

NIA names handicrafts dealer and Hizb-Ul-Mujahideen worker as 27th accused in fresh charge-sheet

The National Investiga-tion Agency (NIA) has filed the first supplementary chargesheet against one Over Ground Worker of the proscribed terrorist ation Hizb-ul-Muia hideen and a handicrafts dealer as a 27th accused in Jammu and Kashmir

Sopore. The accused has been charged under vari-ous sections of the Indian Penal Code and the Unlawful Activities (Prevention)

Najar, who is a dealer in handicrafts and was based out of Pokhra in Nepal, was arrested by the NIA earlier during the investi-gation of the case.

"Naiar was found to be in Jammu and Kashmir terrorism conspiracy case. Identified as Md. Rafi Najar, a resident of Sopore in Jammu and Kashmir, the chargesheeted accused is a close associate of designated terrorist Imi-tyaz Kundoo alias Fayaz

through Hawala channels and distributed amongst the terrorists operating in the Valley through another chargesheeted over the ground worker," said the NIA.

Lok Sabha passes budget for union territory of J&K amid ruckus over JPC demand

AGENCIES NEW DELHI, MAR 21

Lok Sabha on Tuesday passed a Rs 1.185 lakh crore budget for the financial year 2023-24 for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, amid ruckus by the Opposition over a demand for a Joint Parliamentary Commit-tee probe into the Adani issue.

As soon as the House met again at 2 pm after an adjournment, Rajindra Agrawal, who was chairing the proceedings, asked BJP's Jugal Kishore Sharma to initiate the discussion on the budget for the Union Territory, which is under central rule at present.

Sharma spoke for a minute after which the process to pass the budget was initiated. The budget for Jammu and Kashmir was passed by a voice vote As soon as the House

was passed by a voice vote amid din. Minister of State in the

Finance Ministry, Pankaj Chaudhary, moved the proposals related to the

Union Territory's budget on behalf of Finance Min-ister Nirmala Sitharaman. The bill, which was introduced on Monday, among other things, pro-vided a thrust on housing in rural areas and water tap connections to 18.36 lakh households in Jammu and Kashmir.

"The total budget estimates for the fiscal is Rs 1,18,500 crore, of which developmental expendi-ture is of the order of Rs 41,491 crore," Sitharaman had said in the Budge speech tabled in Lok Sabha.

According to the minis According to the minister, the revenue receipts have been pegged at Rs 1,06,061 crore whereas revenue expenditure was expected to be Rs 77,009 crore, thereby making available revenue surplus for capital expenditure to the tune of Rs 29,052 crore. crore

Dave said the matter be taken up for in April itself prior to the upcoming Karnataka assembly polls.

The bench, meanwhile, appointed two lawyers including Neha Rathi as nodal counsel for ensuring smooth hearing of the PILs, saying they would coordinate to ensure that common compilation of judgements and other records are filed.

The hearing on as many as four PILs, including the nee filed by challenging the electoral bond scheme, was deferred to April II in view of a prior letter circulated by the Centre seeking adjournment on the ground that Solicitor General Tushar Mehta was unavailable.

Earlier, the top court on January 31 had said the three sets of petitions on the electoral bonds scheme, bring-

sets of petitions on the electoral bonds scheme, bring-ing political parties within the ambit of the Right to Information Act and those challenging amendments in the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act will be heard separately.

The court had said it will hear in the third week of

The court had said it will hear in the third week of March the pleas challenging the laws permitting funding of political parties through the electoral bond scheme. Prior to this, the top court had said it will hear in the last week of January, a batch of PLIs challenging laws permitting funding of political parties through the electoral bond scheme.

Electoral bonds have been pitched as an alternative to cash donations made to political parties as part of efforts to bring in transparency in political funding.

Lawyer Bhushan had sought urgent listing of the PIL by the apex court and seeking a direction to the Centre not to open any further window for the sale of electoral bonds during the pendency of a case pertaining to funding of political parties and alleged lack of transparency in their bank accounts.

The NGO, which had filed the PIL on the issue of alleged corruption and subversion of democracy through illicit and foreign funding of political parties and lack of transparency in the bank accounts of all political parties, had moved an interim application in March 2021 before the assembly polls in West Bengal and Assam seeking the sale of electoral bonds should not be reopened.

