

Border disputes need amicable resolutions

et another round of talks between India and China over contentious border issue in Eastern Ladakh has failed to break the ice though the two nations showed commitment to resolve all outstanding issues amicably. The border issue has become a major bone of contention between two countries in Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh, with China aggressively moving forward under the garb of its expansion policy. Recently, China increased its defence spending by 7.2 per cent to nearly \$225 billion in 2023 and it was the eighth consecutive year of increase notwithstanding the fact that there was a global unease over its aggressive behaviour. China has already entered into several military standoffs with its neighbour and its attempt to continuously increase its defence budget is a matter of concern for India. The reports have suggested that China has hiked the allocation for general public expenditure by 5.7 per cent and it dropped enough hints that Beijing is prioritising national security over development. What is worrisome is that it's the second year in a row that the annual hike in military spending has exceeded 7 per cent, reversing a two-decade trend under which the expansion of defence capabilities took a back seat to economic growth. If one counts on official statistics, China's military spending may only be a third of the US level, but is over three times higher than India's. The neighbouring country has even justified the increased spending as appropriate and reasonable, claiming that it faces escalating threats from the outside world. China is already having bitter ties with the United States and these ties are counterpoised by a warm embrace of President Putin. The security challenges range from Chineseclaimed Taiwan to the US naval and air missions in the disputed South China Sea near Chinese-occupied islands. Through increasing the defence budget, China has attempted to give an impression that it is on a mission to strengthen its military power and would not tolerate any aggression, of any kind, on its soil. The responses have included holding unprecedented exercises last August to punish Taiwan for hosting the then US House Speaker Pelosi. China's neighbours are already baffled due to the policy of aggressive, assertive and offensive use of military force. For India, the border standoff in eastern Ladakh stands out as unprovoked belligerence. The world is closely monitoring China's gradual military build-up through its continuous increased budget spending at a time when the National People's Congress set to confirm Xi Jinping's third term as President and head of the armed forces. The neighbouring country now controls the world's largest navy by size and it also aims high by increasing military power. Going by the media reports, China's key areas of spending are most likely to include the commissioning of its third aircraft carrier, the rapid production of new destroyers and fighter aircraft and investments in space technology and artificial intelligence for missile targeting system. Having said this, it is imperative for India and China to seriously resolve all border disputes amicably and sincerity to ensure long lasting peace in the region.

made to convince Africa, a hot continent where the solar intensity is always high, the 'immense potential' that a solar geoengineering technolo-gy offers to reduce the heat by creating an artifi-

gy offers to reduce the heat by creating an artifi-cial veil in the stratosphere so as to reduce the intensity of the sun's rays. The technique, called solar radiation manage-ment (SRM), aims at injecting the atmosphere with aerosols – timy particles suspended in a gas form which reduce the heat intensity – or using giant mirrors to reflect the sunlight back. By reducing the load of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, the SRM is being sold as a futuristic technolocy that will reduce savirage temperatechnology that will reduce soaring tempera-tures in Africa to make it relatively cooler.

tures in Africa to make it relatively cooler. An independent group of climate scientists and engineers, under the banner of Climate Overshoot Commission (nothing to do with the UN), is backing the questionable proposal; it plans to descend on Nairobi in May to draw the attention of the African leadership and, of course, heat up the media debate on how cli-mate geoengineering will be beneficial for the otherwise hot continent. This reminds me of a weather-modification programme that the US weather-modification programme that the US had surreptitiously launched for a 'cloud seeding' plan that involved the Philippines, India and Vietnam. The arguments used subsequent and Vietnam. The arguments used subsequent-ly before Senate hearings were equally promis-ing. But first, take a look at how a secret plan was enforced to use an untested technology. It was in 1966-67 that the then US President, Lyndon Johnson, had in consultation with the then newly elected Indian Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, sought clearance for the US Air Force to conduct cloud-seeding experiments in drought-hit Bihar. Although the results were not encouracing. Lohnson didn't cive un After not encouraging, Johnson didn't give up. After a study, 'The Big Bad Fix: The case against clia study, 'The Big Bad Fix: The case against cli-mate geoengineering', was published jointly by three internationally respectable non-profit organisations — ETC Group, Biofuelwatch and Heinrich Böll Foundation — Johnson pushed Philippine dictator Ferdinand Marcos in 1969 to allow cloud-seeding experiments in the entire country for a' potential hurricane modification'. Despite the attempt not yielding any positive result, the cloud-seeding experiment was once acain used in Vietnam to Stop the march of the again used in Vietnam to stop the march of the

