Are we heading for water crisis with glaciers receding?

The studies on retreating glaciers in Ladakh have again raised concerns about climate change and human intervention in Himalayan region. The study conducted by the scientists of the Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, headed by Dr Manish Mehta, has predicted that three new glacial lakes could be formed in Ladakh due to accelerated Parkachik Glacier melting. The study states that the depth of lakes may range from 34 to 84 metres and the accelerated glacial retreat has been attributed to the ongoing climate warming, which also causes surface morphological or geological changes to glaciers. The meeting of the Parkachik Glacier, which is one of the largest glaciers in the Suru River valley and a part of the Southern Zanskar Ranges, western Himalaya, in the union territory of Ladakh, is a matter of concern and there is need to seriously think over the fast changing climate. The findings of the study were published in the journal, 'Annals of Glaciology'. The morphological and dynamic changes of the Parkachik Glacier in the Suru river, have been described by the scientists by procuring the data for the study from satellite imagery from 1971 to 2021 and field surveys conducted between 2015 and 2021. About two years ago, the massive glacier burst at Chamoli in Uttarakhand had also shifted focus back on the dangers of climate change the Himalayan states. It was yet not clear as what caused the breach in a glacier which was not very unusual. The successive governments overlooked the suggestions and assessments of scientists who had warned against the setting up power projects on rivers that originate from glaciers, like the one on the Rishiganga. Vanishing glaciers are often associated with global warming while other studies have estimated past ice loss and made projections of future melt. But until now, researchers have been unclear how much of the observed mass losses are caused by humans rather than natural climate variations but the Uttarakhand tragedy, after a glacier broke off, fell into the Alaknanda and Dhauliganga rivers, and swept through the villages, renewed the debate on human interferences. As far as Jammu and Kashmir is concerned, the uncertainty and worry for the residents is receding glaciers, dwindling water resources and fast change in its weather pattern. Recent research studies are pointing to a constant rising temperature in a J&K, leading to a serious impact on the health of glaciers. According to the experts, Jammu and Kashmir has lost 22 percent of its glaciers in just five decades and if this trend continues, it will lead to a serious water crisis in the next 30 years. The scientists carrying out long term studies on glaciers in J&K claim that accumulation of black carbon, generated mainly by use of coal and petroleum products remains trapped due to the peculiar geological shape of valley, surrounded by majestic Himalayan ranges is affecting the glaciers, source of several high altitude lakes and rivers. Similar is the case with the glaciers in Himachal Pradesh and Tibet plateau feeding mighty rivers like Indus and Chenab. Given the prevailing situation, the governments at the Centre and the respective states have not learnt any lesson so far. The alarming studies should be looked into seriously and immediate corrective measures to restrict human intervention in Himalavan regions.

Punjab should use its intellectual capital for policymaking

THE HUGE KNOWLEDGE CAPITAL OF PUNJAB REMAINS UNDERUTILISED FOR POLICYMAKING DUE TO DIFFERENCES IN PERSPECTIVES.

Punjab's public policymaking does not factor in the state's Construction of the state's intellectual capital. Policymakers and intellectuals work in isolation, resulting in suboptimal policy outcomes. The world over, a paradigm shift in the form of evidements of a state and a state of the state of dence-based policy has taken place dence-based policy has taken place in which research plays a pivotal role. Thus, it is the right time to bridge the gap between policymak-ing and intellectual capital in Punjab. Policymaking consists of three stages. During the first stage, the pol-icy, problem, which needs to be

icy problem which needs to be addressed is identified. Then, the alternative courses of action to alternative courses of action to resolve the problem are suggested. Subsequently, the executive/legisla-ture selects one of the alternatives. In Punjab, the policy problems are identified mainly by the executive and senior administrators. The alter-pativac are prepared by in house

and senior administrators. The alter-natives are prepared by in-house teams of administrative depart-ments. The alternatives approved become the policy. This top-down policymaking approach, devoid of inputs from researchers and other stakeholders, results in poor out-comes. For better results, an evi-denco-based approach to policymak. dence-based approach to policymaking is needed.

Puniab has more than 30 universities, six national laboratories and research institutes, a number of tech-nical, management, and medical research institutes along with a couple of social sciences research think tanks. These institutions have been tanks. Inese institutions have been undertaking voluminous research, including on Punjab, for publication and registering patents. However, the findings rarely prompt the gov-ernment to take follow-up action. Even the results of studies commis-icand by the accuration ticel are sioned by the government itself are

sioned by the government itself are rarely used in policy formulation. This reveals that the huge knowl-edge capital of the state remains underutilised for policymaking. The demand-supply gap of research for policymaking is due to differences in the perspectives, val-ues, goals and time scales of the pol-icymakers and researchers. Policymakers feel that researchers sho away from policy research and shy away from policy research and the policy-related research that they undertake is overly technical and, hence, difficult to comprehend from the policy relation of the policy of the the policymaking perspective.

