J&K High Court quashes govt order to take over madrassas in Kishtwar

Jammu and Kashmir High Court has quashed a government order to take over some madras-sas in Kishtwar district, saying an official order issued last year cannot be universally applied to all such institutions in the Union Territory. Union Territory.

Iustice Sanieev Kumar passed a three-page order last week after hearing a petition that challenged a July 3 order of the Kishtwar additional deputy commissioner, directing the management of Char-itable Educational Trust

the possession of their madrassas (Islamic semi-naries) to the administration. The petitioners informed the court that the impugned order was violative of the principles of natural justice as no opportunity. of being n. The

opportunity of being heard was given to them. Besides, the trust has no links with the Mau-lana Ali Miyan Educa-tional Trust, Bathindi, the functioning of which was taken over on the orders of the Jammu divisional commissioner on June 14 last year for misusing funds received from foreign NGOs, they said. The government lawyer confirmed that the madrassas run by the petitioners are different from those of the Maula-na Ali Miyan Educational Trust.

However, he submitted that an investigation into illegal funding of these seminaries is an ongoing exercise and the respon dents are free to initiate action against any such madrassas found involved in anti-national or antithe anti-fractional of anti-social activities and also those not in a position to explain the source of their funding. 

### **Rare antiquities mysteriously** missing from J&K

There are reports that over 90 rare antiquities belonging to Jammu and Kashmir are lying in a US Museum since long. This has now been official confirmed by a parliamentary panel that stated over 90 valuable artefacts in US Museum have a trail going back to Jammu and Kashmir with 'no provenance details' but authorities made little progress in conducting a probe into those missing. In other words, no major efforts were put in to ensure that these artefacts were brought back to Jammu and Kashmir. The shocking is that there had been only two reported cases of theft with 12 stolen antiquities from the protected monuments and sites of the ASI but not even a single 'stolen object' has been recovered till date. The Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Transport, Tourism and Culture, in its 348th report "Heritage Theft - The Illegal Trade in Indian Antiquities and the Challenges of Retrieving and Safeguarding Our Tangible Cultural Heritage" tabled in the ongoing session of Parliament, said that "the MET (Metropolitan) Museum's Asia Collection is reported to contain more than 90 pieces from Jammu and Kashmir with no provenance details". The Committee believes it is impossible to state the number of thefts with any accuracy unless all the antiquities in a museum have been documented and digitized. In the absence of a centralized database of antiquities, theft can be detected only by random checks and it is possible that some thefts may go undetected for many years. A case in point is, as reported by the media, the Saraswati painting from J&K which has been found in the US but has still not been brought back due to the lack of any missing report It is still not clear as when these artefacts of J&K origin containing over 80 sculptures, five paintings, few pages of a manuscript, two Kashmir carpet antiquities and a page of calligraphy-having no details in their provenance, were move out of the Union Territory and who was responsible for the same. This is despite the fact that several FIRs were registered for missing artefacts in J&K but it was probably lack of interest or official indifference that some of these cases were closed as "not traced". The Committee further observed that as per the NCRB data for 2017-2021, a total of 175 Special and Local Laws (SLL) Crimes had been reported under the Antiquities and Art Treasures Act, 1972 but there was not even a single case under SLL Crimes was reported in Jammu and Kashmir. Interestingly, the Union government itself stated that in most of the cases, State Governments, private agencies etc do not share the information on theft of antiquities to ASI. The Panel has also taken a swipe at the ASI for "not making use of available technology for

protection of our priceless antiquities and monuments". It has been recommended that the ASI and the Ministry may make every effort to ensure that all the Centrally Protected Monuments and Site Museum under ASI have CCTV cameras for protection. It is expected that the government will order a probe to find out the reasons that led to the mysterious missing of these rare artefacts from Jammu and Kashmir to fix the responsibility.

According to the WHO's report on pedestrian safety, pedestrian deaths have risen globally at rearly twice the rate of road mishap deaths – a parage with 6.6 per cent increase from 2013 to 2016, com-pared with 6.6 per cent increase for other road sensers for ever klometer travelled. endestrians URU Nanak, the founder of Sikhism

pared with 6.6 per cent increase for other road users; for every kilometre travelled, pedestrians are nine times more at risk of death than car occupants.

