The AFSPA was implemented in J&K in 1990 due to insurgency and it remains among the most militarised regions of the world. The Act empowers the security services

to detain persons and use force, even lethal force, with immunity from prosecution. The actions taken under AFSPA, even the use of lethal force, are immune from prosecu-tion and prosecution can

tion and prosecution can only happen after sanc-tion from the Union gov-ernment.

In recent years, the AFSPA has been reduced from several areas in Northeast India. Earlier this year, the AFSPA was removed from several areas in Manipur, Naga-land, and Assam.

On Terrorism
The defense minister said that Jammu and Kashmir has suffered the brunt of terrorism for a long time and people here know how the poison of terrorism hollows out the society.

The plan aims to safeguard the district's natural resources and promote sustainable practices. The DC stressed the importance of provision of rain-water harvesting in all buildings, stating that no building permissions would be granted within municipal areas without such provisions. The EOs of all the three MCs were asked to submit action taken reports and details in this regard by 10th of July 2023. The Committee reviewed the implementation of previous directives and guidelines.

Stakeholders have already submitted their annual plans in accordance with the revised guidelines of the National Green Tribunal, which shall be uploaded on the designated portal The plan aims to safeguard the dis-

by the 5th of July.

Special training has been imparted a designated Sul-C to a designated Sub-Committee to upload the Plan on the portal. To pro-mote environmental consciousness, the Environment Conservation Day was celebrated on June 5th, the meet-

ing was told.

The DC asked to declare weekly,
Swachhta and Pani Champions in all the educational institutions to sensitise the youth on environment and water conservation.

These titles will be given to students who actively contribute towards cleanliness and the protection of water resources in their sur-roundings. Additionally, the EOs (Executive Officers) of the Municipal (Executive Officers) of the Municipal Councils were instructed to take up City afforestation and protect the existing fauna in their respective jurisdictions. In rural areas, 105 Waste Segregation Sheds, known as Swachhta Banks, have been established to collect plastic, polythene, and other solid waste. Volunteers who collect waste from these areas will be rewarded with cash incentives. The DC also highlighted the need to identify suitable land, whether state-owned, Kacharie or within forest areas, for the construction of Amrit Sarovars (sacred ponds) to conserve water and encourage the establishment of more water bodies. ment of more water bodies.

Taking serious note of non submis-sion of ATRs by some officers on the decisions made by the Committee in the previous meetings, DC has made it clear that stern action, including imposition of fine and entry in the service record shall be taken against those not submitting ATRs in time henceforth.

Inordinate delays but high hopes prevail

fter the abrogation of Article 370 and bifurcation of erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories (UTs), there were high hopes among the people that all developmental projects which had been stuck for decades would make some progress and would be completed well in time. There was a strong feeling that it would be the dawn of a new beginning for Jammu and Kashmir. It proved true when one looked at the progress of certain projects of national importance. Like Udhampur-Baramullah train project, the much-talked about 750-km-long gas pipeline project between Bhatinda and Srinagar via Jammu has also remained entangled in red-tape during the last 11 years. The project has not moved even a single inch since last many years. During the Budget for financial year 2021-22, the Centre had announced that a gas pipeline project would be taken up in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. This project was approved way back in 2011 but the irony of subject matter is that no physical progress has been achieved on it since then. Union Finance Ministry in its report on 'Implementation of Budget Announcements-2021-22', tabled in the Parliament while Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman unveiled a bigger Rs 39.45 lakh crore Budget, said that GAIL, India's leading natural gas company, has so far submitted Design for Reliability (DFR), besides directive was issued to Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB) for issuing authorization for Gurdaspur - Srinagar pipeline to GAIL. The Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas has requested the government of J&K to levy zero percent VAT on natural gas in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir. The PIB (Public Investment Board) and EFC (Expenditure Finance Committee) approval for VGF (Viability gap funding) grant to the project is still under process. This is despite the fact that the Centre made a commitment on the floor of the House that a gas pipeline project would be undertaken in the current financial year by the end of March 2021. Now, there has been significant escalation in the cost of the project due to red tape and bureaucratic lethargy. Gujarat state-promoted GSPL had won a licence in 2011 to lay the 750-km pipeline from Bathinda in Punjab state up to Srinagar, with the condition that extension to Jammu and Srinagar would depend on a technical and commercial feasibility report. In August 2020, GSPL wrote to the PNGRB to surrender authorisation to extend the pipeline beyond Punjab to Jammu and Srinagar citing low gas demand and technical complexities. Thereafter, the PNGRB asked GSPL to build part of the pipeline from Bathinda to the border of Punjab by the end of last year and extend it to Jammu and Srinagar by February 24. Unfortunately, the project has made no physical progress due to continued red tape and administrative lethargy. The Rs 880-crore project was envisaged to connect the J&K with the National Gas Grid through the pipeline and ultimately link individual households with gas stations through a network of supply lines for round-the-clock supply of cooking gas especially during winters when Kashmir Valley remains covered with snow. The gas pipeline project holds great importance and the priority should have been accorded to sort out all issues confronting it. The government of India should seriously view the administrative lethargy as well as technical issues that have so far come in the way of smooth execution of project. The responsibility for inordinate delay in the project should be fixed and it must be ensured that the project is completed well within the