On Jamary 20, 2020, the apex court had refused to not be reopened.

On January 20, 2020, the apex court had refused to grant interim stay on the 2018 Electoral Bonds Scheme and sought responses of the Centre and the Election nission to an interim application by the NGO seek ing a stay on the scheme

ing a stay on the scheme.

The government notified the Electoral Bond Scheme on January 2, 2018.

According to the provisions of the scheme, electoral bonds may be purchased by a person who is a citizen of India or incorporated or established in India. An individual can buy electoral bonds, either singly or jointly with other individuals.

Only political parties registered under Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 and which secured not less than one per cent of votes polled in the last general election to Lok Sabha or the Legislative Assembly of the state are eligible to receive electoral bonds.

According to the notification, electoral bonds shall be encashed by an eligible political party only through an account with an authorised bank.

The apex court had in April 2019 also declined to stay the Electoral Bond Scheme and made it clear that it will accord an in-depth hearing on the pleas as the Centre and the EC have raised "weighty issues" having Centre and the EC have raised "weighty issues" having "tremendous bearing on the sanctity of the electoral

process in the country".

The Centre and the EC had earlier taken contrary stands in the court over political funding, with the government wanting to maintain anonymity of the donors and the poll panel batting for revealing their names for the sake of transparency. (Agencies)

wind of change is apparently blowing in Jammu and Kashmir after the abrogation of Article 370 and restoration of normalcy, to some extent, thereafter. The proposed opening of a mega shopping mall and an IT tower in Kashmir Valley's Srinagar by a UAE-based group is a perfect example of it and it needs to be welcomed by all. The credit of it should go to the UT administration, especially Lieutenant Governor who has assured allocation of land within 15 days of the submission of any proposal as the investors feel that J&K has a favourable ecosystem for investors and they can do their businesses without any hindrance. The Jammu and Kashmir administration claims it has received investment proposals from 5,000 domestic and foreign companies within 22 months of implementation of the new industrial policy, with 45 units starting their operations last month. A steel processing plant is coming up at Pulwama in south Kashmir. J&K has also caught attention because of the large discoveries of lithium. India could potentially have the third largest reserves of the prized metal after Chile and Australia. Fuelling economic growth could be the most transformative confidence-building measure in the troubled region, bringing relief to the unemployed youth and giving a fillip to development. A record 1.8 crore tourists visited Jammu and Kashmir in a year; there's been a huge reduction in every kind of violence. It has prompted the opposition parties to raise questions about the delay in conduct of assembly polls in Jammu and Kashmir. In fact, at a time when the might of power and ssociated noise are allowed to replace the spirit of meaningful conversations and dialogue, and the constant flow of non-reflexive and often irresponsible remarks and comments through press conferences, social media and television channels pollute our mental landscape, it is not easy to be thoughtful, contemplative and truly argu-

mentative.

Yet, as I feel, those who refuse to see themselves as passive spectators of this absurd game
of lies and propaganda are endowed with a
heavy responsibility. They ought to overcome
their silence, communicate with the new generation, and inspire them to distinguish the practice

To take a contemporary example, if you demand an inquiry into the dramatic rise of industrialist Gautam Adani in the Narendra Modi era and associated tales of corporate malpractices, you associated tales of corporate malpractices, you are by no means defaming your country. In fact, your critique reveals your genuine concern for the country.

Or, for that matter, if as a teacher, amid the resence of foreign students Levolve a sharp cripresence of foreign students I evolve a sharp cri-tique of the violence of caste, patriarchy and reli-gious bigotry still prevalent in our country, I am by no means defaming or conspiring against my country; instead, I am serving the dharma of a seeker of truth. However, what goes on these days as loud, non-thinking, demonstrative patri-otism (I mean saying 'yes' to everything the rul-



ing regime does and prescribes, and criminalis ing all dissenting voices) diminishes the spirit of mature, confident and responsible citizenship. And this indicates the possibility of the ultimate danger: the degeneration of democracy into some sort of electoral autocracy.