Vietnamese army, and it failed again. The global uproar against weather modification experiments that followed resulted in the adoption (December 1976) of a UN Environmental Modification Convention. This



convention imposed a ban on such technique convention imposed a ban on such techniques, and that included 'techniques for changing...the dynamics, composition or structure of the earth, including its biota, lithosphere, hydrosphere and atmosphere or of the outer space' for mili-tary purposes (from Peter Frankopan's new book The Earth Transformed: An Untold History), But then, there are ways to circumvent military, amplication, with inscriptions like military application, with inscriptions like peaceful purposes of 'humanitarian considerations' for using such misplaced techniques. The book states that numerous private corporations and dozens of research institutions are engaged

and dozens of research institutions are engaged in such experiments with India, the Philippines, Taiwan, Chile, Mexico, Portugal, France, Italy, Argentina and Australia. Coming back to solar geoengineering, nearly 400 scientists have in an open letter warned against the deployment of these techniques on a planetary scale, calling them not only danger-ous but also frightening and inequitable. Seeking the promulgation of an International Non-Use Agreement on Solar Geoengineering, these scientists say a better solution would be decarbonisation of our economies, which is pos-sible and feasible. In any case, pushing these decarbonisation of our economies, which is pos-sible and feasible. In any case, pushing these radiation techniques shows that the world has-n't learnt any lesson. Calling climate alteration an easy solution, the polluters simply want to go on harming the planet. Business as usual' is not the way forward. One of the best ways to decarbonise, in my opinion is the move away from the global chase

opinion, is to move away from the global chase to attain a higher GDP. Although the latest Synthesis Report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has spelt out the dos and don'ts to keep global temperatures within the prescribed limits, these suggestions run counter to what leads to a higher GDP,

which is what the G7 and G20 countries prioritise. Unless the climate negotiations take bold steps to extend their reach over how and why the nations need to shift focus from treating GDP as a touchstone of development, I don't think it will ever be able to contain the rise in temperatures

The weather modifications that the SRM intends to usher in by dimming the incoming sunlight can upset the anthropogenic equilibri-um and, thereby, have a devastating impact by

um and, thereby, have a devastating impact by way of disrupting monscons, altering cropping patterns and causing unforeseen problems for the local and regional biodiversity. It can also lead to extended droughts and incessant rains. All this will have a telling effect on the liveli-hood security of the region, something which has not been studied thoroughly so far. In any case, I fail to understand why scientists and industrialists (with billionaires like Bill Gates and Geores Sores backing if are being so generand George Soros backing it) are being so generous towards Africa. If they believe in this technology, shouldn't

Here they believe in this technology, should be they be first trying it out in the US to reduce the GHG concentration? After all, many studies have shown that large tracts of rich countries will become inhospitable once the climate wors-

ens. The disbursal of the aerosols in the atmos-phere has to be a permanent feature unless, of course, some governments want it to be scrapped later, leading to a detrimental 'termination shock'. India raising the bar with Global South

TNDIA's initiative to engage with the Global South and voice its aspirations and priorities during its G20 presidency is gaining momentum. Beginning with the 'Voice of Global South' summit held virtually in January, efforts to strengthen ties with the institutions that India established with the Global

strengthen ties with the institutions that India established with the Global South over the decades are under-way. These are a follow-up to the results of the January summit and the Global South is buttressed by its mul-tifarious dealings with regions and regional organisations. With India at the helm of G20, the presidency is being used to enhance the engage-ment rather than let preoccupation with it delay meetings further. For practical purposes, efforts are now not focused on summits with the Prime Minister (EAM) or the Vice-President. With ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations). India has an annual ministerial meeting and summit; it will continue this year. Indonesia, as the ASEAN chair, has



hosting the secretariat of the 15-mem-ber Caribbean Community (CARI-COM), the EAM met the foreign min-isters of CARICOM in the India-COF-COP (COR format, the ministerial forum of CARICOM. In Panama, besides the bilateral meetings, the EAM will meet representatives from the eight-coun-try Central American Integration try Central American Integration System (SICA), thus engaging with both the Caribbean and Central America. This opportunity for minis-terial discussions with Latin American and Caribbean nations in the post-pandemic period and during the G20 presidency is timely. Jaishankar had also met the CARI-



Health Matters: Dear Mothers, Don't Blame Bournvita But Change Your 'Kuch Meetha Ho Jaaye' Mindset

T was a few months ago that my eight-year-old started resisting plain milk. After 1 started adding a malt-based product, she started drinking milk once again without throwing tantrums. I knew it was not a healthy option but I convinced myself that I will use it in small

myself that I will use it in small quantities. With the latest controversy around Cadbury Bournvita, I confess that I'm feeling guilty and reconsidering my decision. A lot has already been written about the controversy and how the product is a "sugar bomb", but the first thing we need to change in our homes is the con-munition of events. sumption of sugar. Traditionally, in Indian house-

Iraditionally, in Indian house-holds, cheeni (sugar) is consid-ered auspicious and mothers are not used to rationing it from their children's diets. In fact, we believe that children and young-sters are the fittest and can eat anything and everything.