The safety of pedestrians has emerged as a critical concern in our nation. According to the critical concern in our nation. According to the National Crime Records Burcau's report (2021), the number of annual fatalities of pedestrians was 18,900. This translates to an alarming aver-age of 51 pedestrian deaths per day. Sadly, this distressing reality is not confined to urban areas alone but also affects rural regions across the counter. country

The situation is particularly alarming in Punjab. Statistics reveal that a majority of road accident victims in the state are pedestrians and accident victims in the state are pedestrians and cyclists. In urban areas of Punjab, over 50 per cent of road accident fatalities in recent years have involved pedestrians. More than 1,100 pedestrian deaths were reported on various roads of the state in 2022. Recognising this pressing issue, it becomes evident that pedestri-an safety plays a pivotal role in reducing the overall number of road accident fatalities. Most of the pedestrians involved in road

Most of the pedestrians involved in road crashes are in the productive age group. Many of them are the breadwinners of their families and belong to the lowest socio-economic stratum of society

tum of society. The concept of 'the right to walk' is firmly roted in the principles of human rights, ensur-ing freedom of movement and access to public spaces. rights. These legal interventions aim to rectify in road infrastructure development that biases in road infrastructure development that favoured motorised traffic over pedestrians. By upholding the right to walk, we ensure safer roads and promote inclusivity. The 'Right to Walk' initiative builds upon these court orders, strengthening the government's resolve to cre-ate safe and accessible walking infrastructure. Investing in well-designed footpaths, pedestri-an crossings and cycling lanes is aimed at enhancing urban mobility, promote healthier transportation and foster inclusivity. It is immerative that we noiroitise nedestrian

transportation and toster inclusivity. It is imperative that we prioritise pedestrian safety. Road accidents pose a significant threat to the lives of pedestrians, while inadequate infrastructure and poor road design hinder their mobility and compromise their safety. The PM did not speak in Parliament on important issues such as demoneti-sation (2016) and the Chinese intrusion in east Ladakh (2020). Let's look at each of these and find out how to program them properly into your routine! Supersets are a great way to increase work volume when time is

limited. They involve performing two exercises rapidly (forming a couplet)

with little to no rest in between Supersets are composed of either exercises that work the same muscle group or opposing muscle groups (agonist/ontagonist) with no rest group or opposing muscle groups (agonist/antagonist) with no rest between the couplet of exercises themselves. They are also easy to program as they feature similar set/rep anges as straight-set training.

onist/antagonist supersets (such as pairing biceps:triceps or quads:hamstrings) since using two exercises of the same muscle group leads to greater soreness, decreased work volume, and may require more recovery for no extra benefit. Antagonistic, on the other hand, does not negatively impact training volume or muscle activity.

impact training volume or muscue activity. As an example, you may program a superset of four sets of 10 reps of biceps curls and triceps overhead extensions. In practice, you would perform 10 reps of the biceps curls then immediately jump to 10 reps of triceps overhead extensions with no rest between the two exercises. Once both exercises are completed in suc-cession, that would be considered one evt and then you rest as you would cession, that would be considered one set and then you rest as you would between conventional sets before moving on to your second round of the previously discussed four sets. DROPSETS

Dropsets are one of my favorite ways to make sure I fully work a mus-cle, and are particularly beneficial ditional sets while decreasing total

when improving lagging muscula-ture. They really force you to thorture. They really oughly exhaust the muscles worked

in a time-efficient manner Performing dropsets involve com-pleting an initial set in a conventional pleting an initial set in a conventional manner, then immediately lowering the weight lifted by anywhere from 25-50% and performing a second set until momentary muscular failure, then (optionally) dropping the load a third time by 25-50% of the second set's weight and performing a final set's weight and performing a final set until momentary muscular failure. Using this, you have one conven-tional set with one to two "drops" counting as a single overall dropset. counting as a single overall dropset. After each dropset, rest as long as you would between conventional sets. I recommend incorporating one to three sets of these as the last exercise of the training day in a muscle group or movement you wish to advance. Rest-pause is another great way to icrease work volume. If has been

increase work volume. It has been shown to yield similar strength and

Rest-pause converts a single into multiple mini sets with very little rest between each (usually 15-30 sec-

rest between each (usually 15-30 sec-onds). Technique varies from coach to coach, so I'll share my methods to help you set these up for either hyper-trophy or strength. For hypertrophy, I recommend shooting for a rep goal. The number of reps you achieve on your first mini set will determine how many reps you will do combined for the entire rest-pause set. Choose a weight hat is 80-85% of your one rep max. Take 80-85% of your one rep max. Take that weight and lift until failure, then that weight and lift until failure, then note how many reps you achieved. Double that to identify your total rep goal (ex: if you reached eight on your first mini set, then your total rep goal for all mini sets combined will be 16). Rest 15-20 seconds, then take your second mini set to failure. Add the number of reps achieved in that sec-ond mini set to those from the first. ond mini set to those from the first. Repeat the lift:rest cycle until you have reached the rep goal for the entire rest-pause set
