



# **Murkier fight comes** to an end?

mid the ongoing tussle, wrestlers Sakshi Malik, Bajrang Punia and Vinesh Phogat resumed their duties in the Railways. This came after the protesting wrestlers met Union Home Minister Amit Shah late Saturday evening. The protesting wrestlers were evicted from Jantar Mantar in Delhi recently. Bajrang Punia and Vinesh Phogat too have joined work. The fight between top wrestlers and Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh turned murkier with sportswomen who have accused him of sexual harassment received overwhelming support from different quarters. Even politicians too have jumped into the bout to make maximum out of it politically Among the world-class, medal-winning wrestlers leading the fight for justice are Vinesh Phogat, Sakshi Malik and Bajrang Punia. The WFI chief has even offered to resign from the post with a precondition that the wrestlers would return from the protest site. It was seen as a major win for protesting sportswomen who had been forced to move the Supreme Court because their pleas to sports authorities and the Delhi Police were in vain. Thereafter, on the SC's order, the Delhi Police on Friday lodged two FIRs against Singh, including one under the POCSO Act for sexually abusing a minor wrestler. The WFI chief, now being booked under a non-bailable offence, has been put in the dock after the SC decision. The contro-versial Singh, who is also a powerful BJP MP, claims to be innocent but definitely the SC ruling has brought a lot of worries for him. Singh had been evading action over the heinous charges levelled against him. The agitation of the aggrieved players', who are backed by international stars, began for justice in January. Feted by the country for their feats, they were confident of their cry being heard by the powers that be. They even turned down support offered by political bigwigs from the CPM and the Congress. Displaying the sporting spirit, they called off their dharna on January 23 after being assured of an investigation into their complaints by the Indian Olympic Association's Oversight Committee (OC), headed by champion boxer Mary Kom. The government had succumbed to the relentless protests by some of the country's top wrestlers and appointed boxing great MC Mary Kom-lead five-member Oversight Committee to probe sexual harassment charges against the powerful WFI president. At that time, an ugly bout had been played out, not in the sporting arena but at Jantar Mantar in Delhi where female wrestlers had leveled serious allegations against the WFI president. It was a courageous attempt to clean up the management of wrestling which has been bringing glory to India with its rich haul of medals at global platforms. However, last week, they suffered a jolt and were forced to amp up their protest when the OC report was not made public by the Sports Ministry. They sat on a dharna again and, this time, welcomed the support of politicians and fellow players. The field of sports is no stranger to complaints of sexual misconduct by those at the helm. Only exemplary action against sexual predators can clean up the mess. Though it is not clear as to what protesting wrestlers have been assured, yet the need of the hour is that the government should ensure a fair investigation and trial in the matter so that truth comes out

# **NEPAL PM TICKS THE RIGHT BOXES DURING INDIA VISIT**

BUILDING ECONOMIC TIES. FACILITATING TRADE AND BOOSTING CONNEC-TIVITY ARE THE IMPERATIVES FOR NEPAL.

-EPAL'S Prime Ministe Pushpa Kamal Dahal Prachanda' was on a four-day official visit to India from May 31 to June 3. This was his first foreign trip after taking over as PM in January. Six months, though, to undertake the first overseas visit is a undertake the first overseas visit is a bit unusual for Nepali PMs, but the circumstances under which he became Prime Minister appear to have kept him engaged. The December 2022 elections had

hrown up a fractured verdict in the 275-member House of Representatives. Former PM Sher Bahadur Deuba's Nepali Congress, which had an electoral understand-ing with Prachanda's Maoist Centre, won 88 seats, while the Communist Party

of Nepal (Unified Marxist-Leninist or UML) of ex-PM Marxist-Lenuist or UML) of ex-PM KP Sharma Oli won 79 seats. Prachanda's party got only 32 seats; with the support of some smaller parties, Deuba appeared to be in the driving seat till Prachanda pipped him to the PM's post in January with the support of the UML. Shrewdly, balant ad-exposed some with Deuba and the support of the UML. Shrewdiy, he kept a door open with Deuba and switched alliances in March, when the election was held for the President of Nepal, and he chose to back the Nepali Congress candidate and not the one put up by the UML. In an interesting twist of fate Ram

In an interesting twist of fate, Ram Chandra Paudel, who was consis-Chandra Paudel, who was consis-tently bested by Deuba in the quest for leadership of their party, became Nepal's Head of Statel Prachanda's government is now essentially a coalition of the Nepali Congress, his Maoist Centre and the Madhesi par-ties, who by themselves emerged splintered after the election. The presence of the Nepali Congress in the country's President are usually comforting signs for India. Receiving Prachanda at Hyderabad House, Prime Minister Modi envisioned taking the India-Nepal ties to Himalayan heights. To

