The official said a suspect has admitted to having provided logistic support to the terrorists for over two months and his further questioning is on.

Special forces are also engaged in the search operation that entered its eighth day on Thursday, officials said, adding that agencies are using drones, sniffer dogs and metal detectors in the operation.

Sources had earlier said that seven to eight terrorists in two groups are believed to have engineered the attack.

The terrorists reportedly hid themselves under a culvert on the road from where they launched the attack on the truck which was carrying fruits, vegetables and other items to Sangiote village from the Bhimber Gali camp for lifar to be organised by the Rashtriya Rilles, according to initial investigation.

Over 50 bullet marks were on the vehicle and these showed Over 50 bullet marks were on the vehicle and these showed

the intensity of the firing by the terrorists, the sources said. Troopers involved in the operation are exercising utmost caution as the terrorists may have planted improvised explo sive devices (IEDs) in the densely forested area with deep gorges and caves, they said. The slain soldiers were from a

gorges and caves, they said. The slain soldiers were from a Reashtriya Rilbs unit deployed for counter-terror operations. Experts from various agencies, including the National Security Guard (NSC) and the National Investigation Agency (NIA), have visited the site of the attack, the officials said. They said a sniper is believed to have targeted the vehicle from the from theore his associates fired and lobbed grenades on the vehicle from opposite sides, apparently giving the troops not time to retaliate.

"The terrorists used steel core bullets that can penetrate an armoured shield," they said, adding, before fleeing, the terrorists decamped with the service weapons of the soldiers. (Agencies)

Dwindling water resources--a cause of concern

t has been a long-held perception that water problems and climate change could lead to World War III. In Jammu and Kashmir, it is assumed that water is a strategic asset but it is also a major cause of discord here in view of the 'pressure diplomacy' of two neighbouring nations—Pakistan and China against India over the use of water of rivers flowing in the state. While China has launched one of the biggest diversions of water of rivers flowing into India, Pakistan has been trying to sabotage major power projects being built on rivers in J&K by pressuring India to change the designs of dams and knocking the doors of international court. In the midst of this looming spectre of war, another layer of uncertainty and worry for J&K is receding glaciers, dwindling water resources and fast change in its weather pattern. Recent research studies are pointing to a constant rising temperature in a B&K, leading to a serious impact on the health of glaciers. According to the experts, Jammu and Kashmir has lost 22 percent of its glaciers in just five decades and if this trend continues, it will lead to a serious water crisis in the next 30 years. The scientists carrying out long term studies on glaciers in J&K have claimed that accumulation of black carbon, generated mainly by use of coal and petroleum products remains trapped due to the peculiar geological shape of valley, surrounded by majestic Himalayan ranges is affecting the glaciers, source of several high altitude lakes and rivers. Similar is the case with the glaciers in Himachal Pradesh and Tibet plateau feeding mighty rivers like Indus and Chenab, which are bone of contention between India and Pakistan. According to the research, it is estimated that about 100,000 hectares (2 million kanals) of agriculture and other lands have been converted for horticulture and expanding agriculture in the state during last 40 years but in absence of any scientific know-how to dispose by-products of crops farmers are compelled to burn it for charcoal, leading to release of black carbon. What is more worrying for the common man is that the government has done little on account of the ambitious water harvesting scheme and preserve the dwindling number of traditional water resources like ponds and springs. Kandi belts, particularly in Samba and Kathua districts, and hilly areas of the state are heading for tough times as "gradual depletion in water resources" has been reported over the years. Around 300 village ponds or 'talabs', which could serve as an effective water recharge resource if rehabilitated and de-silted, have vanished in Kandi belts alone and are in disuse. There are apprehensions that the dwindling water resources in hilly and mountainous belts of the state, where the most of the rainfall goes waste as runoff, could trigger migration of people to plains. There is an urgent need to find out some innovative solution to conserve water and its judicious use to deal with the situation because J&K is vulnerable to various vagaries of weather related problems. Pakistan always raises objections to even the most innocuous of the projects in Jammu and Kashmir. This, besides putting an economic strain, has also given rise to a nega-

HOW PRAYAGRAJ BECAME A MOBSTER'S CITADEL

CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES TO GROW AND FLOURISH, IN A CITY THAT GAVE INDIA ITS FIRST THREE PMS — JAWAHARLAL NEHRU, LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI, INDIRA GANDHI – AND ANOTHER ONE IN THE 1980S, VP SINGH.

