Massive searches under way in Poonch to track Terrorists

JAMMU, APR 23: Army's Northern Commander Lt Gen Upendra Dwivedi on Sunday said that necessary action is under way against action is under way against the terrorists responsible for the deadly attack on an Army truck in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district that left five soldiers dead.

A massive search operation to track down the terrorists is under way in Bhata Dhurian following the ambuch on the Arms.

the ambush on the Army vehicle carrying fruits and other items to a border vil-

other items to a border vil-lage for an iftar that was to be hosted by the Rashtriya Rifles unit on Thursday evening, officials said. In a tweet on its official handle, the Army's Northern Command shared Lt Gen Dwivedi's visit to the Command visit to the Command Hospital in Udhampur and his interaction with the surivor of the terror attack.

ural caves. Dwivedi reviewed the security in the border area and the ongoing combing operation to track down the terrorists.

The day temperature in Srinagar was recorded 8.1 degree Celsius below normal of 22.3 degree Celsius on Sunday.

JAMMU, APR 23: The terrorists who ambushed an Army truck in Jammu and Kashmir's truck in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch used steel core bullets, capable of piercing an armoured shield, and decamped with the soldiers' weapons, officials said on Sunday, amid intensified efforts to trace and neutralise the perpetrators.

Experts from various agen Experts from various agen-cies, including the National Security Guard (NSG) and the National Investigation Agency (NIA), have visited the site of the attack over the past two days and have managed to get a clear picture of the deadly ambush which was laid by the terrorists, the officials said.

The move assumes significance as Indian celebrities and top politicians from Shah Rukh Khan and Salman Khan to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi lost verified blue ticks on their Twitter accounts this week after Elon Musk-led microblogging site started removing checkmark icons from accounts that did not pay a subscription fee. The coveted blue ticks have now made a surprising comeback on accounts of these celebrities. Top cricketers such as Sachin Tendulkar and Virat Kohli who lost the blue tick mark on their Twitter handles, have also got them back.

It was not immediately clear whether or not these accounts have paid for the verification. Former Jamma and Kashmir chief minister Omar Abdullah – who got the blue tick back on his Twitter handle – tweeted that he did not pay for it. "Apparently I've paid for Twitter Blue & given them a phone number to verify except that I havent."

Ladakh health infra needs better management

adakh, the land of high passes, has a very limited working season owing to the harsh weather conditions for Jalmost six months in any calendar year. Two vital highways connecting the region with the rest of the country remain closed during winters, which makes it difficult for transportation of essential equipment, goods and other material required for developmental activities. The region, which is already facing the shortage of manpower and infrastructure in the health sector, has shown least progress in developing infrastructure in this vital sector. A Parliamentary Panel recently expressed dismay over the failure of the UT administration to make a "substantial progress" in the establishment of a medical college at Spituk Pharka in Leh district after the lapse of three years. The project was approved by the Government of India in 2019 and the land measuring over 737 kanals has been allotted for the establishment of a new medical college. The detailed project report (DPR) for the construction of the medical college is still under process/examination. The panel has recommended that the Ministry of Home Affairs could take up the case with the concerned Ministry and Department on a priority basis to remove administrative bottlenecks and expedite the construction of the medical college. It has further suggested that the Medical College may commence its academic activities from the existing hospital of the UT so that the medical students of Ladakh can get the option of pursuing medical education in the UT. There was a proposal for setting up a 100-student intake Medical College at Spituk Pharkha along with a hostel for students and a residential quarter for the staff. The area would be 71000 sqm and the medical college would include an Academic block, Lecture theatres, an Anatomy Department, Dissection Hall, Museum, Laboratories, Student common room, medical education unit, Histology Lab, Biochemistry Lab and Pathology Lab. Ladakh administration had, last year, disclosed that the region was facing a severe shortage of medical officers and doctors with nearly 60 percent of posts lying vacant. The total sanctioned strength of medical officers and doctors in Ladakh was 175 against which 100 posts in different health institutions were lying vacant which comes to over 57 percent. In order to bridge the huge gap between sanctioned and vacant posts of doctors, the UT administration of Ladakh has made it mandatory for candidates seeking benefit of reservation under ST quota to sign a compulsory bond to get admission in MBBS, BDS and post graduate courses. Under the guidelines, there would be a penalty to the tune of Rs 50 lakh for MBBS and Rs 30 lakh for BDS students in case they do not serve for five years and three years in the region, respectively. The UT administration, despite tough working conditions, should expedite the process of setting up a new medical college in the area. It will ensure better healthcare facilities in the region.

