HC refuses to quash case against college professor over WhatsApp status on abrogation of Article 370

Any critical or dissenting views in sensitive matters that stir up emotions of different groups of people must be expressed only after proper analysis of the situation and backed with reasoning, the Bombay High Court has said while refusing to quash an FIR against a professor for put-ting a WhatsApp status on Article 370. A division bench of Justices S B Shukre and M Sathaye in its order of April 10 said it prima facie finds that the professor has in a very casual manner posted the <u>CONT.ON > PAGE 4</u>

HC refuses to quash...

status message about the abrogation of Article 370. which ended the special status of Jammu and Kashmir The court dismissed the petition filed by 26-year-old Javed Ahmed Hajam seeking to quash the first informa tion report (FIR) registered against him by Hatkanangale police station in Maharashtra's Kolhapur district under ection 153 A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) for promot ing enmity. Haiam, originally from Baramulla district of Jammu

Hajam, originally from Baramulla district of Jammu and Kashmir, was a professor at a college in Kolhapur. The allegation against Hajam is that between August 13 and 15, 2022 he had put a status on his WhatsApp 'August 5 Black Day Jammu & Kashmir' with a mes-sage below saying 'Article 370 was abrogated, we are not happy' and 'I4th August Happy Independence Day Pakistan'.

Pakistan'. Hajam, in his plea in the high court, said he had not circulated any messages that would promote emnity or bring disharmony or feeling of hatred between reli-gions. He claimed that he had merely put his view on his WhatsApp status. The bench, however, opined that the first status mes-sage on Article 370 constituted an offence under sec-tion IS3A of the IPC, but the second status message on Pakistan's Indeenedneer Dav did pot

Pakistan's Independence Day did not. "The first message which has been posted on What-sApp by the petitioner (Hajam) is without giving any reason and without making any critical analysis of the step taken by the central government towards abroga-tion of Article 370 of the Constitution," the court said in its order.

"In our view, this message has the tendency to play "In our view, this message has the tendency to play with emotions of different groups of people in India as there are strong feelings of contrasting nature about the status of Jammu and Kashmir in India and therefore, one has to tread cautiously in such a field," the high court said.

court said. If any criticism is to be made, it must be upon evalu-ation of all pros and cons of the situation and backed by reason, the court added. "No doubt, in a democratic country like India where there is a fundamental right in the nature of freedom of speech and expression under Article 19, every word of criticism and every view of dissent is important for maintaining democracy in a good state of health," HC said.

"But we may add that at least in sensitive matters any critical words or dissenting view must be expressed after proper analysis of the whole situation and must provide the reasons for which the critique or dissent is ade," it added. This is more so when the emotions and sentiments

Improving healthcare in J&K

nsuring better healthcare services should be the top prior-I ity of any government. Over the years, successive regimes have shown least interest to take necessary reforms to provide better medicare facilities to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, especially in rural areas. In recent times, there has, however, been significant improvement in healthcare services across Jammu and Kashmir and it could be well-gauged from the fact that the Jammu and Kashmir government, at present, spends Rs 2 crore every day on the treatment of common people and 97 percent of the population of the Union Territory has insurance coverage. The government has provided SEHAT Golden cards to 80 lakh citizens, with 28,000 hospitals extending treatment facilities to them across the country. Today, dialysis facilities have been made available in all districts. Geriatric and Pediatric wards have been established in all district hospitals. All these facilities have been made available during the regime of Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha whose administration has shown determination and commitment to take better healthcare to every nook and corner of Jammu and Kashmir. Several reforms have been undertaken to implement the system of 'Any Treatment, Anywhere, Anytime'. The 'e-SAHAJ' initiative entails online appointments from doctors and the digitization of patients' medical records. As many as 575 health facilities are covered under these initiatives. According to the official statistics, Jammu and Kashmir government has issued Golden Cards to over 16 lakh families under the Avushman Bharat scheme that has transformed the healthcare facilities for residents of the union territory. Around 17 lakh families have been covered under the Ayushman Bharat scheme. It has removed the burden of out-of-pocket expenses as the PMJAY aims to make the entire process of paying for healthcare cashless. The major beneficiaries of the scheme are the people in rural areas of Jammu and Kashmir as they were, until now, unable to get quality treatment due to paucity of funds. With the major transformation in the healthcare sector, all public and empanelled private hospitals have been directed to not charge any extra payment for medical care from all PMJAY beneficiaries to reduce corruption or delay in services. The government has started the AB-PMJAY SEHAT scheme in convergence with the Central Government's AB-PMJAY scheme to provide free-of-cost 'Universal Health Insurance Coverage' up to Rs. 5 lakhs per family on a floater basis. The Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha has rightly claimed that under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, J&K's health sector has gone through a sea change ensuring highquality affordable, accessible healthcare for all. The need of the hour is to remove all the regional imbalances which existed earlier in the field of health care. As J&K's health sector has been performing better than the national average on several parameters, the efforts should be further stepped up to further achieve quality and accessible healthcare.