You may have noticed grandparents serving paranthas slathered with butter, hot chapparents atis dripping with desi ghee or bowls of greasy and sweet homemade dessert. This is often considered a sign of their love

Socially and traditionally, we Socially and traditionally, we believe that it is not children who should ration sugar or oil but only the elderly or people with health issues, thanks to popular cliches such as - Ab nahin khaoge toh kab khaoge (roughly translated to 'this is the time to eat as you wish').

But with changing times, we ave now realised that India is



reeling from the burden of lifestyle and non-communicable diseases (NCDs), and it is time to change the basics. These NCDs include cardiovascular diseases, dren's diets Coming back to Bournvita, the ibel states: 'Add 2 heaped tea-poons (20 grams) of Bournvita a cup of hot or cold milk'. label states: spoons (20 cancer, diabetes and chronic res-

Not many of us focus on '20 grams' and use our own esti-mates. Rather, we focus on piratory diseases – contributing to around 3.8 crore (68 percent) of all deaths globally and to about 58.7 lakh (60 percent) of all deaths in Ledia mates. Rather, we focus on "heaps" and end up mixing the powder in milk, sometimes adding extra sugar as well. RIGHT? A higher consumption of free sugar, often exceeding the rec-ommended 5 percent intake, is linked to obesity in children, dental caries and NCDs in later stages of life. daily recommended intake lim-its of sugar for children," a company spokesperson told News18. But experts claim that it also includes "hidden sugar", taking the total sugar content to 73.1 grams in every 100-gram

Sounya Swaminathan, the former chief scientist of the World Health Organization, tweeted that hidden sugar in such products is leading to an increase in the incidence of diabetes, even in low-income families

The American Heart Association recommends chil-Association recommends chil-dren and teenagers should con-sume less than 25 grams, or six teaspoons, of added sugar per day. Similar estimates are given by the UK's health agency, National Health Service (NH5). It caus, children aged 7 to 10 It says children aged 7 to 10 should have no more than 24 grams of free sugars a day or six sugar cubes, whereas children aged 4 to 6 should have no more than 19 grams of free sugars a day or five sugar cubes.

MALT-BASED BEVERAGES

AND HEALTH DRINKS It's not the first time the health benefits of 'malt-based' drinks have been questioned. In fact, a group called Nutrition Advocacy in Public Interest Advocacy in Public Interest (NAPI) keeps questioning the benefits on a regular basis. In 2018, it also asked Bollywood actor Amitabh Bachchan to dis-continue his association with another malt-based drink due to is high sugar content. These drinks claim to contain "unique" and "scientific formu-las". Bournvita claims to contain an "inner strength formula" that can help develop the brain, bones and muscles as well as strengthen imumulity.

The parental guidance booklet pub-lished by the Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) in 2021, recog-nised that malt-based milk sup-plements are commonly used in plements are commonly used in India.

While the primary ingredient is malt, mostly barley, or cereal derivative, the secondary ingrederivative, the secondary ingre-dient is invariably high in sugar. It is the free sugar that becomes a matter of concern, as it is not only addictive and a habit-form-ing substance but also leads to health problems such as weight gain, dental caries, and risk for chronic lifestyle-related ail-ments. ments

These milk supplements belong to the ultra-processed food category and the IAP sug-gests that they should "best be avoided".

Witamin B12, also known as cobalamin, is an essen-tial vitamin for humans. This vitamin plays a cru-cial role in the function and development of brain and nerve cells. According to the study, RO water consumption is an emerging risk factor as cobalt gets removed through the RO system. According to scientists, cobalt is an essential component of vitamin B12. The study also revealed that vegetarians and people with an unnatural dark complex-ion are also at risk of developing Vitamin B12 deficiency. During the study, the scientists enrolled 160 patients with B12 deficiency and 160 patients with B12 within normal limit were included. The study was led by Dr. Santia V Patel. Additional professor at Department of

Sangita V Patel, additional professor at Department of Community Medicine of Baroda Medical College.

Reportedly, the team of researchers carried out multi-ariate analysis to confirm the risk factors affecting variate analysis to contirm the risk tactors aftecting Vitamin B12 deficiency using logistic regression model. The scientists found that Those who used RO water for drinking experienced 3.61 higher odds of vitamin B12 deficiency compared to controls. According to the researchers, there are three possible reasons behind adverse health effects of consuming demineralised water.

This effort aims to reverse the

This effort aims to reverse the declines in childhood vaccination recorded in over 100 countries since recorded in over 100 countries since the pandemic, due to overburdened health services, closed clinics, and dis-rupted imports and exports of vials, syringes and other medical supplies.