How artificial intelligence can be trained to detect tumour: Research

A rtificial intelligence (AI) can be trained to detect whether or not a tissue picture contains a tumour. However, until recently, it has However, until recently, it has remained a mystery as to how it makes its judgement. A team from Ruhr-Universitat Bochum's Research Center for Protein Diagnostics (PRODI) is working on a new approach that will make an Al's judge-ment clear and hence trustwor-

The researchers led by Professor Axel Mosig describe the approach in the journal Medical Image Analysis.

For the study, bioinformatics scientist Axel Mosig cooperated with Professor. Andrea. with Professor Andrea Tannapfel, head of the Institute Tannaptel, head of the Institute of Pathology, oncologist Professor Anke Reinacher-Schick from the Ruhr-Universitat's St. Josef Hospital, and biophysicist and PRODI founding director Professor Klaus Gerwert. The group

developed a neural network, i.e. an AI, that can classify



whether a tissue sample contains tumour or not. To this end, they fed the AI a large number of microscopic tissue images, some of which contains the same of the contains the same of the tained tumours, while others were tumour-free.

Neural networks are initially a "Neural networks are initially a black box: it's unclear which identifying features a network learns from the training data," explains Axel Mosig. Unlike human experts, they lack the ability to explain their deci-sions. "However, for medical applications in particular, it's important that the Al is capable of explanation and thus trust-worthy." adds bioinformatics scientist David Schuhmacher, who collaborated on the study based on falsifiable Al is based on faistrable hypotheses The Bochum team's explainable Al is therefore based on the only kind of meaningful statements known

to science: on falsifiable hypotheses. If a hypothesis is false, this fact must be demonfalse, this fact must be demon-strable through an experiment. Artificial intelligence usually follows the principle of induc-tive reasoning: using concrete observations, i.e. the training data, the AI creates a general model on the basis of which it evaluates all further observa-tions. The underlying problem evaluates all further observa-tions. The underlying problem had been described by philoso-pher David Hume 250 years ago and can be easily illustrat-ed: No matter how many white swans we observe, we could never conclude from this data that all swans are white and that no black swans exist what-severy Science therefore makes soever. Science therefore makes use of so-called deductive logic. In this approach, a general hypothesis is the starting point. For example, the hypothesis that all swans are white is falsified when a black swan is spotted. Activation map shows where the tumour is detected "At first glance, inductive AI and the deductive scientific use of so-called deductive logic

method seem almost incompat-ible," says Stephanie Schorner, a physicist who likewise con a physicist who likewise con-ributed to the study. But the researchers found a way. Their novel neural network not only provides a classification of whether a tissue sample con-tains a tumour or is tumour-free, it also generates an activa-tion map of the microscopic tis-sue image.

sue image. The activation map is based on The activation map is based on a falsifiable hypothesis, namely that the activation derived from the neural network corresponds exactly to the tumour regions in the sample. Site-specific molecular methods can be used to test this hypothesis.

WASHINGTON, APR 23: President Joe Biden said late Saturday that the U.S. military had completed the evacuation of U.S. embassy personnel in Sudan, and called for end to "unconscionable violence there as two rival leaders battled for power in the African

Biden thanked the U.S. troops who carried out the mission to extract American staffers in Sudan. With the evacuation, Washington shuttered the U.S. mission in Khartoum indefinitely

The staffers were airlifted to an undisclosed location in Ethiopia undisclosed location in Ethiopia, according to two U.S. Officials familiar with the mission. U.S. troops carried out the operation as fighting between two armed Sudanese commanders — which has killed more than 400, put the nation at risk of collapse and could have consequence for benedities. have consequences far beyond its borders-moved into a second

"I am proud of the extraordinary commitment of our Embassy staff, who performed their duties with who performed their duties with courage and professionalism and embodied America's friendship and connection with the people of Sudan," Biden said in a statement. "I am grateful for the unmatched skill of our service members who successfully brought them to safe-ter."

