JAMMU: Killing of two civil ians outside an army camp in garrison town Rajouri on Friday sparked massive protests with locals demanding a "fair probe." However, the army said that the duo was shot dead by "unidentified terrorists". Officials told news agency,

"unidentified terrorists".

Officials told news agency, that two civilians, both working in the private shops inside the cantonment, were shot around 6 am in the morning outside the Alpha Gate of the army unit, while one person was injured and shifted to the hospital.

The slain have been identified



as Kamal Kishore son of Radu of Om Parkash - both residents Ram and Surinder Kumar son of Phayalana ward number 15

Rajouri.

After the news broke, hundreds of people came out of their homes and blocked the vital Jammu-Rajouri-Poonch Highway in the morning, charging the Army jawans with killing two civilians at a firing incident. A section of the protestors burnt tyres on the road to enforce the blockade while some others, allegedly pelted stones at an Army camp in the area, which compounded the situation. These nine marlas, he said, were encroached by a third person and Deputy Commissioner Shopian had even asked SICOP authorities to ensure the possession of the encroached land to the unit holder. The SICOP was also requested by the unit holder for police protection.

However, when the complaint approached the DGM Ganai, he allegedly demanded a bribe of Rs 15,000.

"Later it was negotiated at Rs 8000," the complaint said.
"After the complaint, a case was registered in police station ACB Anantnag and Ganai was trapped while taking bribe," an ACB official said.

Cold wave, dry temp to grip Kashmir till Dec 31; Srinagar night temp to touch – 6 degrees Celsius

SRINAGAR: Even as Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir and Kupwara in northern district of Kashmir recorded coldest night of the season, the night temperature would likely plummet further across the Valley as the dry spell would continue till December end in Kashmir. Night temperatures in Srinagar is set to touch —5 to -6 degrees Celsius till the end of the ensuing month.

As per the details available with the news agency, Srinagar recorded the coldest night of the season at minus 3.6 degree Celsius. Kupwara district in north



Kashmir also recorded the cold-est night of the season at minus.

gibility Test (JKSET) are waiting for results. Several candidates told KNO that delay in declaring results is taking the toll of their mental health while authorities pay no heed in this regard. "Due to unknown reasons, the candidates have to wait together for results which shows seriousness of the administration towards education," said Junaid Ahmad, a JKSET candidate, told news agency.

"First exams were delayed and now results are being delayed and it is taking the toll on mental health of candidates," said Asif Hussain, another can-didate.

Criminal Court cannot reject the application for production warrant simply on the ground that no case is pending before it:DB

JNF NEWS SERVICE JAMMU, DECEMBER 16: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakah High Court Comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Mohan Lal in a signficiant judgment holds that Criminal Court within whose jurisdiction the crime is committed and in respect whereof a production warrant is sought, cannot reject the application for production warrant simply on the ground that no case is pending

This order has been passed in an filed by National appeal filed by National Investigation Agency against the order of NIA Court whereby Chief Investigating Officer of National Investigating Agency (NIA) Sanjay Nagpal along-with public prosecutor filed an application under Section 267 of CPC before the Court of Special Judge II/S 11 of the Court of Special Judge U/S 11 of the NIA Act (3rd Additional Sessions Judge) ["the trial court" for short] seeking production warrant again one Abdul Jabbar @ Jabbar S/ Abdul Habib R/o H. No. 3919 Urdu Bazar near Jagat Cinema Chandni Chowk Delhi lodged in judicial cus-tody in District Jail Bilaspur in FIR No. 288/2017.

The case relates to large scale transfer of funds from Pakistan to India through the import of California almonds and other items California almonds and other items via cross LoC trade facilitation centres located at Salamabad, Uri, and Chakkan-da-Bagh, Poonch, for their purported use for fomenting terrorism in J&K. It was claimed by the appellant herein in his application that the description of the control of the co that during investigation, Mr. Abdul Jabbar has been found to be involved in the said LoC trade and involved in the said Lot. trade and is aware of several incriminating facts relating to the mechanism adopted by the accused to facilitate transfer of funds illegitimately for fomenting terrorism in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. It was also averred in the application that durine his examination in the that during his examination in the Abdul Jabbar had

expressed his willingness to make his statement under Section 164 CrPC with regard to his acquain-tance with the facts and circum-stances of the case under investigation. It was thus pleaded that the stateme nt of Abd ul Jabbar was required to be recorded under Section 164 CrPC for taking the investigation further. The applica-tion was considered by the trial court and the same was rejected solely on the ground that the Court was not competent to issue produc tion warrant under Section 267 CrPC during investigation and CrPC during investigation and when no case is pending adjudica-tion before the Court against the person against whom warrants person against whom warrants have been sought to be issued. The trial court vide its order dated 6th May 2022 passed on the application of the appellant herein rejected the prayer of the appellant for issuing production warrants against Abdul Jabbar for recording his statement under Section 164 CrPC before the competent Magistrate in connection with case RC-17/2016/NIA/DLI. It is this order of the trial court which is appealed against before us under Section 21 of the National Investigation Agency Act, 2008 [NIA Act]. The appellant also prays, in the alternative, to invoke the inherent jurisdiction of the court vested by Section 482 of the CrPC 1973 for setting aside and quashing the order dated 6th May 2022

the order dated 6th May 2022 passed by the trial court.

