

29.295 vacancies filled in J&K after Abrogation of Article 370: Centre tells Rajya Sabha



The officials provide training to hundreds of girls for lavender and rose cultivation, processing, and value addition. Many women end up establishing their backyard units in association with neighbours and friends in the form of neighbours and friends in the form of

Recently, under the Aroma Mission, CSIR IIIM Bonera distributed 6,600 lavender saplings. Being a versatile herb, lavender is added to scaps, aromatherapy oils, kea, skincare, fragrances, etc., and then sold on various online platforms including the UMEED haat exhibition.

Delivery justice to deprived people

wo highly discriminated and neglected communities--Jammu and Kashmir's linguistic minority Pahari-speaking people and Valmikis are jubilant and filled with exuberance as the BIP-led Central government has introduced bills in the Lok Sabha while fulfilling its commitment to deliver justice to them. The four-decade-long demand of Pahari speaking people for grant of Scheduled Tribe status is being fulfilled while Valmikis struggle for Scheduled Caste status is set to yield desired results. On Tuesday evening, the Union Home Minister Amit Shah while meeting the delegations of Pahari and Gujjar leaders, though separately, assured the Paharis for taking up the bill pertaining to Scheduled Tribe (ST) status to Paharis in the ongoing session of Parliament. He, however, again reiterated that there would be no dilution in the existing quota as well as other ST benefits to Gujjars after the grant of ST status to Paharis. A delegation of at-least 23 leaders from Paharis community, led by former deputy chief minister Muzaffar Hussain Beigh, met the Union Home Minister in New Delhi and expressed its sincere gratitude to the BJP-led NDA government at the Centre for fulfilling four-decade-old demand of the community. There is no denial of the fact that the political parties, including Congress, National Congress and PDP, which always ruled J&K for long and exploited Paharis and Gujjars for their political interests, have been instigating the Gujjars and pitching them against Paharis. Gujjars have been hitting roads and warned the central government against any move to tinker with the existing quota of Gujjars and Bakerwals under ST category. The introduction of Bill pertaining to ST status for Paharis has paved the way to make the demand of this neglected community a big reality. They are exuberant and excited with their areas giving a look of festivity. Based on recommendations of Justice GD Sharma Committee report, the Government has also added Pahari Ethnic Tribe, Paddari Tribe and Koli & Gadda Brahman for accord of Scheduled Tribes (ST) status. Gujjars and Bakerwals in Jammu and Kashmir enjoyed ST status and the Government has already clarified that their rights would not be diluted. Nine seats in the 90-member Assembly of Jammu and Kashmir have been reserved for the STs. Five seats are reserved for STs in Jammu division and four in Kashmir. The Pahari leaders are of the opinion that Gujjars should get benefits of reservation as ST Gujjars while they should be given the reservation benefits as ST Paharis. It would lead to the end of decades-long confrontation, if any, between two communities. Valmikis have also been on cloud nine as they have been delivered justice after decades long victimhood. They feel that their children would now live in a dignified way as they have been residing in Jammu and Kashmir since 1957-58 after shifting from Punjab but were denied genuine rights and reservation by the previous Governments on the grounds of Article 370 of the Constitution of India. The Centre's move ahead of Lok Sabha polls will definitely make a huge impact on the outcome of General elections in Jammu and Kashmir.

Change economic growth strategy to banish poverty faster

THE ALTERNATIVE STRATEGY WILL DO THE JOB OF REDUCING POVERTY FASTER. PROVIDED IT CAN KEEP INFLATION AT BAY.

OW that India, the world's ow that India, the world fifth largest economy, has established itself as the ▲ established itself as the fastest-growing major economy in a world beset by economic uncertainty, interest has grown on finding ways in which it can banish poverty quicker than by following the conventional results of the conventional results. the conventional route. So, here are the contours of an alternative pathway, but before we go into that, let us delineate the conventional

Conventional economic wisdom holds that poverty will be abol-ished in a generation if per capita income goes up by six times during the period. For this, the economy must keep growing at 7 per cent for 25 years. That, in turn, will require an annual investment of 30-32 per cent of the GDP. This is not beyond reach as last year, the gross fixed capital formation, a proxy for total investment, reached 29.2 per cent of the GDP.

However, the need to shift to renewable energy requires fresh investment, which will likely take resources from the amount away resources from the amount available for investment to raise output. This will slow down growth even as India has a long way to go. In terms of per capita income, it ranks a lowly 149th among 194 countries.

