Make Gram Nyayalayas non-functional

spite the tall claims of the government about the empowerment of rural masses in Jammu and Kashmir, there are certain decisions which need to be taken with utmost urgency to ensure that the people get all facilities at their doorsteps. In one of such steps, Gram Nyayalayas---deemed to be a Court of Judicial Magistrate of First Class with both civil and criminal jurisdiction to settle petty disputes at the village level - have remained a distant dream in the Union Territory. This is despite the fact that over 50,000 criminal and civil cases have been pending in the Union Territory for more than five years. These Nyayalayas were notified under the Gram Nyavalayas Act, 2008 with an aim of making justice more speedy and affordable for the most underprivileged people in rural areas at their door steps. A total of 20 Gram Nyayalayas - one each in a district--were notified for Jammu and Kashmir but none of them has been made functional in the past one decade. The state and UT governments were responsible for establishing Gram Nyayalayas in consultation with the respective High Courts. As per information made available by State Governments and High Courts, a total of 476 Gram Nyayalayas have been notified so far by 15 States and UTs across the country. Out of these, 257 are operational in 10 States at present. A total of 20 such Nyavalayas were notified to be opened in Jammu and Kashmir, while the number of these Nyayalayas to be opened in Ladakh UT was two, but no Nyayalayas was made functional in both the UTs till date, notwithstanding it provides for establishment of Gram Nyayalayas at intermediate panchavat level. As many as 19.771 civil and 34.212 criminal cases had been pending for more than five years in Jammu and Kashmir. Though the Act does not make setting up of Gram Nyayalayas mandatory, the issues affecting operationalization of the Gram Nyavalayas were discussed in the Conference of Chief Justices of High Courts and Chief Ministers of the States in 2013. It was decided that the state governments and High Courts should decide the question of setting up Gram Nyayalayas wherever feasible, taking into account the local issues and situation. The Central Government has been encouraging the States and UTs by way of providing financial assistance for opening of Gram Nyayalayas. The establishment of these institutions is a policy decision. These institutions could have easily performed the role of making justice more accessible and affordable for rural people, as envisioned in the Constitution, they could have eased the problem of overcrowding in sub-ordinate and district courts. It would be a great help to the poor people in rural areas of Jammu and Kashmir. The Gram Nyayalayas were envisaged to make justice delivery more accessible and affordable for the people at the grassroots. However, they are yet to take off and this is in spite of the fact that financial assistance is being given by the Centre to operationalize them. The time has come that the government should take tangible measures to ensure that these institutions are made functional without further delay so that the people get justice at their doorsteps

WHY DO BANKS TAKE AWAY OUR TRACTOR & MACHINERY OR SEEK TO PUT US IN JAIL? WHY DON'T THEY INSTEAD TAKE OUR CROPS?' SAYS A DISTRAUGHT FARMER.

T leaves you dumbstruck. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has directed banks to go in for a 'compromise settlement' with 16,044 fraudsters, crooks and wilful defaulters – people who can pay but give a damn – who had collec-tively defrauded the banks to the

tune of Rs 3.46 lakh crore by the end of December 2022. After a cooling period of 12 months, the defaulters will be eligible for fresh loans.

This comes at a time when banks in Rajasthan have launched an exer-cise to impound the cultivable land of 19,422 farmers who have default-ed on loan repayments in the past four years.

A year ago, the Punjab State Cooperative Agricultural Development Bank had planned to Development Bank had planned to sisue arrest warrants to speed up the recovery process against 71,000 defaulting farmers. The unpaid amount was Rs 3,200 crore – a frac-tion of what the wilful defaulters collectively owe. The bank had, in fact, served legal notices to 2,000 farmers with landholding exceeding five acres, which the state govern

Intracts with industing texteening five acres, which the state govern-ment subsequently withdrew. While a majority of the wilful defaulters, including a number of crooks who have run away with public money, will get the banks to write off their outstanding amount as part of the 'settlement', defaulting Rajasthan farmers have no such choice. A majority of the farmers will lose their only source of liveli-hood. With the RBI throwing a 'rak-sha kavach' around the crony capi-talists, it is only the poor farmers (and defaulters in other categories) who are left to fend for themselves. who are left to fend for themselves This shows how the banking system

This shows how the banking system actually helps the rich become rich-er and the poor to be driven against the wall. A few months back, a pregnant daughter of a farmer in Jharkhand was mowed down by the goons of a non-banking firm under the tractor that they were forcibly trying to drive away with. In the past, there have been reports of auctions of tractors and other machines that are seized by the banks. Not only confis-cating the movable property of farmers, but also impounding their farmers, but also impounding their arable land and even putting farm-ers in jail for dishonouring the cheques (that are taken blank from



farmers) are routine tactics. Across the country, such stories abound where high-handedness against the defaulting farmers adds to the agrarian distress, pushing them to survive at the margins.

