JAMMU, NOV 25: After the completion of Delimitation exercise in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, the Election Commission of India ordered Pre-Revision activities in the India ordered Pre-Revision activities in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir on 10th June 2022, which primarily included the task of mapping the existing Electoral Rolls of 83 pre-delimitation constituencies to the post-delimitation 90 Constituencies, in accordance with the Delimitation Commission's Order, rationalization of polling stations and integrations of the electoral rolls. On completion of post delimitation follows. un completion of post delimitation follow- up and pre-revision activities, the Commission and pre-revision activities, the Commission ordered Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, with reference to 01-10-2022 as the qualifying date.

As per schedule notified by the Commission, the Draft Rolls were published on 15th Sentenber 2022. The death roll sew

A total of 39192 Electors were flagged as PwD and 1226 as Marked Electors. Photo coverage in the Electoral Roll stood at 99.99% as compared to 6518% during final available size. Electoral Roll stood at 19,99% as compared to 96.81% during final publication 2019. Gender ratio of the Draft Electoral Roll was 921 as compared to Census Gender ratio of 914, as per the projected population. Elector Population Ratio of the Draft Electoral Roll was 0.52.

A total of 412157 requests for dele-tion were received out of which 358222 were accepted and 53935 were rejected. This resulted in a net increase of the registered electors over the Draft Roll. The final Electoral Rolls have a total of 8339771 electors, out of which 4291687 are Male, 184 are Third Gender and 4067900 are Females. The Elector Population Ratio has increased from 0.52 to 0.58 during this SSR. The Gender Ratio of the Final Electoral Roll has increased from 921 to 948.

This was for the first time in the history of J&K that more than 11 lakh names were included in a single SSR period.

"Lest we forget, in November 2008, 10 terrorists entered the city of Mumba "Lest we lorget, in November 2008, 10 terrorists entered the city of Mumbai through sea route from Pakistan, ravaging the city for 4 days, killing 166 people, including 26 foreign nationals," she said on Wednesday in her remarks to the UN Security Council Joint Briefing by the Chairs of the 1267/1373/1540 Committees to the Security Council.

Her remarks came ahead of the 14th anniversary of the 26/11 terror attacks in India's financial capital Mumbai.

"Our efforts to sention who purposterators and facilitators of these larger attacks."

THE GUJARAT POLL **NARRATIVE**

The battle for Gujarat got all the more interesting with the presence of two BJP chief ministers (and the party's star campaigners) into the electoral battlefield. Both the UP CM Yogi Adityanath and Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma have been cam paigning in Prime Minister Modi's homestate. But their focus was not so much on development and local issues as it was to raise the Hindutva stakes. One came with bulldozers and the undertone of his speech was the UP Model of campaigning; while the other raised the Shraddha murder as a case of love jihad. Sarma's point being that the nation needs a strong leader like the Prime Minister, otherwise an Aftab Poonawalla would emerge in every city. "If the country does not have a strong leader today, a government that respects the nation as a mother, such Aftabs will emerge in every city and we will not be able to safeguard our society," said Sarma. From the other side too, the dialogue has been polarised with the Aam Admi Party leader Arvind Kejriwal who began his Gujarat campaign flirting with Hindutva, talking about putting Ganesh and Saraswati pictures on Indian currency notes. Rahul Gandhi, on the other hand, made a late entry into the Gujarat campaign but came in the wake of his contro versial comments criticising Hindutya icon Veer Savarkar. This pitches the Congress firmly on the left side of this debate. If you recall during the 2017 Gujarat polls where the Congress crossed 70 seats and kept the BJP confined to double digits, Rahul Gandhi had led that campaign talking economics—as it was also soon after an unwieldy GST was implemented by the BJP government at the Centre. And he had also visited as many as 26 temples in the state, talked about being a janeu-dhari Brahmin as an attempt to adopt Hindutva as part of the poll strategy. While no one is asking him to start praising Savarkar (if he is so firmly against all that Savarkar stood for), why rake up the Hindutva icon at all. It has endangered his alliance with the MVA in Maharashtra and one is not quite sure what benefit it will give him in neighbouring Gujarat. If the Congress did not want the campaign to be polarised on religious grounds, then wouldn't the party have been better off keeping the focus on jobs, employment, the economy and rights for tribals, backwards, Patidars and other targeted vote banks that are not very pleased with the BJP. In fact, before he was diverted to Delhi to contest the Municipal polls, to give the AAP credit, there is one thing that Arvind Kejriwal had been successful in doing and that was setting the narrative for the Gujarat polls. It was his prom ise of delivering 300 units of free electricity, the Delhi school and mohalla clinic models that became the talk in the poll-bound state with locals even asking the reporters from the capital about the Delhi model. And those who claim that Kejriwal doesn't have enough boots on the ground in terms of workers and cardre should think again, because that has never been Kejriwal's strength. And yet he has managed to win Delhi and Punjab. The Congress does have a strong pres ence on ground, what it misses is a consistent leadership. And that is the BJP's biggest advantage and one that is helping it combat a 27year-old anti-incumbency. That leader is of course the Prime Minister himself, aided by Home Minister Amit Shah, Without the duo, the BIP has seen a pretty rapid round of musical chairs of leadership in the state. But in the end, it comes down to Modi vs the Rest, And that remains the dominant narrative of the Gujarat polls.