Second, let the new generation, intoxicated by demagogues and their loud slogans, be reminded time and again that there is no virtue in the militancy of hyper-nationalism. Instead, it is militancy of hyper-nationalism. Instead, it is pathological; it limits our mental horizons and restricts our thinking; it robs us of our creativity; and above all, it fears the liberating power of self-critique. With the madness of hyper-nationalism, we tend to legitimise authoritarianism, militarism, surveillance and the cult of narcissism. It is, therefore, not surprising that the politics of hyper-nationalism fears even the slightest trace of dissent, promotes blind conformity, or moral/intellectual dumbness, and continually breeds conspiracy theories (i.e. the nation is in danger).

inger). To take some striking illustrations from history, Italian philosopher Antonio Gramsci truly served the struggling masses of Italy, even though hyper-nationalist and authoritarian Benito Mussolini saw him as a threat, and sent

him to jail.

Or, for that matter, it is not Russian President Vladimir Putin, but those courageous souls taking an anti-war position and raising their voice who are genuinely serving humanity. Likewise, the US was enriched by Noam Chomsky's critical voice rather than the madness of Trumpism. And who knows that possibly the entire 'tukde-tukde' gang (an abuse coined by the ruling

regime to castigate its critics) is serving Indian people more than the troll army, or those shiny television anchors who are never tired of spreading hatred and divisiveness in the name of 'prime time' debates? Yes, let it be stated boldly: the ethos of pro-people/life-affirming/self-critical patriotism is one thing, and the noise of intellectually dull and spiritually impoverished busen actions in the control of the cont hyper-nationalism is quite another.

And finally, you do not need a Rahul Gandhi

And finally, you do not need a Rahul Gandhi to defame India in foreign countries. In this globally connected world, the concerned citizens of foreign countries know everything about the sad story: say, India's steady decline in the global democracy index. You cannot fool everybody by saying that everything is fine here because the BJP continues to win the elections, and Modi's popularity remains intact.

In fact, it is high time we realised the value of reasoned debate and dialogue in culture, politics and education. We should not forget that the spirit of the freedom struggle was filled with this

spirit of the freedom struggle was filled with this spirit of debate and dialogue. Rabindranath spirit of debate and dialogue. Rabindranath Tagore didn't hesitate to disagree with Mahatma Gandhi on the efficacy of the non-cooperation movement. And BR Ambedkar didn't spare Gandhi as far as the caste question was concerned. But then, Gandhi, despite his mass appeal and charisma, didn't castigate Tagore or Ambedkar as 'anti-national'. In fact, the entire nation grew and evolved out of this spirited dialogue. Xi firmly at the helm amid China's tough times

HE plenary sessions of the 14th National People's Congress (NPC) — China's version of a parliament — and the 14th Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC), China's top political advisory body, which concluded on March 13, were, as anticipated, a success for President XI limine.

Xi Jinping.

The 2,952 NPC deputies unanimously re-elected Xi for a third term as the President of China. In his first as the President of China. In his first speech after the NPC session, Xi exulted that he was honoured to be elected to "the lofty office of President". He also claimed to have lifted the people out of poverty and wiped out the centuries of humiliation they had suffered.

Xi is the first leader to be the head of state of the People's Republic of China (PRC) for so long. Even its 'Great Helmsman' Mao Zedong was Chairman for less than five years. By

'Great Helmsman' Mao Zedong was Chairman for less than five years. By also endorsing Xi's loyalists as state councillors, members of the Central Military Commission and in all top appointments, the NPC and CPPCC plenums solidified Xi's authority over the party and government apparatus and confirmed that Xi has established himself as the unrivalled pre-eminent leader of the PRC. To reinforce that message, China's official media, including the Global Times,

acclaimed (March 12): "Xi Jinping's unanimous election as Chairman of the Central Military Commission has greatly inspired and motivated the whole party, the whole army and the whole nation to embark on a new