The first point about the alterna-The first point about the alterna-tive strategy is that it moves away from specific focus on per capita income. The present healthy aggre-gate growth in per capita income is enabled by a K-shaped recovery. The rich are getting richer, but the poor are not making much head-way. So, such growth is not doing much to elimitate powerts by raismuch to eliminate poverty by rais-ing income at the lower levels.

ing income at the lower levels. This is tellingly illustrated by the trend in the sale of smartphones. Lately, the sale of cheap and middle-level smartphones costing up to Rs 30,000 has actually been falling and that of phones costing over Rs 30,000 is doing nicely. If the per capita income is not a good number to go by in measuring poverty, what is? In the alternative growth strategy, the need is to focus on the entire range of human development indicators. If a country does well by this measure, then it does not matter so much if it does it does not matter so much if it does poorly by one indicator - per capita income. A country can suffer from income poverty even as it

years of schooling for girls, stunt-ing among children and out-of-pocket health expenditure. Significantly, Bangladesh scores

better than India on most of these indicators but is behind it in terms of per capita income measured in purchasing power parity terms. As per the International Monetary Fund's 2023 figures, India has a PPP per capita income of \$9,070 compared to Bangladesh's \$8,660. But in terms of the 2021 Human But in terms of the 2021 Human Development Report ranking, Sri Lanka (73), China (79) and Bangladesh (129) are ahead of India (132), whereas Pakistan (161), Nepal (143) and Myanmar (149) are behind.

behind.

So, where does India go from here? What strategy should it follow to rapidly reduce the level of poverty? There is a need to focus on food availability, schooling, healthcare (particularly reducing out-of-pocket expenditure) and women's empowerment, and let the overall growth rate take care of itself if high romyth mostly leads. itself. If high growth mostly leads to higher income by the already well-off, which results in, among other things, buoyant sales of other things, buoyant sales of SUVs, then that is of not much help to the poor.

The government's focus till now has been on public investment in infrastructure, which, it is expect ed, will crowd in private investment. A robust infrastructure lay the foundations for future growth, but in the short run, it does not lead to much job creation. Currently, the private sector has been far behind in capital investment, waiting for demand to pick up before deciding to add to

up before deciding to add to installed capacity.

The quickest impact on poverty can be made by creating enough jobs. This can be done in two ways. By helping raise farm incomes, demand for rural services and hands needed to deliver them will processed in the within assess the increase. In the urban areas, the most powerful job creators are the micro, small and medium busi-nesses, which should be able to nesses, which should be able to access enough working capital. When these businesses run robust-ly, they create more jobs, enabling their workers to earn and consume more. The resultant rise in consumption expenditure will trans-late into higher sales volume for

late into higher sales volume for the FMCG companies.

The link between out-of-pocket health expenditure and poverty is too obvious to need explaining, with serious health episodes often driving families into destitution. As for adequate schooling and post-school skills training, these help young workers enter the job market with better skills and abili-ty to earn pone which will take market with better skills and abili-ty to earn more, which will take them out of poverty quicker. Few will have any quarrel with the logic of the foregoing ideas to beef up social services, except that the resources for such an action plan have to come from somewhere. have to come from somewhere. The government has to maintain a fiscal balance as otherwise, it will be risking inflation. This will, in turn, lead to the central bank tightin interest rates, which can do seri ous damage to growth and the fight against poverty.

Right now, elections and promis Right now, elections and promises of freebies are setting the tone of Indian politics. The Congress is popularly believed to have come to power in Karnataka by promising a lot of goodies, not the least of which is free bus travel for women. The ruling Congress in Rajasthan, with a deptions congression Rajasthan, with a deption congression Rajasthan. with elections approaching, has just passed a legislation that s a basic minimum incon assures a basic minimum income to all, particularly the elderly and the specially abled. It will not be surprising if the ruling NDA at the Centre unveils its own bagful of giveaways as next year's General Election get closer.

In sum, the conventional growth In sum, the conventional growth strategy will take longer to remove poverty. The alternative strategy will do the job faster, provided it can keep inflation at bay. Measures which will help boost

Measures which will neap tools farmer-producer organisations to raise farm incomes or making available more working capital to micro, small and medium businesses are essentially non-infla-

These can top the to-do list for those adopting the alternative growth strategy. Free bus travel for women can come next as it is selfselecting.

Better-off women don't travel often by bus. As for the rest of the list, action on every item will have to carefully weigh the welfare gains against the inflation risk.

Ukraine shadow set to loom large over G20 meet

THE G20 summit is scheduled to be HIE G20 summit is scheduled to be held in Delhi in a little more than six weeks. According to media reports, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugu-rate the summit venue at Pragati Majdan today (July 26). There is no doubt that India has the capability to ensure flawless and suc-cessful logistics for the summit. The govern-ment has also held numerous meetings in difment has also held numerous meetings in dif-ferent parts of the country on various subjects and themes covered by the G20. It adopted this novel and unprecedented approach to ensure that most parts of the country get a sense of participation in India's presidency of the group, even though it is only rotational in

The G20 summit is one of the most impor-The G20 summit is one of the most important multilateral events ever hosted by India. This is because this group of 20 – 19 countries and the European Union – "represents around 85 per cent of the global GDP, over 75 per cent of the global trade and about two-thirds of the world population", as India's website on the summit notes. Modi would actually be losen to decrease the tense to the countries of the forms. website of the summit notes. Most would naturally be keen to do everything possible to have a memorable summit. The question, though, is what will actually constitute a suc-