THE SHIFT TOWARDS **CLEAN ENERGY**

support to unlock the potential for clean energy in emerging and developing economies
Clean energy generation appears
Chimerical even as climate changes the world over, particularly in vulnerable and densely populated countries like India and China, is wreaking havoe in terms of welfare loss to the millions of people inhabiting the two Asiatic giants. India and China no doubt sang hosannas over the ideals of clean energy and sans reservation signed the Paris sans reservation signed the Paris Accord of 2015 to bring down the rising global temperatures even when the then Trump administra-tion in the United States had little qualms in walking out of the pact designed to send a collective call to erve the planetary balance by polluting less and encouraging the increased use of non-conventional sources of energy to gradually reduce the hefty reliance on fossil fuels that threatens to bring human-ity on the brink of a likely climate-

reduce the nerty relance on tost reduce the firely heralace of tost manity on the brink of a likely climate-induced apocalypse!

Time and again incredible figures to realise clean energy were trotted out by the international community to help address and minimise the grave existential peril while most of the rich world squirmed and demurred. Presumably so as they were insistent on more action and resources from the emerging and developing economies, which seem to be rising on the development ladder with leaders from the developed world resting on their oars, oblivious to their past depredations of nature by their wasteful consumption of fuels to sustain their luxurious living.

It is against this somber setting that a joint report by the Paris-based International Emergy Agency (IEA) and the private sector lending window of the World Bank, the International Finance Corporation (IFC) in Washington, has come out with another set of astounding arithmetic to fix the evasive and ever slippery issuel Titled 'Scaling Up Private Finance for Clean Energy in Emerging, and Developing Economies', the IEA international Eric private Finance for Clean Energy in Emerging, and Developing Economies' would need to more than double from \$770 billion in 2022 to as much as \$2.8 trillion by 2030 to meet escalating energy requirements and align with the cli-2030 to meet escalating energy requirements and align with the climate goal set out in the Paris Agreement. Without wallowing in otiose words, the report hit the nail

on the head, stating that public investment alone would be insufficient to deliver universal access of energy and tackle climate change; it energy and tackie climate change; asserted that augmented public funding could be used more effectively in partnership with private sector capital to pare project risks, a concept commonly known as blended finance. The report noted that two-thirds of the finance for clean energy projects in emerging developing economies (outside China) would need to come from clean energy projects in emerging developing economies (outside China) would need to come from the private sector as China is a maverick with the state bearing well-night the whole burden! Just how big the resource gap ahead is can be gauged by the grim fact that today's \$135 billion in annual private financing for clean energy in these economies, including India, would need to rise as much as \$1.1 trillion a year within the next decade, a task and feat not feasible in reality, given the resource constraints plaguing the private sector in these countries for other real sector activities to revu growth and register progress. Emphatically flagging off a major risk of many countries around the world being left behind in today's energy world, the report said investment holds the key and sway to ensuring that they benefit from the new global economy that is emerging rapidly. IEA executive director Fatih Birol said. There is a grave need for greater international technical, regulatory and financial support to unlock the potential for clean energy in emerging, and developing economies (EMDE'S). By reinforcing regulatory framework, energy institutions and infrastructure and improved access to finance, this support can help governments overcome obstacles that discourage clean energy out that the battle against climate change will but the battle against climate change will be won in EMDE's, where the potential

