# 56 foreign militants killed this year, figure largest in past several years: J&K DGP

JAMMU: Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbagh Singh Monday said that this year 56 foreign militants were killed and the figure is largest in the past several years while as out of the 109 new militants, 8w were killed and ust 28 are remaining. He also said that number of both foreign as well as local militants has been brought to just two digits only.

Talking to reporters on the side-lines of a function in Jammu, DGP Dilbagh said that this year security forces against militancy, "This year 56 foreign militants were killed and the figure is largest if one pared to past several years," he said, as per news agency.

JKSAC raised their voice forcibly again for de-freez-ing of their seats and even on road in 1988 and came on road in 1988 and also resented strongly in 1995 but unfortunately hav-ing no political support of Jammu based political par-ties, they were denied of their legitimate constitu-tional rights of representa-tion.

He further urged upon the central govt. to consider their legitimate constitutional right of representa-tion as the same has already been recommended by IPC been recommended by JPC on Home affairs in Report No. 183 besides other issues and the govt. should de-freeze their share of seats in one go before the election in UT of J&K are held.

It appears that the KU invited applications of the posts of JPAs on a few occasions, setting into motion the process of regular selection, to which even the writ petitioners responded. But it seems that the KU did not take forward the selection process and ultimately invited fresh applications for filling up the posts of JPAs in terms of its Advertisement Notification No V of 2014 dated 09-05-2014.

its Advertisement Notification No V of 2014 dated 09-05-2014. On 4th March 2015, notice was issued by the authorities of KU for conducting written test for posts of JPAs, and it is at this stage that the writ petitioners filed SWP challenging the above advertisement notice and notice dated 4-03-2015. The writ petitioners have claimed that they are entitled to regularization of their appointment as JPAs in terms of Notification dated 3rd September 2014 issued by the University of Kashmir and sought a direction to this effect in the writ petition.

The KU contested the writ petition by filing reply thereto, and took a stand that the regularization policy was issued vide Notification Dated 3rd September 2014 pertains and applies to regularization against Class IV only and not to the higher posts of JPAs.

It was further claimed that only writ petitioner Zahoor Hussain was appointed on contractual basis against the post of JPA, wheare-as, other writ petitioners were engaged on casual basis to perform duties of orderlies, and, as such, they cannot claim regularization against the posts of JPAs. It was further contended by the KU that notification dated 3rd September 2014 owes its origin to the resolution dated 11.0.2013 passed by the University Council which does not envisage regularization of services of the writ petitioners against JPAs but he same envisages regularization against Class IV posts only.

"During the pendency of the writ petition, Rehana Nazir and Saba Ali, upon making application for impleadment, were impleaded as respondent No 7 and 8 to the writ petition. Both had participated in the selection process that was set into motion by the University pursuant to impugned advertisement notification No Vo 2014 dated 90-65-2014, and, according to then, respondent Rehana Nazir had secured merit position No 8 in the select list. These newly-added respondents also filed their response to the writ petition contending therein that they have undergone proper selection process and, as such, have right of consideration for appointment to the posts of JPAs and the same cannot be denied to them.

During the pendency of these intra-court appeals, the bowe named candidate Sabha Ali filed a writ petition where-by she challenged the policy of regularization as notified by the KU on 3rd September 2014 and on the ground that he impugned policy seeks to legitimize backdoor appoint-ment and perpetuates illegalities and irregularities in the propointments.

However, soon after the petition was called on for hearing, a bench of SC Justices Krishna Murari and S. Ravindra Bhat upon hearing the counsel observed that "there is an inordinate delay of 113 days in filing the SLPs which has not been explained satisfactorily. The SLPs are accordingly dismissed on the grounds of delay. Pending applications, if any, shall stand disposed of".

On November 29, the Kashmir University constituted a committee under the chairmanship of Dean Research to deliberate upon the order dated 07-11-2022 passed by the Supreme Court in the SLP and make recommendations thereof.

