Who can recommendate Kashmic constituent assembly came to an end in 1957. The top court referred to proviso 3 of Article 370 which says, "Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this article, the President may, by public notification, declare that this article shall cease to be operative or shall be operative only with such exceptions and modifications and from such date as he may specify. Provided that the recommendation of the Constituent Assembly of the State referred to in clause (2) shall be necessary before the President issues such a notification? be necessary before the President issues such a notification." The CJI asked Sibal, "What happens when the tenure of con-

stituent assembly comes to an end? No constituent assembly can have an indefinite life. The proviso to clause (3) of Article 370 refers to the recommendation of the constituent assembly of the state, and it says before President issues notification the question is what would happen when the constituent assembly ceases to exist?"

Sibal responded, saying it was precisely their point and their whole case is about that the president cannot issue any notifica-tion revoking the Article 370 without the recommendation of the constituent assembly. Justice Gavai interjected and asked the senior lawyer wheth-

er the argument being made is that nothing could have been done about Article 370 after 1957, when the tenure of the Jammu and Kashmir constituent assembly came to an end.

Sibal said the court is currently interpreting a constitutional provision and it is not here to legitimise the process which is unknown to the Constitution

provision and it is not here to legitimise the process which is unknown to the Constitution. "Through a political act Article 370 was tossed out of the window. This was not a constitutional act. Parliament took upon itself the role of constituent assembly and revoked Article 370 saying it is exercising the will of the people of Jammu and Kashmir. Can such a power be exercised?" said Sibal contesting the way Article 370 was repealed. The hearing remained inconclusive and will continue on Thursday

Dearth of manpower in AIIMS

The setting up of 22 new AIIMS in the country was approved by the Union Cabinet under Pradhan Mantri Śwasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) way back in 2015. Jammu and Kashmir was given two prestigious AIIMS-like institutes by the Union Government in February 2015 when the then Union Finance Minister late Arun Jaitley made a formal announcement in the Parliament during this Budget speech. Thereafter, the then Union Health Minister, in June 2015, announced two AIIMS for J&K -- One each at Vijaypur in Samba district and another at Awantipora in Pulwama district. Prime Minister Narendra Modi finally laid the foundation stone of AIIMS during his J&K visit on February 3, 2019. Since then, more than four years have lapsed but these institutes are yet to be made fully functional, thanks to the administrative indifference and technical hurdles. Construction work on a majority of other institutes has already been completed. In case of AIIMS Vijaypur, the Union Health Ministry has claimed that nearly 82 percent construction work of the All India Institutes of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Vijaypur has been completed while the work on AIIMS Awantipora is moving at snail's pace with the executing agency completing just little over 32 percent construction. However, AIIMS Vijaypur where the classes have commenced is still craving for faculty and non-faculty members. The official document reveals that over 60 percent posts of faculty and 67 percent positions of non-faculty members are still vacant. Against the total sanctioned strength of 183 faculty members, only 72 are in-position while 111 posts are still vacant. As far as non-faculty posts are concerned, atleast 634 positions against the sanctioned strength of 951 are vacant while the number of in-position members in non-faculty category is 317, notwithstanding the fact that MBBS classes have been commenced from academic year 2020-21 from a temporary campus. With regard to AIIMS Awantipora, only 32 percent construction has been completed while the MBBS classes are yet to be made functional there. The irony is that AIIMS Awantipora is yet to start MBBS classes and its construction is also progressing quite slowly. The AIIMS Vijaypur was decided to be set up at a cost of Rs 1,661 crore while AIIMS Awantipora, at a cost of Rs 1,828 crore. An area of 231 acres was identified at Samba and 222 acres at Awantipora for setting up the respective AIIMS'. The poor healthcare facilities always remained a cause of concern for the people but the UT administration supported by the BJP-led NDA government at the Centre has now started the overhauling of the healthcare sector. The new hospitals with modern medical equipments are coming up at district level while rural health institutes are also being improved. It is expected that J&K will soon have better healthcare facilities at district and sub-district level.