battle against climate change will be won in EMDEs, where the potential

for clean energy is strong but the level of investments is lamentably low! In order to address the press ing energy demands and emission reduction goals in EMDEs, the international community must per-force have to mobilise private capi-tal at speed and scale and urgently foster more investable projects, IFC managing director Makhtar Diop said. Rightly, the report pitches for concessional financing for projects that entail newer technologies that have yet to reach scale and are not that entail newer technologies mat have yet to reach scale and are not yet cost-competitive in many mar-kets, such as battery storage, off-shore wind, renewable powered desalination or low emissions in hydrogen or that are in riskier mar-kets. It estimates \$80 billion to \$100 billion of concessional finance would be needed annually by the early 2030s to attract private invest-ment at the scale required for ener-gy transition in emerging and developing economies outside China. There is also ample potential for issuing more green, social, sus-tainable and sustainability-linked bonds, provided that the requisite groundwork for industry guide-lines, harmonised taxonomies and robust third-party certification is laid. The report zeroes in on the robust third-party certification is laid. The report zeroes in on the opportunity in platforms that aggregate and securitise many investments, which could get over the asymmetry between the relatively small size of energy transition projects in emerging and developing economies and the relatively large minimum investment size that major institutional investors require.

The joint report is quite unspar-ing in its criticism of fossil fuel sub-sidies that perpetuate pollution without offering any solution for environmentally sustainable energy

meration. It said forthrightly that a range of cross-cutting policy issues such as fossil fuel subsidies, lengthy licens-ing processes, unclear land use

rights, restrictions on private or for eign ownership and inappropriate pricing policies build barriers to eign ownersing and inappropriate pricing policies build barriers to investment or heighten the cost of clean energy projects. Lifting these barriers would help emerging and developing economies benefit more fully from the opportunities of the new global energy economy, the report put it point-blank. The moot point is whether such a surgical strike on subsidies is politically feasible as the victims would respond at the hustling, in their own harsh ways! Even as subsidy issues remains intractable and a political inder-box, there are always low hanging fruits if conscious and focused attention is made to tap unconventional and unorthodox sources of energy. At a mini conference organised by the IEA in New Delhi with energy experts from G20 nations as India holds the presidency currently, Union Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas Hardeep Singh Puri contended that India would be the epicenter for green hydrogen development with the private sector evincing interest and acquiring large manufacturing large manufacturing large manufacturing the world today have got a tie-up or production units in India. This was endorsed by IEA chief Birol when he remarked that India had the opportunity to become a 'super-power' in the green hydrogen segment with its cheap and abundant renewable energy sources.

Quite often we read and hear about the children of well-off, elite and middle-class families being caught consuming banned substances at pubs. The process of licensing should be stricter and the de-licensing of such entities should be expedited. At the same time, I see an important role for society in checking the menace of drug abuse. Society should boycott drug suppliers



and users. A social ecosystem and users. A social ecosystem should be evolved where the vic-tims of drug abuse should be rehabilitated properly and those behind supplying drugs are socially boycotted. Parents should also be counselled on how to deal with their children and been them away from the and keep them away from the menace of drug abuse. Strong family values will be an asset for us in our fight against drug In the ancient Indian value

system, there was a lot of emphasystem, there was a lot of empha-sis on building the character of children. As a child, our teacher used to make us memorize that if health is lost, something is lost; if the character is lost, everything is lost. Our forefathers were very particular about the characterbuilding of their children. The concept of gurukul was very much rooted in the idea of creating a value-based society, which deals with social evils like drug abuse effectively. Home, school and place of worship are three key components of building a value-based social ecosystem. We need to give serious thought to our ancient ways of addre ing social challenges along with usual but tested means and mechanisms to prevent the spread of any evil, which eats into our vitals.

It is indeed gratifying to see a whole lot of things being done to tackle the challenge of drug abuse and rehabilitate the victims. There is, however, no scope to be complacent and miser in

devoting necessary resources and attention to effectively deal with every aspect of the drug problem. There is a need to fur-ther galvanize all stakeholders to protect our people from drug abuse and break the spine of illicit drug supply chains. The Narcotics Control Bureau should act strictly against drug suppli-ers. Equally important is better coordination between the agen-cies of Central and state govern-ments including police forces in ments including police forces in mounting effective surveillance in vulnerable areas in particular bigger cities and bordering areas

Given the magnitude of the problem of drug abuse, we need to work with a wholesome approach where every stakeholder has a role to play. As per the National Survey on Extent and Pattern of Substance Use in India conducted by the Ministry through AIIMS National Drug Dependence Treatment Centre (NDDTC), Ghaziabad, in 2018, the estimated number of children and adolescents aged 10-17 cren and adolescents aged 10-17 years consuming alcohol, cannabis, opioids, sedatives, inhalants, cocaine, ampheta-mine-type stimulants (ATS) and hallucinogens was pegged at 6.06 per cent, while 24.71 per

can cure the drug adde cent adults aged between 18 and 75 were found to be indulging in drug abuse.