The word "proceedings" used in Section 267 is of paramount importance and, therefore, before we proceed further, it is necessary we proceed further, it is necessary to analyse its meaning, ambit and scope. Section 2(h) of the Cr.PC clearly provides that the word 'investigation' includes all proceed-ings under this Code for the collec-tion of evidence conducted by a police officer or by any person (other than Magistrate) who is authorized by a Magistrate in this behalf. DB further observed that "other proceedings" which occurs in Section 267 CrPC includes investigation and, therefore, a Criminal Court within whose jurisdiction the crime is compiled and in respect. crime is committed and in respect whereof a production warrant is sought, cannot reject the application for production warrant simply on for production warrant simply on the ground that no case is pending before it. The order of the trial Court, therefore, is not sustainable in law. The order impugned passed by the trial Court, as held above, cannot be termed as mere interlocu-tory and, therefore, we hold the appeal under Section 21 of the NIA Act maintainable against the Act maintainable against the impugned order. With these obserimpugned order. With these observations, Division Bench allowed the appeal and quashed the order passedby the Trial Coyrt and directed the trial Court shall consider the application of the appellant afresh and pass appropriate orders that may be warranted in law. 4 electric poles fall in Baramulla locality, mishap averted

"We called local police today for protection and the pelse will be replaced today only, besides electricity will be restored till evening," he said. KNO

Ensure no laxity in biometric attendance

ammu and Kashmir government has finally decided to put its foot down to ensure accountability in the day-to-day functioning of the administration. For this, Chief Secretary Arun Kumar Mehta has issued fresh directions for strict compliance to the orders on biometric attendance of employees particularly in field offices. The directions have come following the low record of employees' biometric attendance across Jammu and Kashmir. It is quite unfortunate that employees working in various government offices seldom maintain discipline and reach their respective offices in time. It hampers the public delivery system badly, besides it gives a wrong notion that authorities at the helm of affairs are inefficient to bring accountability in the system. If media reports are to be believed, there is a cumulative achievement of 42 percent of employees' biometric attendance mainly attributed to the field offices. This is notwithstanding the fact that authorities have issued strict warn ings to the employees for taking biometric attendance casually. Moreover, warnings have been issued for those employees who are carelessly taking directives regarding Employees Performance Monitoring portal carelessly. In June this year, instructions were issued to all government offices, PSUs, institutions and corporations across Jammu and Kashmir to switch over to biometric system with immediate effect and all employees were directed to necessarily mark their attendance both at arrival and departure as per the notified office hours of various offices. All administrative secretaries, heads and managing directors of PSUs, corporations and institutions were also directed to ensure installation of biometric attendance systems and equipment in all offices and institutions under their administrative control All DDOs were also directed to draw salaries of employees only on the basis of satisfactory biometric attendance. It is an open fact that the people take government jobs casually with a commonly prevalent perception that they are not to be penalized. What is the need of the hour is to explore and work out a way out to have attendance of all employees in the field recorded biometrically without any laxity. To some extent, the government has achieved the strict compliance to the biometric attendance system in urban areas to great extent but it has remained a major challenge for authorities to ensure accountability in rural pockets where it has been observed that those employees who stay in the nearby vicinity leave the office premises either with the consent of controlling officers or without their knowledge in the middle of working hours and due to this office work suffers immensely. Authorities should evolve a suitable mechanism to check this tendency. The gov ernment should intensify surprise checks in the field offices to have on-spot assessment over the compliance of the directives regarding eight hours duty in the government offices. All measures need to be put in place to regulate attendance of employees to ensure an effective public delivery system.

Another description suggests the PLA was only establishing its claim by presence, leaving the usual telltale signs in the area.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh troops attempted to transgress the Line of Actual Control (LAC) the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the Yangtes sector and unilaterally change the status quo. This was contested by our troops, resulting in a scuffle that led to injuries on both sides and com-pelled the PLA to return to their posts. The interest in pandemic-related research continued in 2022 as well, but several other significant scientific develop-ments made headlines in the past 12

overy of the biggest single-cell bacteria, recreation of the ancient ecosystem from the two million-year-old environmental DNA recovered from frozen depths in Greenland, unveiling of highly disruptive AI tools and a new malaria vaccine were among the top scientific advance ments of this year. In India, the devel-opment of an intra-nasal vaccine for opment of an intra-nasal vaccine for SARS-CoV-2 was a key advancement. However, in the field of environmen-tal conservation, the going is not good as more Indian plant and animal species were added to the list of those under threat. Among the topmost scientific breakthrousehs was the final denloy-


National Medical Commission prohibits use of stem cell therapy to treat patients with autism

ing patients with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is not recommended and its promotion and advertisement will be considered professional misconduct, the National Medical Commission

duct, the National Medical Commission (NMC) has said.