The political career of Atiq Ahmed, who was killed along with his brother Ashraf on April 15 in Prayagraj by three shooters while he was in police custody, is a reflection of the great police custody, is a reflection of the great decline that occurred in the politics of a city that played a key role in the country's freedom movement, and gave India its first three Prime Ministers — Jawaharlal Nehru, Lal Bahadur Shastri and Indira Gandhi — and another one in

vP Singh. Altogether, they led the country for over three-and-a-half decades. Besides, Prayagraj (earlier Allahabad) was also a city of other famous statesmen and educationists, literary personalities and jurists whose reputation not limited to India. They all made striking contributions to India's national life. How did a contributions to India's national life. How did a mobster-politician establish political sway, which also enabled his criminal activities to grow and flourish, in a city with such creden-tials? Social scientists need to probe this phe-nomenon, for the issues that it raises impacts India's democratic evolution. The intermingling of crime with politics, with

ser or greater intensity throughout the coun try, became a part of India's public life over the try, became a part of india's punic interover the decades. Prayagraj was no distant political backwater. Hence, in retrospect, it seems incredible that Atiq, then not a fully established muscleman and mobster, was able to carve out a political role for himself in the city relatively political role for himself in the city relatively easily — if his official age is to be accepted — at 27, when he won the Allahabad West seat in the Uttar Pradesh Assembly polls as an Independent candidate in 1989. He succeeded in retaining this seat for 15 years through five elections! When he did give up the seat, it was to contest the Phulpur Lok Sabha seat as a candidate of the Samurad Barde (1991) in 2004. Nobbut date of the Samajwadi Party (SP) in 2004. Nehru had won three elections - 1952, 1957 and 1962 from Phulpur. Atiq won the 2004 election, and thus had a two-decade-long political

and thus had a two-decade-long political innings in Prayagraj.

Atiq belonged to the Gaddi Muslim 'biradari', who inhabit some city areas near the Jumna. They are generally engaged in petty trade, including selling milk. The Ashrafs do not consider them their equal; some state that the Gaddis are a turbulent lot and are known to purse priesures.

Atiq's family circumstances were strained. It widely held that his father was a tonga driv er. It is also reported that he began his criminal activities, including engaging in violence, in his

late teens. However, till the mid-1980s, my friends belonging to the Indian Police Service, and having an intimate knowledge of Prayagraj, say that he had not come on the radar of the district's senior police officers. However, some persons, even in those early days, utilised his 'services' to 'cond those Devaraging' to be the Devaraging'. ices' to 'send messages' to others. Prayagraj had thugs, but they largely confined themselves to

The Civil Lines area witnessed the first plot-The Civil Lines area witnessed the first plot-ted development. Three-accep plots were demar-cated and given on lease for 99 years. A High Court was set up in 1866 and a university in 1887. Eventually, as the decades passed, these plots were acquired by Indian lawyers and pro-fessionals and business people. At one stage, they were well kept, but 1960s onwards, many of the large properties declined. Despite this, till the 1980s, the forays of the musclemen of the old city beyond their traditional strongholds were

few. The 1980s was a period of great social and political churn. Caste-based parties emerged in the state, as elsewhere in the country, and communal politics acquired an edge. Naturally, this impacted Allahabad, too. It is during this decade that Atiq began to spread his wings, intially through an association with a known criminal of the old city, but he also entered the business of tendering for railway metal scrap. criminal of the old city, but he also entered the business of tendering for railway metal scrap, etc. He clearly saw an opportunity to acquire a political role by contesting the Allahabad West State Assembly constituency. His senior criminal associate did so too, but Atig won. A day before the results were declared, the senior associate was killed in a violent clash with Atig. As an MLA, Atiq acquired political heft and

began to intervene in land-grabbing and extor-tion in areas beyond the old city.