One key appointment was that of former Shanghai Party Secretary and long-time Xi associate Li Qiang as long-time Xi associate Li Qiang as Premier. Though there were three 'nos' and eight abstentions in his elec-tion, this would have been because he complied with Politburo member Sun Chunlan's instructions to implement the centre's stringent 'zero-Covid' policy and locked down Shanghai for three months. Having been Governor and party secretary of Zhejiang, Jiangsu and Shanghai – three of China's wealthiest provinces – Li Qiang, however, has the credentials for the position of Premier where his task will be to revive the

primary task will be to revive une country's economy. Interesting was the appointment of former Politburo Standing Committee member Han Zheng as PRC vice-president in place of Wang Qishan, who retired. Han Zheng has

not been regarded as particularly close to Xi and his elevation may indi-cate an element of compromise. It may have been a move intended to keep the discontented Jiang Zemin faction from creating complications in faction from creating complications in the months ahead. In any event, the post of PRC vice-president is not powerful. Chinese observers have suggested that Li Qiang's appoint-ment could also help assuage this group.

It keeps the spotlight on security and development and significant is its emphasis on the 'unpredictable' and 'grim' difficulties that lie ahead for China. Echoing Xi Jinping's warnings of the past some months, it warned of the probability of 'black swan' and 'grey rhinocros' events. Anticipating problems ahead, Li Keqiang urged China to ear un for toucher times. China to gear up for tougher times. Another indicator of the economic difficulties was the announcement that the number of central government employees would be reduced by 5 per cent. In his first press confer-ence after the NPC on March 13, the ence after the NPC on March 13, the new Premier, I. [Jojan, too was cau-tious about the economy and said achieving the 5 per cent CDP gowth target would be difficult as the base was high. The report, which outlines China's goals and priorities for the next five years, made it clear that the economy, security and agriculture economy, security and agriculture would be the priorities. Predictably, all their budgets were increased along with that of science and technology, China's another key priority.



try.
Shoulder strengthening exercises: If you build strong, tight shoulders, the area of your back beneath the shoulders (especially near your bra line) starts to

Front raise, Dumbbell Upright row etc will help you to build strong shoul-

ders.
Mid-back exercises: The Mid-back exercises: Ihe wing-shaped muscles in the middle of your back are called the latissimus dorsi. If you can make these two muscles tighter and stronger, they give your waist the appearance of being smaller. Chin ups, lat pulldown etc are good exercises to strengthen the lats and create a toned, tri-

angular shape.

Waist exercises: If you want to whittle the back of your waist, try doing exercises that strengthen the obliques and also the erector spinae, the muscles that run along the spine. These muscles help contour the muscles help contour the sides of your body and help it bend from side to side. Cable Woodchop will help to taper and strength-en the sides of your body. You can also do Russian twists on the floor to target the oblique abdominals. the oblique abdominals.

Lower back exercises: Slouching makes back fat more noticeable. To stand taller and promote better posture, do lower back exercises to strengthen the core, including the erector spinae. Superman exercise will help to target these

A nutritionist with type 1 diabetes shares the top 5 'food swaps' she eats to manage her blood sugar



ore than 11% of Americans have diabetes, which occurs when the pancreas does not produce enough insulin to regulate blood sugar levels.

As a nutritionist who has been living with type 1 diabetes for 30 years, I've found that having diabetes doesn't having diabetes doesn't mean you have to com-pletely stop eating what you enjoy. Managing blood sugar is often more about making small food swaps, or adding, rather than eliminating certain swaps, or adding, rather than eliminating, certain foods.

For example, you can still eat carbs, but you also need to add protein, a small amount of healthy a small amount of healthy fats and plenty of fiber. Protein, fat and fiber all moderate how quickly food is digested, which is helpful in balancing blood sugar levels. Here are the foods I eat — and the foods I ty to cut back on — to help manage my diabetes:

1. Bean-based or vegetable pasts

etable pasta

Wheat-based pasta is Wheat-based pasta is mostly carbohydrates, and it can lead to a blood sugar spike if eaten in large portions on its own. Instead, I'll opt for bean-based pasta or a vegetable pasta. Turning vegetables (e.g., carrots, zucchini and sweet pota-toes) into noodles using a spiralizer is a great way to increase your fiber and vitamin intake.