The NMC's ethics and medical registration board set up a committee to look into the prescription, recommendation, or administration of such treatment after doctors. tors and parents complained about the mushrooming stem cell therapy centres and their advertisements promising cure for autism. The committee submitted its report on December 6 and it was uploaded on December 14. The medical fraternity has welcomed the order, saying, there is not scientific basis to this line of treatment for which patients have been shelling out

for years.
Dr Samir Dalwai, developmental-behavioural paediatrician, Nanavati Max Hospital, Vile Parle, said, "Autism is a chronic condition and the results are slow. And there is a stigma attached to it However, desperate parents fall for such promotional gimmicks as the therapy is



arketed well not just in the city but acro the country." Every week, the hospital gets at least one patient in the 7-8 age group whose parents have tried stem cell therapy to treat autism, but in vain. "Because of the ma or being told by doctors that there
n't be much, or slow improvement ir
ir child, parents fall for the stem cel

advertisements. Many a time, patients stopped the treatment midway and opted for the therapy hoping to see the miracle cure it promises," he said, adding each therapy reportedly costs 23-24 lakh.

The neuro-developmental productions of the production of the produc

neuro-developmental paediatric of Indian Academy of Paediatrics owritten to all government author-

Parul Kumtha, trustee, Forum for Autism, said the therapy neither had enough proof of efficacy nor did it have the

enough proof of efficacy nor did it have the Food and Drug Administration's approval.

"Mamy parents have mortgaged their jewellery, property to bear the cost of treatment. If any medical centres are doing research on stem cell therapy, then they should not charge the patients. Also, as the NMC order says, there is no cure for autism and it is medically unethical to promise it as a cure," she said.

Dr Milan Balakrishnan, psychiatrist and member of Bombay Psychiatric Society, said it has been observed that after the therapy, there is a rise in irritability and

therapy, there is a rise in irritability and aggression in the patient.

"Recently, a 15-year-old boy with autism was brought to us. He had a lot of anger, and he was beating up his parents too. We had to manage the outbursts with medication. It was during the course of treatment that the parents told us about stem cell therapy and the aggression their son developed as a new symptom after the procedure," he said.

This study tracks the progress on cervical can-cer rates and identifies the countries and regions where efforts require scaling up to reach WHO targets. HPV vaccination and screening technologies mean that cervical cancer is now largely preventable. Our study finds encouraging decreases in some high-income countries following successful implementation of HPV.

In 2020, rates of cervical cancer cases were 13 per 100,000 women per year and there were seven deaths per 100,000 women per year. Incidence rates in 172 out of 185 countries, still exceeded the four cases per 100,000 women per year threshold for elimination set by WHO. women per year threshold for elimination set by WHO.

Rates varied significantly between countries, with a 40 times difference in cases and 50 times difference in

times difference in cases and 50 times difference in deaths. Case rates ranged from two cases in Iraq to 84 cases in Iswatini per 100,000 women per year; while mortality rates ranged from one death in Switzerland to 56 deaths in Eswatini per 100,000 women per year.

Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal while dismissing the petition, observed that the petitioner-detenue instead

petition, observed that the petitioner-detenue instead of mending his ways has continuously been indulging in criminal activities and has not shown any respect for law of the land, as such the petitioner-detenue has created a feeling of fear and insecurity in the minds of the public of the area. It is apposite to mention that our Constitution has given the highest priority to the individual liberty. It is the most valuable and cherished right recognized by the Constitution. However, the inherent need to curtail the right to freedom in certain circumstances has been recognized as emerging from the Constitutional scheme itself. The right of society as a whole is, from its very nature, of much greater whole is, from its very nature, of much greater importance than that of an individual. In case of conimportance than that of an individual. In case of conflict between the two rights, the individual's right is subjected by our Constitution to reasonable restrictions in the larger interest of the society. By providing for preventive detention the framers of the Constitution have recognized certain restraints on the right to individual liberty and in certain cases the individual liberty and in certain cases the individual liberty is required to be subordinated to the larger social interest. The main object of the preventive detention is the security of a State, maintenance of public order and of supplies and services essential to the community demand, effective safeguards in the larger interest of sustenance of peaceful democratic way of life. Thus, for achieving a bigger cause, the preventive detention laws provide a mode of depriving an individual of his personal liberty. For all what has been said hereinbefore and having For all what has been said hereinbefore and having regard to the law laid down and noted hereinabove petition fails and is dismissed as such. The impugned Detention order, accordingly, sustains and is maintained. JNF