On the other hand, researchers are mainly engaged in research for pub-



lications and registering patents. They think that policymakers want quick results, while research is a long-drawn process. The transfer of research for policy purposes and the market, thus, is not the general rule. The policymakers and researchers in Punjab, thus, constitute two sepa-te communities and cultures, lack-

rate communities and cultures, lacking effective communication chaning effective communication chan-nels. Researchers working on Punjab's issues are committed to the cause of the state. The Punjab Government should harness this commitment by using their work in policymaking. The researchers should also introspect about their perspectives towards policy and market-relevant research.

market-relevant research. Two cases of transfer of technolo-gy from the lab to the market during my tenure as Vice-Chancellor of Punjabi University (2017-20) high-light that researchers should be made aware that policy-centric and market-relevant research is not only academically stimulating and but academically stimulating and but also financially rewarding. For scal-ing up the transfer of research to applied areas, the universities need to build the capacity of researchers. The state government has already taken a couple of initiatives by invit-ing current for neulistranking

ing experts for policymaking. Recently, an 11-member committee having a mix of civil servants, experts and stakeholders was formed for drafting the agriculture policy. Earlier, while preparing the Budget and the Punjab Industrial Policy 2022, inputs were invited from the stakeholders, including experts. Similarly, the Punjab School experts. Similarly, the Punjab School Education Policy 2020 was drafted by a committee comprising academi-cians, administrators and other stakeholders. Such good practices should be institutionalised across all sectors.

To foster collaboration between policymakers and researchers, four institutional mechanisms are sug-

First, on the pattern of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, an economic adviso-ry council to the CM should be conry council to the C.M. should be con-stituted. It may have a chairperson and full-time and part-time mem-bers. Its major function should be to render advice to the CM about eco-nomic development, agriculture, industry and service sector, fiscal health, Centre-state financial rela-tions, invastment and tions, investment, employment and application of smart technologies like AI and data analytics in development

It may also prepare periodic reports of the economies of Punjab and other states for formulating the economic policy.

Second, the Punjab State Planning Board has traditionally functioned as a policy think tank. After the aboas a poincy timit tank. After the ado-lition of the Planning Commission, the board was reorganised as the Economic Policy and Planning Board, with the objective of advising the government on policy matters. For achieving this objective, the board should be professionalised on the pattern of NITI Aayog and the the pattern of NITI Aayog and the Kerala State Planning Board. Learning from these models, one of the vice-chairpersons should be an expert; similarly, along with ex-offi-cio members, experts with policy domain knowledge should be inducted in the board. inducted in the board. In the internal organisation, each unit of the board should be steered by an expert. Third, each administrative depart-ment may have an advisory board comprising experts and ex-officio members for giving advice about sectoral policies. The advisory board sectoral poinces. The advisory board should have organic links with the planning board by making the chair-person of each advisory board a member of the latter. Fourth, the research institutes should set up public policy centres. These centres should undertake pol-icy research and penyron in cimpla

icy research and prepare, in simple language, policy briefs of the research and communicate to the

research and communicate to the research departments the policy needs of the government. The Punjab Government may also constitute a public policy unit in the planning board for coordinating with the extension the neuroidia with the policy centres by receiving policy briefs from them and convey-ing the research needs of the govern-

ment to them. Punjabi University, Panjab University and the Institute for Development and Communication already have public policy centres.

And if your eyes are truly open, and your heart aches, you can feel it in gated communities in our big cities; you can experi-ence it as you pass through the 'lonely' crowd; you can see it in the eyes of the old people wait-ing for a phone call from their 'successful' chil-dren settled in distant lands; and ves, you can ing for a phone call from their 'successful' chi-dren settled in distant lands; and yes, you can find it even among young students ceaselessly striving for some sort of mythical success as discrete and atomised warriors in a hyper-com-petitive world. 3 Seconds Of Exercise Three Times A Week Can Help You Grow Muscle: Study



new study says that three seconds a day of resist-ance exercise could increase your muscle strength. The study from Edith Cowan University in Australia in collaboration with institutions in Japan says that eccentric, muscle-lengthening exercises can strengthen bands of fibrous tissue more efficiently than concentric, muscle-shortening actions.

muscle-shortening actions. For the study, a team of scientists asked 26 young volun-teers to do three-second bicep contractions either two or three days a week for four weeks. After four weeks, the arms of those exercising twice a week showed no change, but the three-times-aweek group got stronger. The study said that participants improved their muscle strength by 13.5 emerged. 11.5 per cent.

"We haven't investigated other muscles yet, but if we We haven't investigated other muscles yet, but it we find the three-second rule also applies to other muscles then you might be able to do a whole-body exercise in less than 30 seconds," said exercise and sports scientist Ken Kazuroni Nosska in 2022 according to Science Alert. The study emphasice that three-second bouts of eccentric bicep contractions can achieve impressive physi-cal results. The young participants saw a 2.5 per cent increase in concentric strength and a 3.9 per cent increase in eccentric strength. "Our previous work has shown regular, shorter exercise is more beneficial than one or two big training sessions in a week," Professor Nosaka said. Professor Nosaka added, "Muscle adortations occur whom we are resting or muscles

It should be noted that the exercise was only three seconds, so the rest between exercises in the study was close to 28,800 times more than the exercise time.
