# Rajouri: Training imparted to officials on registration of births, deaths on CRS Portal

Rajouri, December 10: A day-long training programme on the registration of births and deaths through the civil registration system was organised today in Rajouri.

The training programme was organised under the overall supervision of Deputy Commissioner, Vikas Kunalat, for the stakeholders of the twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch. At the outset, the DSEO, Sandeep Sharma, who is also Additional District Registrar, while interacting with the participants, said that the Civil Registration System (CRS) is a single mechanism for documenting vital incidents (births, deaths, and stillbirths) as well as their parameters in a continual, permanent, mandatory, and universal manner. Detailed deliberations on the future roadmap for shifting to online registration through the Web Portal of ORGI (Office of the Registrar General of India) for registration of births and deaths and the action required to be taken by the line departments for implementation of the civil registration system were held during the training program.

While interacting with the trainees, the Deputy Commissioner said that Civil Registration System (CRS) is a single mechanism for documenting vital incidents (births, deaths, stillbirths) as well as their parameters in a continual, permanent, mandatory, and universal manner. He also highlighted the use and



purpose of birth and death certificates, along with the importance of recording the occurrence and characteristics of these vital events, which are subsequently used to study the demographic profile and other features. The DC also underlined the role of local registrars and areas falling within their jurisdiction for the issuance of birth and death certificates, followed by imparting training to the master trainers and participants for switching over to the online registration of births and deaths through the CRS Portal, which was done manually in rural areas.

He also urged the trainees to properly acquaint themselves with the Civil Registration System as they are the stakeholders who will implement the system at ground level. The DC also urged the registrars

(BDOs & EOs) to work with proper dedication for the implementation of Civil Registration System in letter and spirit. He also emphasized the need for holding training of the informers who shall inform the local registrars about the births and deaths in the areas of their respective jurisdiction.

Later, hands-on training was imparted to the trainees regarding the Civil Registration System. The Assistant Director, Resource Person from the Directorate of Census Operation, Manmeet Singh, gave a detailed presentation on the duties and responsibilities of registration functionaries involved in the Civil Registration System, with a special focus on the role of local registrars for the issuance of birth and death certificates in the areas falling within their jurisdiction.

Speaking on the occasion, officers/officials from various departments raised awareness among the general public about the various government sponsored schemes and urged people to take benefits from them.

## DC Kulgam, Dr. Bilal Bhat reviews implementation of socio-economic schemes through various deptts

**JI NEWS SERVICE Kulgam, December 10:** The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Kulgam, Dr. Bilal Mohi-Ud-Din Bhat today chaired a meeting of officers to review implementation of various schemes and programmes by NRLM, Labour, Employment, Tribal and other departments.

During the meeting, the District Manager NRLM informed the chair that under NRLM so far 3249 SHGs have been formed in Kulgam and out of 683 SHGs targeted for the current financial year, 350 have been formed so far.

He added that 443 SHGs have been linked to Banks for credit with 7.43 Crores during the current financial year.

The DC instructed the concerned to utilize online marketing platforms to increase marketing opportunities. Assistant Director Employment Kulgam informed the chair that the Level I implementation Committee has approved 225 cases under Mumkin scheme and 81 cases under Tejaswini scheme so far in

the district. 148 vehicles have been distributed under the Mumkin scheme with the total on-road price of Rs. 12.06 Crore including 20 percent subsidy amount of Rs. 2.25 Crore and Loan amount of Rs 9.81 Crore, he informed adding, 25 more cases stand sponsored for sanction of loan.

He also said that under the Tejaswini scheme, 16 cases have been disbursed involving Rs 80 lac loan amount and Rs 8 lac subsidy amount. He added that there is an overwhelming response under the Spurring scheme also and 97 cases have been approved by DLIC so far and 90 cases are under process.

While reviewing the Labour Department, the chair was briefed that in financial year 2021-22 an amount of Rs.5.90 Crore among 7236 beneficiaries under Lower Education Assistance scheme was disbursed and an amount of Rs. 17.50 lakh was disbursed among 35 beneficiaries under Higher Education Assistance Scheme. Besides, the department disbursed an

amount of Rs. 12.30 lakh among 6 beneficiaries under Death Cum Funeral Assistance scheme and also disbursed an amount of Rs. 0.71 lakh among 3 beneficiaries under Chronic Disease Assistance Scheme.

In addition to the above mentioned disbursements the Department has made 643 registrations under Shops & Establishments Act and generated revenue to the tune of Rs 7,03,450.

He added that they have received an amount of Rs. 63.56 lac as Cess and subsequently sent the same to the JKBCOWWB and till date and 154352 registrations under e-Shram have also been done.

Authorities from Women Development Corporation informed the chair that they have sanctioned approximately 1.20 crore in district Kulgam under different schemes including NMDFC, NBCFDC, WEP and Micro Credit schemes.