The land business became especially lucrative once the state government decided to transform leasehold land to freehold in the 1990s. Builders moved in, and it is reported that Atiq demand-ed a share in the business. Meanwhile, once had retained his MLA seat twice as an Independent after his initial victory, the Sanshuadi Batte, opposed its door to he

Independent after his initial victory, the Samajwadi Party opened its door to him, despite his increasing involvement in crime. He also figured in the infamous 1996 guest house episode in Lucknow against BSP chief Mayawati. In 2005, unable to stomach his broth-er's defeat in his bastion at the hands of Raju Pal, who some reports claim was his own one-time associate, Atiq is alleged to have been behind his murder. From there, the chain led to the murder alleged to — including by his son the murder allegedly — including by his son Asad — of Umesh Pal, the prime witness in the Raju Pal murder, in February this year. Asad was killed in a police encounter two days before Atiq's murder. While he was holding legislative office, it is reported that Atiq's will prevailed even over senior officers of the Central govern-

ment.
After 2009, Atiq's political fortunes declined, but his criminal activities continued and even went beyond Prayagraj. The fear he evoked in his victims was palpable and only some conscientious officers faced him fearlessly. While the UP Police have difficult questions to answer for the laxity showed by them, which enabled the killers to murder Atiq in front of TV cameras, few will mourn his death

For me, who grew up in Prayagraj where my family lived for a century, the real lesson of Atiq's life story lies in the decline of a once noble and notable city.



A true champion of states' rights

The demise of Parkash Singh Badal makes a difference not just to Punjab or Akali politics but also to national polity. He had been a steadfast champion of states' rights, seeking to expand them in the face of an overweening Centre. Tamil Nadu's Dravidian par-

ties and Kerala's Communists now bear the bulk of the now bear the bulk of the responsibility for defending states' rights, with the regional parties of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha being none too clear or vocal on the subject and the Aam Aadmi Party that runs Punjab and Delhi fitting the role of a sporadic critic of centralisation of the polity rather than a programmatic one.

rammatic one. While Badal started his political career with the Congress, ical career with the Congress, he moved to the Shiromani Akali Dal fairly early, but with-out giving in to the separatist urges to which that party has often been vulnerable. The Akali Dal has the difficult job of representing the interests of a representing the interests of a minority community without being in opposition to the majority community, or seeking to mobilise its own support in hostility to the majority com-munity. This is a tough job and many Akali Dal leaders have slipped while performing this balancing act.

The demand for a separate Sikh state, Khalistan, while not an active goal for most mem-bers of the community, has always remained an extremist always remained an extremist slogan. Though no mainstream political party can hope to thrive while seeking separation from India, a party like the Akali Dal finds it more than convenient to use the religious platform's subliminal appeal for its own political mobilisa-tion. A compromise between tion. A compromise between secession and acquiescence to the unitary urges of the political leadership at the Centre has been made to champion states rights in India's constitutional

structure.

After Independence, which was accompanied by the Partition, the makers of the Constitution were chary of a political structure that gave away too many powers from the Centre to the states. At the same time, all through the freedom movement it had been dom movement, it had been recognised that India was a collection of sub-nationalities, each with its own language and cul-ture, and that one goal of Independence was to realise the sub-national aspirations of



India's linguistic communities. After initial reluctance on the part of the Centre, the states were reorganised on a linguistic basis. And the states were assigned assured responsibilities and financial powers by way of a State List in the Constitution's Seventh Schedule. Yet, the concern that over-devolution of powers would lead to the nation's weakening found reflection in a long list of concurrent subjects, in which the Centre and the states both have the right to legitle of the Centre to prevail over a state in any concurrent legisla. state in any concurrent legisla-

The Akalis, the Dravidian parties and the Communists have always opposed avoidable centralisation, seeking to retain most functions other than national defence, currency, foreign policy and pan-national communication with the states.