It is a matter of happiness that the Union Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment is implementing a scheme of National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR) under which financial assistance is provided to the State Government and Union Territories Administration for preventive education and awareness generation, capacity building, skill development and vocational training and livelihood support for from drug addicts. During 2021-22, there were as many as 285559 beneficiaries many as 285559 beneficiaries under NAPDDR.

The majority of beneficiaries were from Andhra Pradesh (15,295), Delhi (17,019), Haryana (6940), Himachal Pradesh (12,619), Madhya Pradesh (48,929), Punjab (9,555), Rajasthan (22,103), Telangana (6620), Uttar Pradesh (16503) and West Bengal (7639). Similarly, Nasha Mukt Bharat

Similarly, Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan (NMBA) was launched in August 2020 under which special emphasis is laid on the participation of stakeholders such as women, children, educational institutions, civil society

Four thousand plus Yuva Mandals, Nehru Yuva Kendra (NYKs) and NSS volunteers, Youth Clubs have also been associated with the NMBA. The contribution of over 2.05 crore women has also been vital in reaching out to a larger community through Anganwadi Centres and ASHA workers, APMIs, Mahila Mandals and women SHGS. Over 1.19 lakh educational institutions have conducted activities tutions have conducted activities with students and youth to edu-cate them on substance use under NMBA across the country

till now. As a lot is being done to check the menace of drug abuse, we should have comprehensive dig-ital content to create awareness among people about the reper-cussions of drug abuse.

We can also have related chap-

ters in textbooks and films as well for cautioning the masses against falling into drug traps. The idea is to adopt a whole-some approach not only to check drug abuse but also to rehabili-tate its victims.



Himachal flash floods Hundreds of commuters stranded as Chandigarh-Manali NH blocked

SHIMLA/MANDI, JUN 26: Hundreds of commuters were stranded in Himachal Pradesh's Mandi district as the Chandigarh-Manali national highway was blocked following flash floods and landslides, officials said on Monday.

The 70-km Mandi-Pandoh-Kullu stretch has been badly affected, they said. A total of 301 roads are closed in the state following heavy rains, while 140 power transformers are disrupted. Flash floods were witnessed in Khotinallah near Aut, about 40 km from Mandi town, on the Pandoh-Kullu stretch due to a heavy down-pour and the commuters have been stranded since Sunday evening.

The alternative Mandi-Kullu route via Katola, blocked due to landslide, has been opened after almost 20 hours and small vehicles are now being diverted through this stretch, said the officials of the Mandi administration.

The Mandi-Pandoh stretch was blocked near 6 Miles after a landslide.

The officials said restoration work is underway and explosives are being used to blast heavy boulders blocking

underway and explosives are being used to blast heavy boulders blocking

roads on this stretch. One way traffic is expected to be restored on this stretch

expected to be restored on this stretch in an hour or two, they said. However, rains have started again and reports of landslides are coming from other places in the district. The commuters have been advised

The commuters have been advised not to move towards Mandi until the road is opened, the officials added. "It is a nightmarish experience as we have been stuck here since yesterday evering. There are limited hotels and other accommodations available near-by," said Mohit, a tourist from Chandiard.

other accommodations available near-by," said Mohit, a tourist from Chandigarh.

There are over two km of jam on both the sides even though the police and administration have stopped traf-fic at several points on the stretch as the road is blocked, he added. "We have been struck since last evening as the road is closed. A large number of vehicles are stranded on both sides of the roads at Aut and 6 Miles," said Prashant, a stranded commuter who was returning to Mandi town from Chandigarh. Public Works Department Minister Vikramaditya Singh said as many as 301 roads have been blocked due to heavy rains. Out of these roads, 180 would be

opened by Monday evening, 15 by Tuesday and the remaining by June 30 depending on the weather conditions, Singh told reporters. As many as 390 JCBs, dozers and tip-

pers have been deployed to clear the roads and the department would release a number on which the people can report road related issues by today

evening, he added.

There are about 30 road stretches prone to frequent landslides in the state. So far, during the ongoing monsoon season which started on June 24 the PWD has suffered a loss to the tune of about Rs 27 crore.

On Sunday, Ilash Iloods triggered by a cloudburst in Solan and Hamirpur districts and heavy rains in Shimla, Mandi and Kullu killed two people, damaged crops, homes and vehicles, and washed away livestock.

According to the State Emergency Operation Centre, one person each drowned in Hamirpur and Shimla districts. The rain also damaged 11 houses and several vehicles as well as four cowsheds.