The meeting was attended by JD-Planning, ALC, A.D Employment, DM WDC, DM NRLM and other officers.

## Workshop cum Training programme on benefits of EPF held at Udhampur

**JI NEWS SERVICE Udhampur, December 10:** A day long workshop cum training programme on the benefits of Employees provident fund (EPF) scheme was organized by Employees Provident Fund Office, Jammu under the supervision of Regional Employees Provident Fund Commissioner, J&K and Ladakh, Rizwan Uddin at Conference Hall DC Office Complex Udhampur.

As many as 100 officers/officials of different departments including other stakeholders attended the meeting. Representatives of



Provident Fund Office, Jammu briefed the participants about the benefits of EPF scheme. He informed that after abrogation of 370 all the EPF related acts are applicable in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. He apprised the participants about the Pension Scheme 1995 (EPS-95) as well as

Employees Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme (EDLI) and their benefits.

During the training programme, he informed the participants about the salient features of employees deposit linked insurance scheme 1976. Under this scheme maximum assured benefit up to Rs.7 lakh is paid to the nominee

or legal heir of an EPF member, if death occurs while in service, he added.

Later in the evening, PF Commissioner, Rizwan Uddin, briefed media on the salient features of Employees' Provident Fund Scheme, Employees' Pension Scheme 1995 (EPS-95) as well as Employees' Deposit

Linked Insurance Scheme (EDLI), with special emphasis on Pension and Insurance Schemes, as these schemes have driven home for the people who work in risky zones.

He urged the officers and other stakeholders to deposit the EPF of organized workers so that the workers may get these benefits. Officers/ stakeholders were asked to comply with the provision of EPF and MP Act 1952. He asked the participants to sensitize the organized workers in their respective departments so that eligible workers can avail the benefits of EPF scheme.

## Director Agriculture Jammu inspects field activities in Samba & Kathua Districts



**JI NEWS SERVICE Jammu, December 10:** Director Agriculture Production & Farmer Welfare, Jammu, K. K. Sharma, along with a team of officers, conducted an Extensive tour of Samba & Kathua district and took stock of the implementation of various Farmer Welfare Schemes and field activities being undertaken by the Department of Agriculture.

The Director Agriculture visited the SM Farm, Balode where he inspected the Pasteurized Mushroom Compost Making Unit under Mushroom Corridor Project and other farm activities undertaken on the farm spread over 56 Kanal. He visited the Exotic Vegetable Demonstration at Rakh Dhayansar and stressed upon production of high value vegetables under

protected conditions to get round the year production for high returns. He also inspected the Mushroom Production Units (2800 Bags) of Pushpinder Singh of Kartholi and instructed the staff to organize mushroom growers into Farmers Producer Organization (FPO) that will ultimately help in scaling up the level of production and creating better marketing linkages.

Earlier, the Director Agriculture chaired a meeting of the Staff at the Sub Divisional Agriculture Office, Samba and received feedback on the status of various Farmers Welfare Schemes including social sector schemes like PM-KISAN, PM-KMY, PM-FBY, KCC etc. The CAO Samba, Sanjay Verma, Dy. Project Director ATAMA, Arun Makhnotra, Assistant

Agriculture Chemist, Pradeep Shrama, SDAO Samba, Naresh Raina, Vijay Manager, Balode, FARM Choudhary besides GMSs, AEOs and Field Functionaries were present on the occasion.

During the visit to Kathua district, the Director Agriculture inspected different Mushroom Units developed under mushroom cluster, Jandi and expressed satisfaction over production and income status of mushroom cultivation.

It was informed that these mushroom units have been set up under Women Self Help Group and run by women entrepreneurs including Shakti Devi, Kamla Devi, Neelam Rani & Mina Devi.

On the way, he also inspected the field condition of Haldi (Turmeric) crops under the Spices Development Programme and stressed on the value addition of Spices by setting up units under the PM-Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises Schemes. Those who accompanied the Director included CAO Kathua, Sanjeev Rai Gupta, District officers, SDAO, Dayalalach, Ashwani Sharma besides other field functionaries.

## Health Services at SDH Kupwara show dramatic improvement after DNB accreditation: MS

**JI NEWS SERVICE Kupwara, December 10:** The accreditation of Sub District Hospital (SDH) Kupwara with DNB has changed the health scenario dramatically and the Sub District Hospital Kupwara is the first Sub District Hospital to get accreditation with DNB in the whole country.

This was said by Medical Superintendent SDH Kupwara, Abdul Gani Dar adding that this hospital is a centrally located hospital in District Kupwara catering about 70% of the patient load and referrals from other health institutions.

He said since the District is about 100 kilometer away from Srinagar, referrals of patients usually cause pain and anguish amongst the patients, their attendants in particular and public in general, and to overcome the same a lot of efforts were made during last three years to upgrade the health services but it was the accreditation of this hospital with DNB that has changed the health scenario dramatically.