While such demands were at the core of the 1973 Anandpur Sahib resolution of the Akalis, it Sanib resolution of the Akaiis, it also contained additional points that sought to placate more extreme elements which want-ed to combine regional autonomy with religious exclusivity. In 1978, fresh resolutions that proclaimed themselves to be based on the Anandpur Sahib resolution were passed, but they eschewed ambiguous lan-guage that could lend itself to separatist interpretations. The Akalis became champions of states' rights, and after the passing away of senior figures in the Akali leadership, the bator passed into the hands of Badal.

passed into the hands of Badal.
After the arbitrary dismissal
of the NT Rama Rao-led Telugu
Desam government of Andhra
Pradesh in 1983 by the Central
Government led by Indira
Gandhi, various Opposition-led
states came together to demand restructuring of Centre-state relations. This led to the appointment of the Sarkaria Commission. It submitted a multi-volume report, whose contentious Centre-state issues failed to be matched by concrete recommendations for change. The most substantive result that came out of the Sarkaria Commission report was the cre-ation of the Inter-State Council. Badal had been a votary of implementation of the Sarkaria

implementation of the Sarkaria Commission recommendations, especially with regard to the consultative appointment of a state's Governor. Badal's alliance, first with the Jan Sangh, and later with its successor party, the BJP, stood at odds with his championing of states' rights. The Sangh of states' rights. The Sangh Parivar, including the BJP, has always upheld a unitary vision

of the state and Indian culture. The BIP-led Centre has whittled down the state's share of tled down the state's share of the taxes collected by the Centre by labelling substantial levies on petroleum products as cess and surcharge, rather than excise duty.

The rise of cesses and sur-charges in oursell fiscal collec-

charges in overall fiscal collec-tions by the Centre has been such as to depress the actual transfer to the states of the proceeds of Central levies to 30 per cent, although the states are supposed to receive 41 per cent of the Centre's collections (1 percentage point of the states' share as per the 14th Finance Commission was shaved off to accommodate the Centre's bur-den on the new Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh). The Akalis have kept quiet on this moutter.

Income tax is part of the divisible pool. When contribu-tions to the PM Cares Fund are tions to the PM Cares Fund are given 100 per cent tax exemp-tion, the states suffer shrinkage of their revenue. At a tax rate of 30 per cent, and states' share of 41 per cent, 123 per cent of the corpus of the PM Cares Fund has come at the expense of the states. Yet, the PM Cares Fund is deemed to be outside the is deemed to be outside the

is deemed to be outside the scope of scrutiny by the government's auditor — the CAG (Comptroller and Auditor General of India). The Akalis have kept mum on this too. In a globalised world, states should be able to raise resources abroad, at least for a part of the borrowing they are entitled to each year. The Centre has blocked this option, without any opposition from without any opposition from the Akalis. Even with Badal Sr alive, states' rights had eroded in the absence of a vocal opposition. His demise takes even notional opposition north of the Vindhyas to the curtail-ment of states' rights.

Intriguing new mouse studies show that the makeup of an ani-mal's microbiome influenced how much it wanted to exercise, in part by sending signals to the animal's brains. Change a mouse's microbiome, and you changed whether it felt like movchanged whether it felt like mov-ing. Although the new studies involved animals, they amplify and extend recent human research showing that active people's microbiomes can be quite different from those of peo-ple who rarely exercise. The findings raise the possibility that, depending on how we alter our internal microbes, we might wind up enjoying — or avoiding — exercise more.

- exercise more. Gut health affects overall Gut health affects overall health The importance of the microbiome for our health is almost indisputable at this point. The state of our guts has been shown to affect our hearts, waistlines, sleep, moods, and risks for a variety of diseases, including diabetes and some types of cancer. Microbiomes are also mitte malleable. Our gut also quite malleable. Our gut bugs' numbers and types surge and dip, depending on how we live, including whether and how



we exercise. A study last year we exercise. A study last year found that elite, cross-country skiers' guts contained fewer types of bacteria after a grueling season than the microbiomes of healthy non-athletes, but more of the remaining strains found in the athletes were associated with metabolic health.

2.1 million data points about their mice. What they uncovered in that data was a direct commu-nication link from the gut to the brain, activated by exercise. Once turned on, these nerves sent signals prompting the release in the brain of extra dopamine, the neurochemical most associated with rewards and motivation.