When the British redrew boundaries under the 1834 Kabaw Valley Agreement, they handed over a large portion of this land to erstwhile Burma to appease the Ava or Burmese King, Although the apprehension was that a sepa-rate administration might germi-nate the Mizo National Front's (MNF) purported goal for a 'unifinate the Mizo National Front's (MNF) purported goal for a 'unifi-cation' of the areas inhabited by the Chin-Kuki-Mizo ethnic tribes, the fact is that over the years, the imag-inary Kukiland has been scaled down to the hills of Manipur but includes the parts inhabited by the Naga tribes, who have no love lost for the Kuki-Zo. The MNF rules Mizoram and is an ally of the BJP. But that did not stop Mizoram CM Zoramthanga from recently Zoramthanga from recently addressing a solidarity march for Manipur's victims, signifying that Manipur's victims, signifying that the fault-lines criss-crossing the North-East transcended geographi-cal boundaries and political alle-giances. Conversely, the arguments stacked up in favour of extending the Sixth Schedule to the hills

emanated from the limited repre-sentation that the tribes have in the Manipur legislature (out of 60 seats, only 19 were reserved for the STs), which marginalised their voices and diminished their influence in

and diminished their influence in policymaking. The uneven presence allowed the Meitei-majority government to introduce Bills that impacted tribes' rights and interests, the most recent act of which was to declare tribal areas as reserved forests and pro-tected lands without proper statuto-ry compilance. Therefore the artic, ry compliance. Therefore, the artic-ulate voices from the Kuki-Zo community sought political autonomy for the tribes under Article 244A of the Constitution, which asks for an elected body to function as a legisla-ture within a state, or in other

ture within a state, or in other words, as a state within a state. In a scenario where the battle-lines have become irredeemably accentuated, it is hard to envisage the Kuki-Zo getting a fraction of what they sought in better times. However, it is edifying to recall that other states in a conflict-contagious zone eventually found workable zone eventually found workable solutions, which might not have entirely satisfied the dissatisfied, but in the circumstances allowed for a degree of give-and-take and some sort of coexistence with their adversaries

In Assam, in the 1980s, the National Democratic Front of Bodoland sought the creation of an independent home for the Bodos, the largest ethnic grouping among the state's plains tribes. The Bodos had reasons to feel browbeaten by the erstwhile Asom Gana Parishad dispensation, which pandered

the erstwhile Asom Gana Parishad dispensation, which pandered largely to the Hindu Assamese. The Bodos were engaged in a long-drawn strife with the Assam Government to press home their demand for a 50-50 division of the state, which no government was willing to concede. The issue was flagged by the relatively peaceful All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU). Soon, two insurgent groups, the Soon, two insurgent groups, the Bodo Liberation Tigers and the National Democratic Front of Bodoland, got into the act and clashed with the police and non-Bodos living in the area, inflicting serious casualties.

Eventually, a tripartite agreement between the Centre, the state gov-ernment and the ABSU birthed the Bodoland Territorial Council, which endorsed the idea of a state within a state and administered a territory created by restructuring seven configuous districts. The Tigers laid down arms, while the front split into three fac-tions, one of which exists as a throwback to a bloody past. But the council restored a veneer of normal-

Efforts to create chips ecosystem must persist

The path to India's goal of establishing a chip-producing ecosystem is rocky right now, with few offers of investment.

CEMICONDUCTORS came into the Similogitat when the world began recov-cring from the Covid lockdowns. Till then, the role of this tiny electronic component in the modern technological society was hazy for the general public. It turned out that the production of automobiles and a host of con-sumer electronics was being held up merely for want of a product known as a 'chip'. It also turned out that most of these chips were being produced in Taiwan, South Korea and China, where manufacturing had salled due to the pandemic. It would take a while before output came back to normal and only then could the production of technologically advanced goods production of technologically advanced goods eturn to normal.

For the lavman, a useful definition of semiconductors is that they allow electronic devices

conductors is that they allow electronic devices to process, store and receive information. The level of technology in them nowadays can be gauged by the US Semiconductor Industry Association's statement that a single chip has as many transistors as all of the stones in the Great Pyramid of Giza. And these are getting smaller, faster and cheaper every year. The shortage of these tiny electronic parts was manifest in India initially by the slow pace of passenger car production just as demand was getting back to normal in 2021. Waiting periods for popular brands stretched for over six months for lack of chips. The disruption of global supply chains owing to the worldwide economic slowdown was a major reason for the chips output not reverting rapidly to the the chips output not reverting rapidly to the pre-pandemic levels.