Since its accreditation with DNB, the hospital has got professional manpower as well as modern machinery equipment. Two Anesthetists and 42 Junior Nurses recruited under



DNB programme are discharging their services in this hospital, said MS.

The MS said that in April 2022 it was news that two Post graduate students joined here in the department of General Medicine and one amongst them was from outside the state (Andhra Pradesh). The hospital has since then also got DNB accreditation for specialties of General Surgery, Gynecology/Obstetrics and Anesthesiology while a final assessment for the accreditation of Pediatrics has also been done, he added.

The eight PG students

have joined in all above-mentioned specialties in this session which is going to give a huge boost to upliftment of health care services and quality patient care in the hospital.

It is worth mentioning here that after resumption of PG courses in General Medicine, the referrals have drastically fallen by 70% since last six months which speaks volumes about the improvement of health care services for patient care, said MS.

Among 661 patients admitted in the Department of General Medicine for the

last six months, only 66

were referred for tertiary care treatment, which would have been about 300 before DNB accreditation, added Dar. "We are now managing patients of varying critical health ailments like COPD, Pleural effusions, Ascites, Hepatitis, Tuberculosis, Meningitis, Chronic Kidney Disease besides stroke, Diabetic Ketoacidosis, Poisoning on latest scientific lines", said MS, adding that the post graduate students remain available round the clock for the services to the patient care besides the Consultants

of such specialties also take regular rounds of the wards and attend calls whenever needed even during night hours.

The academic environment has been profoundly upgraded, besides teaching, regular seminars and CMEs are being conducted and PGs are given a very conducive atmosphere of reading by creating a library and seminar room within the premises of the hospital. The monthly mortality meets are held among the faculties and residents to assess and ascertain the cause of death. The critical patients are managed in ICU with excellent lab support, cardiac monitors, and defibrillators, Dar added.

"The PGs from within and outside the state have been provided suitable accommodation within the premises of hospital besides giving them other facilities to make them comfortable", MS informed. "The DNB accreditation of this hospital is taking the health care to the newer heights with marked increase in professional manpower and modern machinery gadgets and in near future rarely the patients shall be referred from this hospital. The hospital shall be providing 24/7 services in most of the specialties.

# Rural Sanitation Directorate hosts orientation programme on "Swachh Survekshan Gramin- 2023"

**JJ NEWS SERVICE JAMMU, DECEMBER 10:** An Orientation programme on Swachh Survekshan Gramin- 2023 initiative was today organized by Directorate of Rural Sanitation J&K here at Panchayat Bhawan Jammu. Director Rural Sanitation J&K, Charandeep Singh chaired the orientation programme attended by Assistant Commissioner Panchayats, Assistant Commissioner Development, District Panchayat Officers, Block Development Officers of Jammu, Kathua, Udhampur, Reasi and Samba District.

The Programme was also attended by the officers of Directorate of Rural Sanitation J&K.

In the orientation programme, experts Iksivaku Sharma and Vinay Tiwari from Government of India gave a detailed presentation on different stages of Swachh Survekshan Gramin 2023.

It was informed that Swachh Survekshan Gramin 2023 is an exercise for assessing the status of SBM Gramin in the rural areas. "It is aimed to gear wide participation of



all the villages by 31st of December, 2022. He stated that self assessment would give impetus to the performance of UT of J&K which has already achieved the milestone of 1000 ODF Plus villages.

He said that it was a great opportunity to deal with areas in which some of the Panchayats need to perform better. He further said that it would act as a means to increase the participation of locals which is the most integral aspect of making SBM 2.0 a success. The experts also gave a presentation on the other aspects of SBMG 2.0 including the two central concepts of Grey water Management and Solid Waste Management.

Both these issues were discussed in great detail and the experts discussed in detail the use of different technologies and creation of assets under the scheme.

It was put forth with clarity as to what kind of Grey Water and Solid Waste Management interventions needs to be undertaken at various places.

It was advised that various parameters such as the amount of Grey Water, the quality of land, quality of

water etc are to be taken into consideration while designing Grey Water Management Projects.

Interacting with the participants, the Director Rural Sanitation J&K asked them to focus on sustaining the gains from the first phase of the project. He said that the assets should be developed in a methodical manner so that they not only work effectively but also sustain over the years to come. The works on sanitation which has now gained momentum in rural areas should continue with the same vigour to make all the villages visually clean in the years to come.

Another vital issue of retrofitting of toilets which is conversion of single pit toilets into twin pit toilets was also deliberated upon. It was emphasized that the technological gaps affecting toilet functionality and faecal sludge management was an important aspect of the Mission.

The programme was followed by an interactive session where many queries were asked by the participants to achieve clarity on the issues. The programme ended with the vote of thanks.