Thakur alleged that they were being discriminated upon by the government by not addressing the "huge pay anomabe between several cadres in and outside the department". Thakur said that on 5th August 2019, with the declaration of the State of Jammu & Kashmir as the Union Territory of India, they were hopeful that the employees of the Union Territory of J&K will get all the benefits of all the allowances and the pay at par with their counterparts in centre and other union territories. ference and discrimination. Thakur centre and other union territories, however nothing concrete has been done in this regard yet. The teachers in Jammu Kashmir Union Territory

has suffered a lot previously, even though the then state fixed the pay anomaly of major departments over a anomaly of major departments over a period of time, the pay anomaly which the teachers of J&K UT suffer has been left unattended he alleged. Thakur said that before the 6th Pay Commission, the Masters in Schot Education Department, after their hard fought efforts, were getting salaries equal to the AAOs and SOs. In the 6th Pay Commission, Pay grade the teachers were naid the Pay Band of the teachers were paid the Pay Band of Rs 5200-20200 with Grade Pay of Rs. Rs 5200-20200 with Grade Pay of Rs. 2800/ which in the revised pay matrix as per seventh Pay Commission was fixed at the Basic Pay of Rs. 29200. Pay grade of masters was fixed as 9300-34800+ GP 4250 whereas the pay Grade of the AAOs and SOs was fixed 9300-34800 + GP 4600. By fixing different pay grades for AAOs / SOS and the Master, the latter have again been discriminated. criminated.

"Further perpetuating the said Discrimination in 7th Pay Commission, the Masters have been placed at level 6E which starts with Rs. 35900 whereas the masters deserved to be placed at level 7 which starts with Rs. 44900. ## **Ensure no laxity in** biometric attendance

ammu and Kashmir government has finally decided to put its foot down to ensure accountability in the day-to-day functioning of the administration. For this, Chief Secretary Arun Kumar Mehta has issued fresh directions for strict compliance to the orders on biometric attendance of employees particularly in field offices. The directions have come following the low record of employees' biometric attendance across Jammu and Kashmir. It is quite unfortunate that employees working in various government offices seldom maintain discipline and reach their respective offices in time. It hampers the public delivery system badly, besides it gives a wrong notion that authorities at the helm of affairs are inefficient to bring accountability in the system. If media reports are to be believed, there is a cumulative achievement of 42 percent of employees' biometric attendance mainly attributed to the field offices. This is notwithstanding the fact that authorities have issued strict warnings to the employees for taking biometric attendance casually. Moreover, warnings have been issued for those employees who are carelessly taking directives regarding Employees Performance Monitoring portal carelessly. In June this year, instructions were issued to all government offices, PSUs, institutions and corporations across Jammu and Kashmir to switch over to biometric system with immediate effect and all employees were directed to necessarily mark their attendance both at arrival and departure as per the notified office hours of various offices. All administrative secre taries, heads and managing directors of PSUs, corporations and institutions were also directed to ensure installation of biometric attendance systems and equipment in all offices and institutions under their administrative control. All DDOs were also directed to draw salaries of employees only on the basis of satisfactory biometric attendance. It is an open fact that the people take government jobs casually with a commonly prevalent perception that they are not to be penalized. What is the need of the hour is to explore and work out a way out to have attendance of all employees in the field recorded biometrically without any laxity. To some extent, the government has achieved the strict compliance to the biometric attendance system in urban areas to great extent but it has remained a major challenge for authorities to ensure accountability in rural pockets where it has been observed that those employees who stay in the nearby vicinity leave the office premises either with the consent of controlling officers or without their knowledge in the middle of working hours and due to this office work suffers immensely. Authorities should evolve a suitable mechanism to check this tendency. The government should intensify surprise checks in the field offices to have onspot assessment over the compliance of the directives regarding eight hours duty in the government offices. All measures need to be put in place to regulate attendance of employees to ensure an

HE police in independent India have inherited some unwelcome legacies. One such legacy is alienation from the public. The police are viewed by the public with fear and suspicion. The Police Act, 1861, which outlines the structure and functions of the the structure and functions of the police in the country, sought to cre ate a ruler-appointed police to keep effective control over the people and not uphold and safeguard their rights. The same tradition has conrights. The same tradition has con-tinued in independent India. The outcome is a widening chasm between the police and the public. The people, in general, seek to avoid the police. In 1969, police scholar David Bayley, in his seminal work, Police and Political Development in India, had written that the police-public

and Political Development in India, had written that the police-public relationship in the country was characterised by a powerful "avoidance syndrome". The public avoids contact with the police and this avoidance syndrome is more pronounced in rural than urban areas. He states, "The Indian public is substantially unwilling to volunteer assistance in (giving) information to the police. They would rather not get involved." Other studies and surveys have confirmed this conclusion. firmed this conclusion