Baisakhi is here – Baisakhi, the season and the festival associated with the har-vesting of the wheat crop in Punjab and the start of the traditional new year. Bihu to the Assamese and Pongal and Ugadi in the South are similar festivals of the harvesting season and the new year. and the new year.

Baisakhi used to be a season of joy, a season of fulfilment, a season of activity and, of course, it was on this day in 1699 that Khalsa Panth was was on this day in 1699 that Khalsa Panth was born. Before mechanisation, farming was pure-ly a manual effort – the cutting, the threshing, the winnowing, the separation of the grain from the chaff. The farmers proceeded to the mandis, and the mandis buzzed with the activities of the arhityas and the buying-selling. Money changed hands and the farmers and traders went home with jingling pockets and goodies for the children. It was time for bhangra and other isouras activities. provided the weather other joyous activities, provided the weather and the gods remained friendly.

and the gods remained friendly. However, each passing year shows us the fragility of our agriculture sector, which today is further threatened by climate change. Things have gone awry this rabi season in the north of our country because of a drought in the winter of 2022-23, followed by a wet March. The drought stunted crop growth and the rain as well as high-velocity winds swept the crop to the ground, thereby spolling the quality and quantity of the grain. quantity of the grain.

Since farming has been mechanised, the com bine harvesters on which the farmers have bine harvesters on which the farmers have become dependent are not functional wherever the crop has been flattened. Manual labour is the only alternative, but there is a shortage of labour and the rates have shot up. All in all, it is a losing game for the farmer because the mandis will not casily pick up the grain spoiled by the rain. The political leadership, as usual, is prom-ising the moon, but I'm not sure about the deliv-ery of the promises. By now there should have been a methodical outreach to the farmers, the mandis and the buvine aerocies. MLAs, minismandis and the buying agencies. MLAs, minis-ters and bureaucrats should have reached the countryside, inspecting and delivering on the ground. On the surface, this should have been ground. On the surface, this should have been the minimum reactionary process, but how about finally waking up to and implementing a more thought-out approach to agriculture? Climate change is here, as is the damage done to our water table, the soil – not to mention our health – by this continuous nurturing of rice and wheat cultivation, fuelled by the extensive use of chartic fuertileses. use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides

Most of our heirloom seeds are lost today, as are the traditional crops of sorghum, millets, barley, groundnuts and pulses. The age-old crop rotations, patterns and seeds were lost to the Green Revolution and a nation striving for food self-sufficiency. A new plan was needed to

All roads leading to these holy places were dotted with langar sites where vol-unteers made you stop and partake of the food. Even otherwise, festivals today everywhere do not create the anticination they ance did; they not create the anticipation they once did; they now create apprehensions. Before any major festival, advisories are issued, alerts are soundfestival, advisories are issued, alerts are sound-ed, additional Central forces are sent, flag marches are held. In some places, violence takes place, cases are registered and some miscreants held, but how about the plotters of this violence, what about the hidden hand? As far as my knowledge goes, no significant leader or group has been picked up in the hundreds of riots that have taken place since Independence. Commissions of inquiry have been set up and their reports are likely gathering dust in the cor-ridors of power or secreted in vaults where no light falls upon them. The SGPC General House, in its The SGPC General House, in its meeting on February 12, 1940, under the presidentship of Master Tara Singh, "strongly opposed the Pakistan scheme proposed by the Muslim League to divide Hindustan into Hindu and Muslim areas, and expected Muslim members in the Punjah minister from the party the Sikh ministers from the party the Sikh ministers from the party (Akali Dal) would disassociate them selves from the coalition govern-

ment." In the SGPC House meeting on February 27, 1943, a resolution was passed that "to ensure safety and security in practising Sikh dharam, it is important to constitute a state in which maximum number of Sikhs should reside and in this state, Sikhs, should reside and in this state, Sikhs, Hindus or Muslims, none of the communities should be in majority. It reit-



erated its opinion that the creation of Pakistan will be extremely damag-

ing." On October 26, 1945, it was noted that the then Governor-General of India, Lord Archibald Wavell, had announced the Constituent Assembly announced the Constituent Assembly after the state Assembly elections, Sir Stafford Cripps, minister of the Labour Party, had indicated accept-ance of the demand for Pakistan; and the Muslim League had announced to contest elections on the Pakistan issue. On March 9, 1946, the SGPC massed a resolution seeking a Sikh passed a resolution seeking a Sikh state in the changed political circum-stances. As late as March 3, 1947,

On May 12, 1947, Field Marshal Bernard Law Monteomery. accompanied by senior Montgomery, accompanied by senior Generals and diplomats, met the then UK Prime Minister Clement Attlee.