While such a question is germane to every while such a question is germane to every multilateral summit, it becomes essential to ask it regarding the G20 summit because of the deep global divisions generated by the Russia-Ukraine conflict. There will inevitably be special attention on India, as the host coun-try, for generally it is the host's responsibility to find a way through the contentions to forge a consensus outcome document. If India is



unable to do so, will this detract from the suc-

This question is also relevant because all previous G20 summits resulted in consensus previous G20 summits resulted in consensus documents. A Bali Declaration emerged from the last summit held in Indonesia in November 2022, following which India took over the group's leadership. The declaration contained a paragraph dealing with the Russia-Ukraine conflict. It was carefully crafted. It referred to the statements already made by G20 members at the United Nations Security Council and General Assembly. It Security Council and General Assembly. It noted that the UNGA deplored Russia's aggression against Ukraine. It also mentioned that most G20 members 'condemned' the Russian aggression against Ukraine. Thus, the paragraph was, all in all, critical of Russia

paragraph was, all in all, critical of Russia. In all meetings at ministerial and other levels held under India's presidency on different subjects, Russia and China have refused to endorse the Bali Declaration paragraph on Ukraine. To deal with their objections, India adopted a policy to issue 'Outcome Document and China' Comment of the Comment of the Comment and Chair's Summary' for each of these meetings. While the 'Outcome Document' portion of the meetings' reports relate to the agree-ments reached on the subjects under consider-

meetings, the 'Chair's Summary' is on the Ukraine conflict.

Summary is on the Ukraine conflict.

The 'Chair's Summary' repeats the Bali
Declaration paragraph on Ukraine with a
footnote that Russia and China did not agree
with it. This stratagem has worked because
India has the cover provided by the Bali
Declaration but that will not be available for
the Delhi summit declaration. A subsequent
summit is naturally not bound by the formusummit is naturally not bound by the formulations of previous summits. Till now, the negotiations led by Indian officials have not negotiations led by Indian officials have not closed the gap on this difficult issue. If India adopts the 'Chair's Summary' route at the Delhi summit, it has to ensure that its formulation is largely acceptable to all members. It cannot fly solo; it entails the risk of crashing and can lead to charges that the summit has failed.

Indian negotiators are aware of the problems that the Ukraine issue will create, though lems that the Ukraine issue will create, though they will try their best to find a language that is acceptable to all members. This process, howsoever difficult, cannot be ignored and will have to be undertaken at the next Sherpas' meeting. Meanwhile, Indian negotiators are falling back on what can only be con-sidered as 'Plan B'. This banks on emphasising India's achievements during its presidening India's achievements during its presiden-cy, especially giving primacy and voice to issues concerning the welfare of the Global South. It also involves making developed countries pay attention to the pressing prob-lems relating to the debt burden of the Global South. In addition, India is keen to show how distill nower can be barnessed for smooth digital power can be harnessed for speedy development. The crowning part of 'Plan B' is India's advocacy for the African Union becoming a member of the G20. There is a good chance that it will succeed in this endeavour. Thus, even if no consensus is reached on the Ukraine crisis, India will reached on the Ukraine crisis, India will emphasise that its C20 presidency and the summit have been successful because it has emerged as the leading advocate of the Global South. This will be attributed to Modf's inter-national stature and the great position India has come to acquire globally under his nine-year stewardship of the country. While no C20 member is likely to challenge.

While no G20 member is likely to challenge India's version of a successful summit, the India's version of a successful summit, the western press would take a rather different view. Its main interest will be the Ukraine war and the statements of western leaders on that war. They will also observe the approach taken by China — if President Xi Jipning participates in the summit, what he would say on the view of the property of the prope Ukraine, and on his possible interaction with US President Joe Biden and other western US President Joe Biden and other western leaders. It will also focus on the summit's approaches to the concerns of developed economies. Naturally, if Russian President Vladimir Putin attends the summit, all attention will be on his presence and the reaction it evokes among his western peers.

There are several health issues around the world that affect women particularly. As per a new study, women who work outdoors are regularly exposed to high levels of sunlight, which reduces their risk of develop ing breast cancer. As per a study by Danish researchers, women who spent more than 20 years working



outdoors had a 17 per cent lower chance of a breast cancer diagnosis.

The team has said that this may be due to high levels of vitamin D, which is produced by the body when it is exposed to sunlight. The study, however, did not specifically look at the vitamin D levels of the look at the vitamin D levels of the participants, unable to draw a direct link between supplementation, diet, vitamin D levels, and risk of breast cancer, therefore. Researchers identified women

with a history of breast cancer and compared their data with women compared their data with women who did not have the disease. On analysing the parameters, they found a link between profession, sunlight exposure, and risk of breast cancer. They found that outdoor workers of more than 20 years were at 17 per cent less chance of getting breast cancer. The findings of the study were published online in the journal BMJ. journal BMJ. According to Julie Elbæk

Pedersen, study author from the Danish Cancer Society, "The main hypothesis is that sun exposure through vitamin D production may decrease the risk of breast cancer after age 50.

"Women who work outdoors may regularly be exposed to sunlight and thereby have more sufficient long-term levels of vitamin D compared with women working indoors," she added.