To this end, three major completed this end, three major completed infrastructure projects were inaugu-rated virtually and three more were launched, including integrated checkposts that facilitate trade, new electricity transmission lines and the extension of the oil pipeline system to include acotem Name and actend to include eastern Nepal and extend the existing pipeline to Chitwan. Storage facilities for these pipelines



ould also be constructed in Nepal. would also be constructed in Nepal. Discussions have also started on building a fertiliser plant in Nepal, something that would be of critical usefulness for Nepali agriculture. Hydropower is Nepal's foremost

Hydropower is Nepai's foremost economic asset. Tapping it and wheeling the power to India has game-changing economic benefits to Nepai and helps meet India's massively growing demand for elec-tricity, even more important in today's times of climate change where the important is to exchange where the imperative is to eschev fossil fuel-based energy generation. Till a few years back, Nepal was Till a few years back, Nepal was importing power from India, but is today exporting 450 MW to India. With work on the 900-MW Arun III project proceeding apace (being developed by Shimla headquartered SUNII) who wisit cour protoco SJVNL), the visit saw matters finalised for the 700-MW Lower Inalised for the 700-MW Lower Arun project too. All of this would make Nepal a major producer of hydropower in the coming years; a landmark agreement was reached for importing 10,000 MW from Nural in the project 10,000 MW from Nepal in the coming 10 years.

Nepal in the coming 10 years. India is by far Nepal's biggest trading partner and continues to remain the critical partner for its economy, which has taken a severe hit from Covid and its fallout. Building economic ties, facilitating trade and boosting connectivity are imperatives for Nepal and have rightly been the main stay of sub-catorius action durine the visit action during the visit. stantive action during the visit. Prachanda was in India for the fourth time as PM, but, interesting-ly, the first time in the traditional dress daura suruwal. However, Nepali politics is not one of hardcore adherence to ideology and Prachanda appears to have decided that this makeover is the need of the hour. Not surprisingly, projects related to the Ramayana circuit were agreed upon and his trip included temple visits to Indore and included temple visits to Indore and Ujjain. In 2016, he had visited the hydropower project in Nathpa Jhakri and Patanjali's herbal unit in Haridwar. As someone who knows India well, including from his longish incognito sojourn during the days of the Maoist insurgency in

Nepal, Prachanda is certainly sig Nepal, Prachanda is certainly sig-nalling India too. This signal is also reinforced by India being the first port of call this time, unlike his pre-vious stints as PM when he made China the destination of his first recent this Department between the overseas trip. Perceptions about him in India would certainly be known in India would certainly be known to him. Significantly, on the eve of the visit, the President of Nepal signed a Bill into law that would facilitate grant of Nepali citizenship to Indian women married to Nepali men a lorestording downed of the men, a longstanding demand of the Madhesh. This Bill had been Madhesh. opposed by the Chinese, who fear opposed by the Chinese, who lear easy grant of Nepali citizenship to Tibetans. Of course, the prominent presence of his daughter with him throughout the trip was another sig-nal that mustn't be missed. Prachanda's India visit appears by uziew presence to how a cons

He has hopefully re-estab-lished chemistry with India's leader-ship through bilateral moves on development issues that should bring benefits to the people of Nepal and its economy. Given the 'aaya me orus orus' compared to Nepal ram gaya ram' approach of Nepali politics, the question uppermost on pointcs, ine question uppermost on people's mind is about the longevity of his government. In this, while he may be able to manage external fac-tors, the numbers in the House of Representative are such that the appetites of both Deuba and Oli will continue to remain urbated, and continue to remain whetted, and Prachanda must remain the master juggler.



NEW DELHI: From single-use water bottles to food packaging and personal care products, plastic has perme-ated every aspect of our lives. Recognizing the grave ated every aspect of our lives. Recognizing the grave environmental threat posed by plastic pollution, world leaders and policymakers, including the Government of India, have intensified their focus on environmen-tal sustainability. However, the gendered impact of this growing, hazard remains overlooked and inadequate-ly addressed. Women, often relegated to the margins, are at the forefront of battling the repercussions of our plastic addiction. Their roles not only as primary con-sumers but also as workers in the informal waste sector in India make them particu-larly vulnerable. The rise of plastic pollution and the comparative disadvantage of women in the waste sec-tor