They claimed that India was primari-ly a socialist country; if a religion-based Pakistan was not established, Kremlin's influence would reach the Indian Ocean, they argued. On June 3, 1947, Viceroy Louis Mountbatten announced the Dertition of India on announced the Partition of India on the basis of religion

A historian should take into A historian should take into account what kind of motivation comes from religion. While referring to the history of the West, one has to understand that Abrahamic religions – Judaism, Christianity and Islam – advocate their religion as the 'only way'. Sen Sachar sent the police into the Golden Temple in July 1955 on the advice of Partap Singh Kairon, who was then a minister in his Cabinet. A week later, the ban on the slogan was withdrawn. Kairon then complained against Sachar terming him a weak against Sachar, terming him a weak administrator. Sachar apologised to the Sikhs at Akal Takht for sending the Sikhs at Akal Takht for sending cops into the Golden Temple and later resigned. Arya Samajis gave a call to Punjabi Hindus to register their mother tongue as Hindi in the 1951 and 1961 Census. Kairon started his political career as a personal assistant to Master Tara Singh in the 1930s, became an Akali MLA in the Constituent Assembly and let loose repression on the Akalis

and let loose repression on the Akalis as the Congress Chief Minister of Puniab in the 1960s

Punjab in the 1960s. In the 1980s, Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale did not raise a demand for Khalistan; it was attributed to him by a narrative set by the Congress government. He supported the Akali demand on the Anandpur Sahib reso-lution, which sought to redefine Centre-state relations through the erant of more powers to all states. not grant of more powers to all states, not just Punjab. Bhindranwale did not oppose Khalistan either.



Health benefits of consuming superfood Broccoli

A NEW RESEARCH HAS REVEALED, THAT INCREASING THE INTAKE OF CRUCIFEROUS VEGETABLES LOWERS THE RISK OF TYPE 2 DIABETES AND CANCER.

Researchers at Penn State discovered in a recent study that broccoli has specific chemicals that bind to a specific chemicals that bind to a receptor in mice and aid to pre-serve the lining of the small intestine, preventing the onset of sickness. The results provide evi-dence that broccoli is a "super-food" in the truest sense. The study was published in the journal Laboratory Investivation

Investigation.

"We all know that broccoli is good for us, but why? What hap-pens in the body when we eat broccoli?" said Gary Perdew, H. Thomas and Dorothy Willits Thomas and Dorothy Willits Hallowell Chair in Agricultural Sciences, Penn State. "Our research is helping to uncover the mechanisms for how broccoli and other foods benefit health in mice and likely humans, as well.



It provides strong evidence that cruciferous vegetables, such as broccoli, cabbage, and Brussels sprouts should be part of a normal healthy diet." pass into the body but prevents food particles and bacteria that could cause harm. Certain cells that line the intestine - including enterocytes, which absorb water and nutrients; goblet cells, which secrete a protective layer of mucus on the intestinal wall; According to Perdew, the wall of the small intestine allows ben-eficial water and nutrients to

and Paneth cells, which secrete lysosomes that contain digestive enzymes -- help to modulate this activity and keep a healthy bal-

In their study, Perdew and his In their study, Perdew and his colleagues found that molecules in broccoli, called aryl hydrocar-bon receptor ligands, bind to aryl hydrocarbon receptor (AHR), which is a type of protein called a transcription factor. This binding, they found, initiates a romain of articidite that affect variety of activities that affect the functions of intestinal cells. To conduct their study, the

To conduct their study, the researchers fed an experimental group of mice a diet containing 15% broccoli – equivalent to about 3.5 c.pus per day for humans – and fed a control group of mice a typical lab diet that did not contain broccoli. They then analyzed the animals'

tissues to determine the extent to which AHR was activated, as well as the quantities of various cell types and mucus concentra-tions, among other factors, in the two groups two groups

The team found that mice that were not fed broccoli lacked AHR activity, which resulted in altered intestinal barrier function, reduced transit time of food in the small intestine, decreased number of goblet cells and pro-tective mucus, decreased Paneth cells and lysosome production, and decreased number of entero-cyte cells."The gut health of the mice that were not fed broccoli was compromised in a variety of ways that are known to be asso-ciated with disease," said Perdew. 'Our research suggests that broccoli and likely other foods can be used an natural in the small intestine, decreased foods can be used as natural sources of AHR ligands, and that diets rich in these ligands con-tribute to resilience of the small intestine."