Survive at the margins. Non-payment of dues eventually turns out to be a torture for the defaulting farmers. They may have genuine reasons, such as crop fail-ures and a sudden crash in the prices, but for the banking system, when if the docultine groups it. even if the defaulting amount is petty, they are an easy target. Much of the farm suicides that happen and the agrarian distress that exists are because of the indebtedness, which are mounting with each passing

The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) has often recorded this as the primary reason behind farm suicides and the latest tarm suicides and the latest Situational Assessment Survey for Agricultural Households, released in 2021, has worked out that every farmer carries an average debt of Rs 74,121. With nearly 70 per cent of the farmers indebted, the average debt here atto-divisors of the 77 per cent has steadily increased by 57 per cent since 2013

Knowing that farmers have been denied their rightful income over the decades and considering that not more than 14 per cent of the entire harvest is procured at Minimum Support Price (MSP), for the farmers producing the remaining 86 per cent of the crops, the dis-

tress price they often get does not even cover the cost of production and, thereby, entails great pain, suf-fering, sorrow and mental distress. And finally, when the farmers fail to repay a bank instalment, even their repay a bank instalment, even their lands are taken away. Imagine the mental strain the defaulting Rajasthan farmers must be under with the sword of Damocles hang-ing over their head. This is the worry of a Karnataka farmer, Echaghatta Siddaveerappa.

farmer, icnagnatia Siddaveerappa. Hailing from Chitradurga district, he invited me a few days back to visit his village to see how they had found an ingenious solution to the vexed crisis. When a few farmers in his taluka received a bank notice asking them to nav the needling asking them to pay the pending dues before the recovery proceed-ings were launched, these farmers came up with an innovative idea came up with an innovative idea. Using the Swaminathan Commission's formula to estimate the comprehensive cost of produc-tion plus 50 per cent profit, they packed their crop produce (equal to the amount pending against their name) and reached the bank's office. They approached four banks, and asked the banks to accept their

asked the banks to accept their pending dues in kind. "We took a crop loan from the bank. We produced a bountiful harvest. But with market prices remaining low, we are unable to recover even what we had spent. In that case, how do the banks expect us to pay back in time?" an anguished Siddaveerappa asked me, adding: "Sir, why should the banks take away our tractor and machinery or seek court's orders to put us in jail? Why don't they instead take our crops?" Well, all said and done, there is

certainly merit in what the angry farmers say. After all, they pro-duced the crops for which the loans were taken. And they were willing to pay it back in kind.

to pay it back in kind. To the question as to what the banks would do with the crop har-vest, the answer is simple. If the banks can put to public auction the seized tractors or the impounded cultivable lands (for which they have no inbuilt expertise), they can also plan to put the harvested crop for sale. The banks will need to rent charge a row or more into an storage space or enter into an arrangement with Mother Dairy and other organised retailers like Reliance Fresh, Big Basket and Big Bazaar. Certainly, this is not going to be a

prohibitive cost that the banks can-not undertake. If the banks have the not undertake. If the banks have the resources to write off corporate bad loans to the tune of Rs 13 lakh crore in 10 years, and are able to provide huge 'haircuts' to the defaulting units under the insolvency proceed-ing, it is ingo to put the profile ings, it is time to put the profits where they belong. This surely is the prescription for a debt-free agricul-ture.

Digital 'dark patterns' exploit consumer vulnerability. Interfaces on websites or devices are tweaked to deceive, hoodwink or push consumers into making unintended purchase decisions inimical to their interest or even share personal data unintentionally, affecting their privacy

Who wants to buy travel insurance for a domestic flight? Yet, many consumers purchas-ing domestic airline tickets online end up with travel insurance that they never intended to buy, thanks to deceitful user buy, thanks to deceitful user interfaces that trick them into paying for such policies. Last month, a reader told me about one such purchase of insurance, along with his airline tickets. He said he never wanted the insurance, but somehow ended up having to pay Rs 249 extra for the policy on each ticket!