This violence includes physical, emotional, sexual or psychological abuse by close partners or acquaintances, includ-ing current or former spouses, cohabiting part-ners, boyfriends etc.

Violence is inflicted on a woman in various
ways throughout her life and in fact even before
she is born — in the form of pre-natal sex selection and female foeticide — followed by child marriage, forced marriage, dowry-related violence, human trafficking, sexual harassment in public places and the workplace, 'honour

public places and the workplace, 'honour killings', acid attacks and rape.

Social practices highlight a pattern of daughter aversion and son fixation. Research has documented a trend of declining girl child sex ratio from 962 per 1,000 males in 1981, to 945 in 1991, 927 in 2001 and 914 in 2011. Patriarchal norms and socio-economic factors have fuelled the decline. The desire for sons has led to a 'policing dectine. The desire for sons has lest to a policing of pregnancies by spouses and families through prenatal monitoring systems. The results can lead to sex-selective abortions, which are often forced on women in violation of their sexual and reproductive rights. Moreover, while penalties are prescribed in the event of a false or malicious prescribed in the event of a talse or malicious plea, the Act seeks to prevent the 'revictimisation' of victims who are unable to provide adequate proof or substantiate a complaint.

in India led to the Criminal Law (Amendment) in India led to the Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 2013, which recognised acid attacks as a 'spe-cific offence' and provided for penalties for sexu-al harassment, assault against or use of criminal force on a woman with the intent to disrobe, voyeurism and stalking. The Act improved the legislative framework significantly, introducing new criminal offences and stronger sanctions.

The implementation of the legislation has left a lot to be desired. Under the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, victims require the from Domestic Violence Act, victims require the assistance of a protection officer to lodge a com-plaint and file a domestic incident report. The recruitment and deployment of protection offi-cers in the country are inadequate; they often work part-time and lack the resources to assist victims to file complaints.

For instance, in Rajasthan, with its population including around 3.2 crore women, the are only

including around 3.2 crore women, there are only 600-odd designated protection officers and about 120 organisations registered as service providers. Concerns have been raised with regard to the investigation of cases and the prosecution and punishment for crimes committed against

Yet, the proportion of women in the police and in the judiciary is seriously low, which con-tributes to a lack of attention to women's issues. Deeply entrenched patriarchal attitudes of police officers, prosecutors, judicial officers and other civil servants with regard to the handling of cases lead to victims not reporting, withdrawing complaints or not testifying.

The inability to ensure redress for the hapless victims has led to an increase in violence against women and their discriminatory treatment

women and their discriminatory treatment.

The persistence of harmful practices, pervasive gender stereotypes and a patriarchal mindset is of serious concern. Based on the idea of superiority of men over women, such manifestations worsen women's subordination and significantly obstruct effective implementation of relevant legislations.

Therein lies the rub for when people do not believe that there can be a change through the electoral process, what we get is a relatively dull election

Du later also accused him of doing the same to other young women, including two minors. (China's age of con-

Wu denied the charges at the time and police initially wu denied the charges at the time and police initially appeared to side with the star. But two weeks later, the Chaoyang District People's Procurator in Beijing issued an official statement saying that it had approved Wu's arrest "after investigation in accordance with the law." In China, the crime of rape normally incurs a sentence of three to ten years in prison, though in particularly egregious cases the sentence can run to life imprisonment or even the death penalty. Group licentiousness, defined as sex involving three or more participants over the age of 16, carries a jail

ence of up to five years.

Media reports at the time of the trial in June suggested that Wu risked a jail term of three to ten years. The 13-year sentence is longer than that and may point to aggravating factors or a decision by the court to make an example of a celebrity.

A recent study from the non-profit Angus Reid Institute found nearly 60 per cent of Canadians are struggling to provide food for their families. When they can afford to buy food, many cannot afford to buy enough, or buy the food they

They end up skipping meals, eating old and low-quality foods, visiting different grocery stores to find cheaper options, which results insufficient nutrition. Dalhousie University study of 5,000 Canadians found that 23.6 per cent of the population cut back food purchases and 7.1 per cent

Sometimes referred to as an Echo Bike or Assault Bike Echo Bike or Assault Bike (depending on which manufac-turer one is thinking of), the air bike requires you to pedal with your legs while pushing and pulling handles with your arms. slow, even the strongest of ath-letes will often get winded with-in 10 or 15 seconds on this

achine. The rowing machine is a bit tamer than the air bike. Yes, you can get an incredibly hard work out on a rower, which has you out on a rower, which has you push off with your legs and then finish the pull with your arms. But it's typically easier to per-form a low-intensity session with the rower because you're not working your arms and legs at the exact same time.

On the rower, your legs get a moment of recovery while your arms take over, and vice versa. There's no break time on an air bike. This is great news if you have the baseline capacity to take it to the next level, but not so great if you're looking for a slow-