A bottom-up assessment of the Karnataka Police, Mirror of the Police, done by the Public Affairs Centre, Bengaluru, came to the same conclusion that for the Indian same conclusion that for the Indian police time had stood still and public trust in the police had not registered any improvement with the passage of time. In this survey, complainants from all walks of life as well as police personnel of all valve were interviewed. One of the ranks were interviewed. One of the major findings of the study was that a significant section of the public does not 'feel at ease' in dealing with the police. The psychological barriers that continued over the barriers that continued over the years have remained unchanged. The avoidance syndrome is more pronounced among the backward, illiterate and marginalised sections of society. I witnessed this phenom-non while serving in the National Human Rights Commission. Most of the compolianants against the of the complainants against the police were from the depressed classes. Besides serious complaints



of custodial violence and non-regis tration of cases, there were many complaints of rude and boorish police behaviour, which prompts them to avoid further contact with the police. This highlights the imperative need for human rights

imperative need for human rights sensitisation of the police and incul-cation of respect for human dignity. Dr Bayley's study further shows that negative and unflattering views about the police are more readily found with individuals who have had unfavourable contacts. have had unfavourable contacts with the police. Familiarity breeds contempt. Surveys done by the National Police Commission (1978-81) have also confirmed that people 81) have also confirmed that people who have had the experience of police misconduct are prone to believing that the cops are to be avoided because they frequently misbehave. Again, several poor and unlettered complainants are unaware of their legal rights and do not complain of rough treatment by the police

not complain or rough treatment by the police.

They also feel nothing can be achieved by complaining to the authorities. Thus, spreading aware-ness about human rights among the uninformed public should be one of the foremost functions of civil of the foremost functions of civil society and human rights groups. A significant number of complainants in the Karnataka survey stated that they do not get any information regarding the status of their com-

During the British rule, the police were discouraged to forge close relations with the public because of

relations with the public because of the erroneous presumption that it would handicap the police in deal-ing with the native populace. The Police Act, 1861, specifies various duties of the police, but fails to mention the most important responsibility of winning public support and cooperation, without which the police work becomes dif-ficult. In independent India also, the same guil between the police and public continues. Political boss-es fear that close rapport with the es fear that close rapport with the public will erode the fear of the police and affect law enforcement. Community policing experiments police and affect law enforcement. Community policing experiments in India have not been by and large successful because the police have not given the public a meaningful role in supervising police work and

The assessment review of the Karnataka Police revealed another disturbing aspect of the problem. There is often a difference between

description of the case as recorded in the file by the police. Many complaints are not registered as cases and in many instances there is minimisation of the offence. Thus, the imisation of the offence. Thus, the first encounter of many com-plainants with the police often is not a happy one. A small sample study carried out in Odisha revealed that people in general are appreciative of the problems and constraints of the police, but they feel disillusioned and irked when the police do not even visit the the police do not even visit the scene to make a worthwhile effort to crack the case, and eventually submit a wrong report. The Law Commission in its report sub-mitted in 1958 said, "The police mitted in 1985 said, "The police force, as a whole, is not regarded as a friend of the people. This mistrust does not encourage contact with the police." Viewing the problem from a global perspective, Bayley has said the situation is not unique to India. "Few American observers would expect an overwhelming. would expect an overwhelming vote of confidence in the police in

their own country."

Even in Britain, where the police Even in Britain, where the police enjoy a good reputation, a survey undertaken on behalf of the Royal Commission on the Police found that at least 10 per cent of the peo-ple thought that the police take bribe fairly often, use unfair meth-ods to get information and distort evidence in courts. Suspicion and avoidance of the police may be worldwide, but its macmitude and worldwide, but its magnitude and forms are critically different from

# Need to scrutinise Covid's cardiac impact

UMESH CS YADAV Heart attack has become a buzz-

Heart attack has become a buzz-word owing to several recent deaths of young and middle-aged people. The increasing number of deaths to the eart attack in the country is con-cerning and point towards lack of proper understanding of the issue. A few cases may be due to pre-existing heart-related issues leading to untimely death, but there are cases which may also be linked with Covid-19. However, due to lack of proper examination and study there is no clear evidence. may also happen in people who had relatively mild Covid and have fully recovered from it. The researchers are worried that after the main shock of the pandemic, which affected billions