Developed and developing countries alike

Developed and developing countries alike soon recognised that the heavy dependence on just a few countries for producing chips endan-gered economic growth. India took is first step towards developing a new global supply chain in 2021 during the Quad summit when the Semiconductor Initiative was launched by member countries: India, the US, Japan and Australia. The aim was to utilise the strengths of each of them to easier availability of semiconductors. The US role was apparent as it is a significant player in semiconductors, with major integrat-ed design manufacturers located in that cour-try. Japan has its own strength in semiconduc

try. Japan has its own strength in semiconduc-

tor manufacturing materials and chemicals while Australia has mineral resources critical for this industry. The value that India brought to the table was also considerable and com-

to the table was also considerable and com-prised trained human capital. Experts say as much as 25 per cent of the world's design tal-ent for semiconductors is already located in this country, largely in Bengaluru. The next steps indicated that the govern-ment was determined to create a global hub for chips in this country. The India Semiconductor Mission (ISM) was launched in December 2021 with incentives up to \$10 billion, though this number is not considered large for this capital-intensive industry. The drive to attract chips intensive industry. The drive to attract chips manufacturers was pushed further during

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent US

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent US visit when a memorandum of understanding was concluded for collaboration to create a supply chain for semiconductors. The path to the goal of creating a chip-pro-ducing ecosystem, however, is looking rocky right now, with few firm offers to invest in this sector. The much-awaited \$19.5-billion joint venture project between Foxconn of Taiwan and Vedanta has been called off. Two other consortia have also shelved their plans for the time being. On the positive side, Micron Technologies has announced an investment of 8255 million to set up an assembly and packag-\$825 million to set up an assembly and packag-ing unit in Gujarat. And US chipmaker Advanced Micro Devices will invest \$400 mil-

Advanced Micro Devices will invest \$400 mil-lion to set up its largest design centre in India. But the real big players have not yet made any firm commitments, though a lot of enthu-siasm was shown at the recently concluded Semicon India conference. The fact is that India may now be showing commitment to becom-ing a semiconductor hub, but it has made sev-eral costly mistakes in the past. Offers were made by chip major Intel as far back as 1969, when the company's co-founder visited this country to explore investment opportunities. The government was not prepared for a large production unit. Intel made another attempt, reportedly in 2005, to set up a multi-billion dol-lar chip manufacturing facility, but apparently, there was too much delay in the response to there was too much delay in the response to the proposal. Now India may be ready, but Intel is not in a hurry. It would not be fair, however, to imply that

the previous governments lacked the vision to invest in cutting-edge technology like semicon-

ductors. It was the Indira Gandhi government in 1976 that approved the establishment of Semiconductor Complex Limited in the public sector. It was launched in Mohali in 1984, much before Taiwan, South Korea or China had entered this sector. By all accounts, the venture came to a pernature end with a 'mys-terious' fire destroying the plant in 1989. It took eight long years for it to reopen and become the Semiconductor Lab, producing components for the country's space pro-gramme. It is now proposed to be revamped as a brownfield chips project as part of the ISM. It is clear that enough attention was not paid ductors. It was the Indira Gandhi government

It is clear that enough attention was not paid earlier to India's urgent need to develop sophisticated technological manufacturing skills.

skills. The mistakes of the past, no doubt, haunt experts in this sector as any initiative taken now will take a while to come to fruition. Countries like Taiwan and South Korea, for instance, took decades to develop their chips cosystem. It must also be recognised that most of the leading chip-making countries today were given massive financial and policy sup-port by their governments. Clearly, Indian pol-icymakers are trying to follow a stubidles to both foreign and domestic companies in this sector. So far, the progress is slow, though sector. So far, the progress is slow, though there are reports of several proposals in the pipeline. Even so, these efforts need to be con-tinued as creating a semiconductor ecosystem will lead to faster economic development in the long run. India needs to leverage its strengths in high technology and make this happen.

lifespans. Looking at the brain cells of ageing flies, they found that better glucose uptake compensates for age-relat-ed deterioration in motor functions, and led to a longer life. The effect was more pronounced when coupled with dietary more pronounced when coupled with dietary restrictions. This suggests healthier eating plus improved glucose uptake in the brain might lead to enhanced lifespans. The brain is a particular-

ly power-hungry part of our bodies, consuming 20% of the oxygen we take in and 25% of the glucose. That's why it's so important that it can stay powered, using the glucose to produce adenosine triphosphate (ATP), the "energy courier" of the body.

A team led by Associate Professor Kanae Ando studied this problem using Drosophila fruit flies.