Well, it was not an inadvertent mistake committed by the con-sumer, but a deliberate ploy on the part of the service provider to sell the insurance through subsell the insurance through sub-terfuge. The user interface on some websites is designed in such a way that when you buy an air ticket, a pre-checked box opting for travel insurance will amore fisce you are not interappear. Since you are not interested in the insurance and do not expect someone to sell it to you without your consent, you do not notice that the website has

already tick-marked your acceptance of the offer. So, obvi-ously, you do not negate or reverse it. In other words, the default option is purchase of insurance, and if you do not see it and change it, you are charged for the insurance. Thus, the insurer sells a policy, the portal gets its commission and the con-sumer suffers a loss. This is a clear case of fraud, an unfair trade practice. It also violates insurance regulations governing the sale of insurance.

the sale of insurance. Yet, such practices, described as digital 'dark patterns', contin-ue to exploit consumer vulnera-bility. What consumers do not know is that businesses are increasingly spending money on User Evergence (ID) designmers 'User Experience' (UX) designers to create user interfaces (or your interaction with a website, an application or an electronic device) that are deliberately tweaked to hoodwink, manipulate, deceive or push consumers into making unintended purchase decisions inimical to their interest or even share personal data unintentionally, affecting heir privacy. 'Bait and switch' is another



such example, where a website such example, where a website offers some goods or products at rock-bottom prices, but as soon as you opt for them, their prices suddenly go up or a different, higher price is shown. And it barpens so unickly that you will ugher price is shown. And it happens so quickly that you will wonder whether you mistook the earlier price claim! Similarly, when ...

indicate your size, the price goes up, implying that only that par-ticular size is priced higher. Log on to the website in another name and try another size – you will find the same response. Sometimes, when you are trying to make an informed deciing clothes online, you choose a sion, you are hustled into mak-

ing a purchase by an announce-ment that the product is avail-able at that price only for a very short duration, and only one item is left! The ticking of the countdown timer only adds to the panic, forcing you to make a decision that may not be in your best interest. Well, do not be sur-rised if the same moduct is still dress based on its quality, design and price, but as soon as you indicate your size, the price goes prised if the same product is still available the next day, at the

same price! Make no mistake – these are not some inadvertent flaws in technology, but carefully crafted user interfaces aimed at exploiting consumer behaviour and ing consumer behaviour and psychology and they are becom-ing more and more sophisticated and pervasive, requiring con-sumers to be extremely alert while interacting with a website or an app or an e-merchant.

As consumer protection agen-cies around the world express concern over this increasing concern over this increasing trend and come up with meas-ures to counter them, many UX designers are exhorting their co-professionals to practice ethical designing and come up with configurations that are fair to consumers and completely consumers and completely transparent. Such a plea for an ethical code and self-regulation comes in the wake of consumer comes in the wake of consumer demand that not just companies, but even UX designers be hauled up for 'dark patterns'.

The Advertising Standards Council of India, which last year brought out a comprehensive report on 'dark patterns', has also strongly urged companies not to exploit UX designs to

build stakeholder value by corr

build stakeholder value by com-promising consumer value. A good piece of advice! Those who do not heed this advice will have to face the law. Already, the Union Ministry of Consumer Affairs is looking at Consumer Affairs is looking at ways and means of curbing such practices and protecting con-sumers. While rules and regula-tions (under the Consumer Protection Act) defining 'dark

patterns' and prohibiting them is the need of the hour, even under the need of the hour, even under the existing provisions of the Consumer Protection Act, the Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) can haul up online entities for 'dark patterns'. Since the CCPA has wide-rang-ing powers to deal with unfair trade practices including decamtrade practices, including deceptive advertising and promotion, it can also impose deterrent fines and penalties.

It can also impose deterrent lines and penalties. Educating consumers on the 'dark patterns' is equally impor-tant. That would not only pre-vent consumers from falling prey to these kind of machina tions, but will also give the CCPA good feedback for action. The writer is a consume affairs expen

In September last year, a well-known Sikh Hakeent' (Unani medicine practitioner) was shot dead by unidentified gummen inside his clinic in Peshawar. In 2018, Charanjit Singh, a prominent Sikh community member, was killed by unknown men in Peshawar. Similarly, news channel anchor Ravinder Singh was killed in 2020 in the city.

LONDON: English cricket is the envy of other sports due to the success of the Hundred, according to Stuart Cain, Warwickshire's chief executive. 