These unfortunate deaths, nonethe less, have caught people's attention. Many people died either dancing, Many people died either dancing, singing, playing cricket or performing their duty like driving a bus. A sud-den surge in deaths due to heart attack during the Covid pandemic and later has, however, baffled clini-cians, policymakers and the common man equally. The experts are still not sure if and how these deaths are cor-related with Covid. Researchers do agree that Covid has affected our organ system in such ways that it is organ system in such ways that it is difficult to comprehend it without planned studies

According to a study based on the US Department of Veterans' Affairs data, people who had contracted Covid face a substantially high risk of cardiovascular issues, including heart attack and stroke. These problems of people globally, cardiovascular-related issues may turn out to be an

related issues may turn out to be an aftershock sesides, how long these aftershocks are going to be felt by the people is unclear.

In a recent study published in a journal, Nature, it was reported that people who recovered from severe Covid had extremely high risk of developing cardiac issues till a year later, including heart swelling and lung thromboembolism, which were up to 20-time higher than those in to 20-time higher than those in ninfected. Further, those who had mild infection and recovered at home without hospitalisation also had risk of heart attack (8 per cent higher) and of heart attack (8 per cent higher) and heart inflammation (2.5-fold higher). Other studies conducted in the UK also point out that people hospi-talised with Covid-19 have two-and-a-half to three-fold more risk of heart-related issues than those uninfected. However, other non-Covid factors may also have affected people indi-rectly, including irregular or missed health checkups, sedentary lifestyle

health check-ups, sedentary lifestyle without much physical activities,



high-energy diet and stress during

terestingly, a study at Yale University reported the presence of excessive number of auto antibodies excessive number of auto antibodies in the people hospitalised with severe Covid. Most of these antibodies are against one's own tissues and cell and can inadvertently attack the body tissues, including the heart, and weaken their architecture. These damages do not bother unless they accumulate over a period of time and result into acute events like heart attack and sudden death.

The coronavirus enters through the

The coronavirus enters through the ACE2 receptor found in organs and

tissues such as the lungs, neurons liver, kidney, intestine and also the heart and blood vessels. The damages caused to these organs and tissues are wide-ranging and long-lasting even after the Covid recovery. This is called 'long-Covid' that lasts for months to a year or more. Healthy endothelium, the innermost lining of blood vessels made up of endothelial cells, is crucial for the overall vascular health. These cells are prone to damage either by pathogens like viruses and bacteria or their toxic products, which linger on for longer duration heart and blood vessels. The damages which linger on for longer duration and induce thrombosis or blood clotting. The clots may block the blood

supply to vital organs like the heart or brain and cause heart attack or stroke, respectively. This may be a possibility in Covid-recovered people with dam-aged or weakened endothelial cells.

Furthermore, studies also found the resence of virus or its remnants in presence of virus or its remnants in cardiomyocytes, the heart muscles, which indicate that it could cause cardiac inflammation, resulting in arrhythmia and heart failure in the long run. Affected with these conditions, a person doing strenuous work-out would put excessive load on the vasculature and cardiac tissue, which may result in heart-related fatality.

These premature deaths are alarming and raise a pertinent question —

ing and raise a pertinent question -Is Covid-19 infection or the vaccine is

A study published in Nature says at the cases of stroke have increased

that the cases of stroke have increased among the youth in the post-Covid period.

Also, the possibility of blood clotting in Covid-recovered patients has increased, which may result in heart attack. Similarly, there are cases of cardiovascular complications, thrombosis and arrhythmia among Covid patients. Is vaccination responsible for these deaths? Studies to answer this question have not been done suf-

ficiently, but vaccination-related cases of clotting, ischemia and stroke have been reported in many coun-

Even though they may sound similar, not all heart-related problems are the same. One needs to understand the different terminologies associated with the heart. Heart attack is a condiwith the heart. Heart attack is a condi-tion when the heart does not receive the blood supply, and thereby nutri-tion and oxygen, due to blockage caused by atherosclerotic plaque or entrapped blood clot in a coronary artery. As a result, heart undergoes myocardial infarction in which a por-tion of the heart does not set the tion of the heart does not get blood and malfunctions or

resulting in fatality. Heart failure is a condition where Heart failure is a condition where the heart is not capable of meeting the demand of the body, especially dur-ing strenuous exercises, due to the weakening of the heart architecture. Cardiac arrest is related to electrical signal that is generated in the sino-auricular (SA) node that causes and maintains the heart's rhythmic con-traction. When the electric signal is not generated or transmitted, it leads to arrhythmia or fibrillation and may result in sudden stopping of the result in sudden stopping of the heart.

