must be understood especially durant conservamination. cross Their contact with the criminal justice system must suit their needs as a vulnerable class of people," he said. Rajouri, December 10: A day-long training programme on the registra-tion of births and deaths through the

The training programme was organised under the overall supervi-sion of Deputy Commissioner, Vikas Kundal, for the stakeholders of the twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch. At the outset, the DSEO, Sandeep Sharma, who is also Additional District Registrar, while interacting with the participants, said that the with the participants, said that the Civil Registration System (CRS) is a single mechanism for documenting vital incidents (births, deaths, and vital incidents (births, deaths, and stillbirths) as well as their parameters in a continual, permanent, mandatory, and universal manner. Detailed delib-erations on the future roadmap for shifting to online registration through the Web Portal of ORGI (Office of the Registrar General of India) for regis-tration of births and deaths and the action required to be taken by the line action required to be taken by the line departments for implementation of the civil registration system were held

the civil registration system were held during the training program. While interacting with the trainces, the Deputy Commissioner said that Civil Registration System (CRS) is a single mechanism for documenting vital incidents (births, deaths, still-births) as well as their parameters in a continual, permanent, mandatory, and universal manner. He also highlighted the use and



purpose of birth and death certificates, along with the importance of record-ing the occurrence and characteristics of these vital events, which are subse-quently used to study the demograph-ic profile and other features. The DC also underlined the role of local regis-trars and areas falling within their jurisdiction for the issuance of birth and death certificates, followed by and death certificates, followed by and death certificates, followed by imparting training to the master train-ers and participants for switching over to the online registration of births and deaths through the CRS Portal, which was done manually in rural

areas.

He also urged the trainees to properly acquaint themselves with the Civil Registration System as they are the stakeholders who will implement the system at ground level.

The DC also urged the registrars

(BDOs & EOs) to work with proper dedication for the implementation of Civil Registration System in letter and spirit. He also emphasized the need for holding training of the informers who shall inform the local registrars about the births and deaths in the areas of their respective jurisdiction. areas of their respective jurisdiction. Later, hands-on training was

Later, hands-on training was imparted to the trainess regarding the Civil Registration System. The Assistant Director, Resource Person from the Directorate of Census Operation, Manmeet Singh, gave a detailed presentation on the duties and responsibilities of registration functionaries involved in the Civil Registration System, with a special focus on the role of local registrate for the issuance of birth and death certificates in the areas falling within their jurisdiction.

Superintendent Kupwara, Abdul Gani Dai Kupwara, Abdul Gani Dar adding that this hospital is a centrally located hospital in District Kupwara catering about 70% of the patient load and referrals from other health institutions. He said since the District is about 100 kilometer away from Srinagar, referrals of patients usually cause pain

patients usually cause pain and anguish amongst the patients, their attendants in particular and public in gen eral, and to overcome the same a lot of efforts were same a lot of efforts were made during last three years to upgrade the health serv-ices but it was the accredita-tion of this hospital with DNB that has changed the health scenario dramatical-

Since its accreditation with DNB, the hospital has got professional manpower as well as modern machinery equipment. Two Anesthetists and 42 Junior



DNB programme are discharging their services in this hospital, said MS.

The MS said that in April 2022 it was news as two Post graduate students joined here in the department of General Medicine and one amongst them was from outside the state (Andhra Pradesh). The hospital has since then also got DNB accreditation for specialties of General Surgery, Gynecology / Obstetrics and Anesthesiology while a final assessment for the accredi-tation of Pediatrics has also been done, he added. hours.

water etc are to be taken into consideration while designing Grey Water Management Projects. Interacting with the par-cipants, the Director

ticipants, the Director Rural Sanitation J&K asked them to focus on sustaining them to focus on sustaining the gains from the first phase of the project. He said that the assets should be developed in a methodical manner so that they not only work effectively but also sustain over the years to come. The works on sanitation which has now gained momentum in rural areas should continue with the same vigour to make all the same vigour to make all the villages visually clean

the villages visually clean in the years to come. Another vital issue of retrofitting of toilets which is conversion of single pit toilets into twin pit toilets was also deliberated upon. It was emphasized that the technological waps affecttechnological gaps affect-ing toilet functionality and faecal sludge management was an important aspect of the Mission.