Moderate to heavy rains have also

Moderate to heavy rains have also lashed several parts of Kangra, Mandi and Sirmaur districts.

Dharamshala in Kangra was the wettest with 107 mm of rain followed by Kataula and Bhattiyat 75 mm each, Gohar 67 mm, Mandi 56 mm, Pandoh 50 mm, Poanta Sahib 43 mm, Nagorta Suriyan 39 mm, Kothi 37 mm, Degindermagar 36 mm and Palampur 32.2 mm.

Germany offers to station 4,000 troops in Lithuania to strengthen NATO's eastern flank

BERLIN: Germany is willing to send around 4,000 troops to Lithuania on a permanent basis to strengthen NATO's eastern

permanent basis to strengthen NATO's eastern flank, German Defence Minister Boris Pistorius said during a visit in the Lithuanian capital of Vilnius on Monday.

"Germany is prepared to permanently station a robust brigade in Lithuania," Pistorius said. He said infrastructure and facilities will need to be created to accommodate the soldiers and their families. In response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine early last year, the German government pledged last June to have a combat brigade ready to defend Lithuania in the event of an attack, German news agency DPA reported. Until now, however, there have been differences over whether the soldiers should be permanently stationed in Lithuania or only sent there temporarily for everyeises. only sent there temporarily Lithuanian government has



government for a long time was very reluctant to do that.
Pistorius explained the

Pistorius explained the German government's decision to offer the brigade to Lithuania was not only because of Russia's war on Ukraine, but also because of Germany's own history, saying that until the end of the Cold War, German was the country on NATO's eastern flank.

"We were the ones who could always rely on our NATO partners to stand by us in an emergency and to stand up and fight with us for our freedom and security in Germany," he said. Now, Poland and the Baltic countries are particularly

countries are particularly

exposed, he said.

"We as the Federal Republic of Germany explicitly acknowledge our responsibility and our obligation as a NATO member state, as the largest economy in Europe, to stand up for the protection of the eastern flank," Pistorius said.

Lithuanian President Gitanas Nauseda welcomed the announcement and said his country wants to build up the needed infrastructure by 2026.

"We have a strong political willingness in Lithuania to find the necessary financial resources to be able to finance the infrastructures."

MOSCOW: Wagner mercenaries headed back to their base on Sunday after Russia's President Vladimir Putin agreed to allow their leader to avoid treason charges and accept exile in neighbouring Belarus. The agreement halted an extraordinary crisis – a private army led by Putin's former close ally Yevgeny Prigozhin trying to storm Moscow – but analysts said wagner's revolt had exposed Putin's rule as more fragile than previous-

vaggier's revoir lade exposed Putil's rule as more fragile than previously thought. Security measures were still in place in Moscow on Sunday, though fewer police were visible, and passers-by said they were unconcerned, despite Prigozhin's exact whereabouts remaining unclear. "Of course, I was shaken at the beginning," Ludmilla Shmeleva, 70, told AFP while walking at Moscow's Red Square. "I was not expecting this." "We are fighting, and there is also an internal enemy who is stabbing you in the back, as President Putin said," she said. "But we are walking said." But we are walking said. "But we are walking around, relaxing, we don't

According to a statement issued here, the CM also directed the officials to achieve the government's target of installing tap water connections to every house in Jhansi, Lalitpur, Hamirpur, Jalaun, Banda, Chitrakoot, Mirzapur, Sonbhadra and the entire Vindhya-Bundelkhand region in the next two months.

Before the start of the Jal Jeevan Mission, only 5.16 lakh families had access to piped drinking water. The figure has now crossed 1.3 crore, with 59.38 lakh connections in the financial year 2022-23 alone, the government said. "The monthly tap water installa-



tions in the state rose from 22,714 in April, 2022 to 12.96 lakh connections in May 2023. Currently, 43,000 taps are being installed every day, which needs to be increased to 50,000 daily," the to be increased to 50,000 daily," the statement quoted Adityanath as say-ing. "To meet the targets, the manpow-er should be increased and trained

er should be increased and trained plumbers should be posted in every village without delay. the CM added. Another agenda that was discussed in the meeting is the stilt issue in Bundelkhand. The chief minister asked officials of the Irrigation and Water Resources Department to regularly de-stilt the reservoirs in the region. With a total of 1,027 km river stretch of Ganga flowing through the state, Ultar Pradesh has 27 Ganga

Janpads and 37 Ganga Towns.