## Research reveals second primary lung cancer affects 4pc of surgery patients, can reach up to 8pc

Researchers discovered that the incidence of second primary lung cancer ranged from 4 per cent for the overall cohort of lung cancer patients to 8 per cent for those undergoing surgery for stage IA illness, according to data from the National Lung Screening Trial. At the IASLC World Conference

At the IASLC World Conference on Lung Cancer 2022 in Viennothe study was presented today. The incidence, timing, and survival of second primary lung cancer are poorly understood, particularly in patients with lung cancers detected via lung cancer screening. Ms Alexandra Potter, Massachusetts General Hospital, in Boston and colleagues sought to Boston and colleagues sought to examine second primary lung cancers using data from the National Lung Screening Trial (NLST).

Second primary lung cancer refers to new primary lung cancer that develops after therapy for the that develops after therapy for the first primary lung cancer or when two lung cancers with different histologies are found at the time of diagnosis. Patients diagnosed with



first primary lung cancer in the NLSI were grouped according to whether they were diagnosed with second primary lung cancer less than six months after first primary diagnosis (synchronous) or longer than six months after diagnosis

compared the histology of second primary lung cancers with the first

primary lung cancers. The researchers also calculated the incidence rate of metachronous primary lung cancer per 100 perso years and the five-year surviv rates for patients diagnosed wi synchronous and metachronous

second primary lung cancers.

Of the 2,053 patients meeting study inclusion criteria, 85 (4.14 per cent) patients developed sec-

ond primary lung cancer, of which 48 (56 per cent) were synchronous and 37 (44 per cent) were metachronous. The incidence of second primary lung cancer varied by treatment type and stage and was as high as 8 per cent among patients undergoing surgery for stage IA disease. For metachro-nous primary lung cancer, the median time from cancer diagnosis to the diagnosis date was 32.0 (IQR: 17.5-50.5) months. For patients with early-stage first pri-mary lung cancer, the incidence of metachronous primary lung cancer increased with increasing time from the diagnosis date of the first lung cancer. The distribution of second primary lung cancers by histology was 46 per cent adeno-carcinoma, 25% squamous cell lung cancer, 8 per cent lepidic adestage IA disease. For metachrolung cancer, 8 per cent lepidic ade-nocarcinoma, and 6 per cent smallnocarcinoma, and 6 per cent small-cell lung cancer. Approximately 44 per cent (n=37) of patients were diagnosed with second primary lung cancer of the same histologic subtype as their first primary lung cancer.

# Scientists in furious row over 'lab-made Covid' claims

A study claiming Covid was made in a lab has ignited a furious row, as the researchers behind it have been cused of "fixing" their results by other scien-

A pre-print study shared widely online purported to have found evidence that SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes Covid, was the

result of human intervention.

While the findings were lauded by some scientists as "the strongest piece of evidence to date" that Covid came from a lab, others have mned the paper as "confected non

The authors of the paper claim to have found evidence that SARS-CoV-2 originated from a lab experiment which cloned a coronavirus, moved around chunks of DNA and rearranged them in a specific order, thus producing the Covid virus

Alex Washburne, one of the authors, said: "We examined whether SARS-CoV-2 was synthesised in a lab. We studied a common method for synthesising [coronaviruses] in

"This method was thought to not leave a fingerprint. We found the fingerprint. That



fingerprint is in the SARS-CoV-2 genome."
Viscount Matt Ridley, who co-authored a book on the origin of the coronavirus, called the new work a "hugely important study".
"Evidence that strongly suggests SARS-CoV-2 was engineered may have been hiding in plain sight all along," he said.
Prof Fancois Balloux, the director of the

Prof Francois Balloux, the director of the

UCL Genetics Institute, said it was "the strongest piece of evidence to date against a simple scenario of strict zoonotic origin for SARS-CO-2".