role in it causing delay in tabling of the budget in the House," Mr Jha said. Assembly Speaker Ram Niwas Goyal called for a voice vote and thereafter the matter was referred to the privileges committee. Finance Minister Kailash Gehlot told the Assembly that he learnt around 2 pm on Monday that the MHA had raised some queries. "I asked the chief secretary and the finance secretary several times and

finally around 6 pm, I saw the file and

A metropolitan magistrate's court had in March 2022 issued a summons to Ms Banerjee on a complaint filed by local BJP office-bearer Vivekanand Gupta. Mr Gupta claimed in the complaint that Ms Banerjee, during a func-tion at the Yashwantrao Chavan Auditorium in December tion at the Yashwantrao Chavan Auditorium in December 2021, remained seated when the national anthem began, and later stood up and sang two verses before stopping abruptly and leaving the venue. The West Bengal chief minister challenged the issuance of summons before a special court for cases against MFs and MLAs. In January 2023, special judge RN Rokade set aside the summons on procedural grounds and asked the magistrate to consider Gupta's complaint afresh. Ms Baneriee, in her plea before the high court, contended that the special court should have unashed the summons once and for all, and not have quashed the summons once and for all, and not remanded the case back to the magistrate.

"Serious Shortcomings": CBI Wants Red Notice Against Mehul Choksi Restored

NEW DELHI: The CBI has asked an Interpol body to restore the Red Notice against fugitive dia-Red Notice against fugitive diamantaire Mehul Choksi, saying its decision to drop his name from the list was based on mer 'imaginary conjunctures and unproven surmises' and had serious shortcomings, overreach of mandate and mistakes.

Red Notice is the highest level of alert by the 195-member strong International Police cooperation organisation Interpol to locate and provisionally arrest a fugitive pending extradition, surrentive pending extradition, surrenties.

tive pending extradition, surren-

der, or similar legal action. In a statement on Tuesday, the In a statement on Tuesday, the Central Bureau of Investigation(CBI) said the Commission for Control of Interpol's Files (CCF) removed Mr Choksi's name from the Red Notice list in November 2022. The removal of the notice means Mr Choksi can freely travel out of Antigua and Barbuda where he is holed up after fleeing from India in 2018. The statement was issued by the CBI a day after the media by the CBI a day after the media reported the CCF decision that

came as a setback to Indian investigating agencies and triggered a huge political uproar.

Based on repeated appeals from Mr Choksi, who is wanted in the ? 13,000 crore bank fraud in Punjab National Bank, the CCF Punjab National Bank, the CCF removed his name from the Red Notice list in November 2022, it said. The statement said the CBI has taken up with CCF the seri-ous shortcomings, procedural violations, overreach of mandate and mistakes committed by CCF unfounded and perfunctory deci-

Based on new information and

Based on new information and serious errors in the decision, the CBI is taking steps for the decision of CCF to be revised, the agency said.

"The CBI continues to exercise available remedial and appellate options within INTERPOL for rectification of this faulty decision and for restoration of Red Notice." The CCF has subsequently clarified to the CBI that quently clarified to the CBI that its decision "in no manner has any determination on any guilt or

innocence of Choksi" for crimes he remains charged in India, the agency added.

The CCF which had removed Mr Choksi's name from the list of Mr Choksi's name from the list of fugitives based on his appeal last year is a separate Interpol body which is "not under the control" of the Interpol Secretariat and is mainly staffed by elected lawyers from different countries where people can challenge decisions to declare them fugitives, the CBI statement said

statement said.

The Congress hit out at the Union government over the CCF decision, saying while the Opposition was being targeted by the Enforcement Directorate(ED) and the CBI, its "friend" was

and the CBI, its "friend" was being let off. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said talk of patriotism by those giving "pro-tection" to such people is a "joke". In a tweet, former Congress chief Rahul Gandhi said, "Vipaksh ko ED, CBI, Mitr ko rihaai" (ED, CBI for the Opposition, let off for friend)." They are doing things to divert "They are doing things to divert attention from real issues. Our

embassies are being attacked. People who have run away with money from banks, Mehul Choksi, those giving protection to such people talk about patriotism, it is a joke." Mr Kharge told reporters. The CCF which had rejected two previous appeals of Mr Choksi - in 2018, to not publish his name on the Red Notice list and in 2020, to remove his name from the list -agreed with his fresh plea in 2022, a year after an alleged abduction attempt from Antigua and Barbuda, the agency said.