Biden also thanked Djibouti, Ethiopia, and Saudi Arabia for their help with the mission.

Biden ordered American troops Biden ordered American troops to evacuate embassy personnel after receiving a recommendation earlier Saturday from his national security team with no end in sight to the fighting. "This tragic violence in Sudan has already cost the lives of hux-

The violence has included an unprovoked attack on an American diplomatic convoy and numerous incidents in which for-eign diplomats and aid workers leaders of several countries that had requested help. A major awareness campaign was launched at 3 pm local time to ensure the British public was aware of the new system's test. The alert has been described as an additional tool in Britain's resilience toolkit when those is on immigratisk lost life. when there is an imminent risk to life such as floods or wildfires. "Keep Calm and Carry On - that is the British way, and it is exactly what the country will do when it is exactly what the country will do when they receive this test alert at 3 m today," said Oliver Dowden, UK Cabinet Office minister and newly appointed Deputy Prime Minister after the exit of Dominic Raab over bullying allegations. "The gov-ernment's number one job is to keep peo-ple safe, and this is another tool in the toolkit for emergency existings, such as toolkit for emergency situations, such as flooding or wildfires, and where there is a genuine risk to life. The Cabinet Office said Emergency Alerts have already been used successfully in several countries, including the US, Canada and Japan, where the system has been widely credited with savine lives, for

The government said it has worked with the emergency services and partners, including the Football Association and London Marathon, to ensure the UK-wide test has minimum impact on major sport-ing events taking place on Sunday.

Governments race to rescue diplomats citizens from Sudan

US military airlifted embassy officials out of Sudan on Sunday and international governments raced to evacuate their diplomatic staff and citizens trapped in the capital as rival generals battled for control of Africa's third-largest country of Africa's tunnifor a ninth day.

Fighting raged in
Omdurman, the city across the
Nile from Sudan's capital,
Khartoum, residents reported.
The violence came despite a
declared truce that was to coinday with the three-day Muslim cide with the three-day Muslim holiday of Eid al-Fitr.

"We did not see such a truce," said Amin al-Tayed from his home near state televitrom his home near state televi-sion headquarters in Omdurman. He said heavy gunfire and thundering explo-sions rocked the city. "The bat-tles did not stop," he said. Thick black smoke filled the sky over Khartoum's airport.

The paramilitary group battling the Sudanese armed forces claimed the military unleashed airstrikes on the upscale neigh-bourhood of Kafouri, north of Khartoum. There was no imme-

diate comment from the army.

After a week of bloody battles
that hindered rescue efforts, US
special forces swiftly evacuated
some 70 US embassy staffers
from Khartoum to an undisclosed location in Ethiopia early Sunday. Although American officials said it was still too danofficials said it was still too dan-gerous to carry out a govern-ment-coordinated mass evacua-tion of private citizens, other countries scrambled to evacuate their citizens and diplomats. France, Greece and other European countries said Sunday they were organizing evacuations for embassy employees and nationals, along with some citizens of allied countries. French Foreign countries. French Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Anne-Claire Legendre said France was undertaking the operation with the help of European part-ners. The Greek foreign minis-ter said the country had dis-patched aircraft and special forces to its ally, Egypt, in preparation for an evacuation preparation for an evacuation of 120 Greek and Cypriot nationals from Khartoum. Most of them have sought shelter in recent days at a Greek

Issuing a 'vellow' category warning for two days said thunderstorm with said thunderstorm with lightning accompanied by gusty wind reaching speed up to 30-40 kmph is very likely to occur at isolated places over Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and

Tripura on Sunday.