Highly misleading'
Critics say the signals the authors claim to be evidence of a lab origin are not a smoking orun because these serveite fineerprints are nat-

gun because these genetic fingerprints are nat-

urally found in many viruses, including the common cold.

Prof Stuart Neil, a professor of virology at King's College London (KCL), accused the team of "stacking the deck" by cherry-picking their analysis and turning their paper into a

"self-fulfilling prophecy".

"It is confected nonsense put out to create a splash of controversy and become a talking point in the US and UK media," he told The

Telegraph.

Prof David Robertson, head of viral Prof David Robertson, head of viral genomics at the Centre for Virus Research at the University of Glasgow, said paper was "nonsense" and "highly misleading". "Poppycock dressed up as science" Prof Kristian Andersen, evolutionary biologist and morfocom in the Department of

gist and professor in the Department of Immunology and Microbiology at the Scripps

Research Institute, called the work "nothing more than poppycock dressed up as science "In plain language - this is uninformed non-ense and it's simply not worth engaging with

\*," Prof Anderson said The academic also said the paper is "so deeply flawed that it wouldn't pass kindergarten molecular biology". The pre-print claims to have found telltale signs that the coronavirus was sliced up in a lab and stitched back together again, leaving behind "a very subtle but identifiable finger-

The team believe they have spotted "sticky ends" on the end of DNA fragments that have been moved around using enzymes. 'It makes a caricature of the whole situation'

It makes a caricature of the whole situation. But Dr David LV Bauer, a group leader at The Francis Crick Institute and expert in RNA virus replication, said this is impossible. "Imagine that you've seen a train pulling into a station. They are identifying that they see the little couplers linking the carriages together. That's what they claim to see," he told the Telegraph.
"What they've misunderstood is that the

"What they've misunderstood is that the Golden Gate system is like the fancy new trains on the Elizabeth Line which don't have any visible couplers.

The analysis of the paper is also guilty of selective data interpretation, according to Dr Bauer, who says the authors "fixed" various aspects deliberately to only get the results they wanted and the findings will be unlikely to pass through peer-review.

Addressing media persons, Jatav said A ven-dor starts early in the persons, Jatav said A vendor starts early in the morning with the day's purchase. The marketing place is invariably far from his residence. Bringing large sacks of vegetables and fruits and loading them in a rickshaw cart is a tedious in the Arranging. tedious job. Arranging, cleaning, sorting, weighing and dealing with cus-tomers is not easy. Hawkers are on the move from one lane to another irrespective of the heat, wind, rain and cold. Calling out loud to attract

Jatav further said that nevertheless, our planners remain oblivious to the role of vendors who are vic-timised, harassed, margin-alized and pushed from one area to another. Rolling stones gather no moss; so it with the hawkers



of employment, they take to vending as self employ-ment for it is an easier option, perhaps the most ng avenue for the poor. Many vendors were erstwhile workers, who after the closure of mills after the closure of mills and factories took to vend-ing. Some are victims of displacement caused by developmental projects. Sometimes they are sur-vivors of natural disasters. Often they are simply look-ing for work, he added.

Jatav claimed that Vendors are regularly subjected to mental and physi-cal pressures by city officials. A major problem is that master plans prepared for our cities do not allocate

as planners blindly imitate western concept of eting, ignoring Inc traditions No wonder, weekly markets struggle to survive and natural mar-kets are ignored. The policy statements of the regional development authorities talk of making provision for trading and commercial activities, which unfortu-nately is interpreted as making provision for rich traders and big business. The vendors have to deal with multiple authorities, or survive and natural marwith multiple authorities , Municipal Corporation, Police , regional develop-ment authorities, district

the positive steps taken by one authority are nullified by the actions of others, added Jatav. Instead of reg-ulating vendors, municipal corporations treat them as a nuisance and an irritant; their policies and actions their policies and actions are aimed more at removing and harassing them rather than at regulation, said Jatav.

Jatav said that many citizens groups too have

zens groups too have joined the campaign against vendors, believing falsely that cities without vendors would be clean. As a result, a large portion of vendor's income is drained away and he/she is not able to carry on the busi-ness with dignity and
