He asked them to establish dedicated enforcement teams in each circle to ensure proper monitoring and surveillance of the consumers. The Principal Secretary, PDR, Bajesh Prasad in his pre-sentation stated that the Department has formulated plan to reduce ARS Closses to 41% from current 49% during the comping financial year which would further be decreased to 20% till financial year 2025-26. # Upgrading infra to meet growing challenge of China

fter being granted the status of Union Territory, Ladakh has seen a major push in infrastructural development. A serious efforts have been made to match the infrastructure of the arid region with the hostile neighbours. There are not only infrastructure challenges in border areas of Ladakh but poor telecom connectivity has also remained a major issue in the arid region. The habitations are sparsely located that made it difficult for the administration to cover the entire population with mobile connectivity till date. It is a wellknown fact that there are still hundreds of villages and hamlets in Ladakh which have remained deprived of mobile facility. These areas in Leh and Kargil districts have not been provided mobile facility till date because private telecom operators remained reluctant to expand their base in the region due to high operational cost and less returns. Consequently, the people in remote areas of Ladakh are still lagging behind in developmental activities. The region also shares its boundaries with two hostile nations - China and Pakistan and two nations have connived together to foment trouble in the otherwise peaceful region. Having said this, it becomes imperative for the government to have better connectivity in Ladakh from a strategic point of view. On Saturday, Union Telecom and Communications Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said all areas in Ladakh would get 4G and 5G services after the towers are installed. He revealed that the government would install around 500 mobile towers in Ladakh to boost communication and 5G internet services in the region. The announcement is a welcome but much-needed step to defeat the nefarious designs of two hostile neighbours. Strategically, it would help the Government of India to counter China's massive infrastructure move including installation of mobile towers near the Line of Actual Control (LAC). If the local population is to be believed, China has installed multiple mobile towers close to the LAC but Ladakhis are facing mobile and internet connectivity issues. Since 2020, the army has made a massive troop induction in Ladakh region to match the number of Chinese soldiers deployed along the LAC. A protracted stand-off has continued along LAC since May 2020 after the Galwan clashes, in which 20 Indian soldiers were killed in action and several Chinese soldiers were also killed. But the mobile network for locals and troops deployed in various parts of Ladakh has remained a problem. The Government of India should regularly monitor the progress to be made on improving telecom connectivity in Ladakh if it is really serious about dealing with the growing challenge of aggressive China in the region. The neighbouring country has already build a huge infra along the borders with India and it is aggressively moving, though inch by inch, to bring strategically important areas of the region under it's control. The need is to stop China from its future misadventures for peace in Asia.

I was felicitated at Platform No. 8 upon the conclusion of our 455-km journey on the semi-high speed Vande Bharat Express train between the Solapur station and the CSMT. It is a matter of pride for me that I got to operate the train just a month after it was launched by the Prime Minister on February 10.

Prime Minister on February 10. Just days earlier, on the occasion of International Women's Day, I had the opportunity to drive the Mumbai-Pune Deccan Queen Express with an all-women crew. However, this was not the first time I had successfully completed the feat. It was on March 8, 2011, when I became the first woman train driver to nut the Deccan Oueen train driver to run the Deccan Queen from Pune to the CSMT. In 2017, I drove a ladies' special suburban train on Women's Day. Then, in 2018, I ran the Deccan Queen from Mumbai to Pune. In 2020, an all-women crew,

Pune. In 2020, an all-women crew, including myself, piloted the Mumbai-Lucknow Pushpak Express on Women's Day. But it was in 1989 that I first script-ed history by becoming the first female train driver in India. In the beginning, I was not even aware that no other woman had done that before. I just call it my good fortune

that I got to become the first one. If it would not have been me, it would be would not have been me, it would be someone else. It might have taken some more years, but some woman had to do it one day anyway. After all, back in the day, women were already flying planes. So, why not trains?

I had undergone training for oper-ating the newly introduced Vande Bharat at ZETC-Vadodara in Gujarat in February this year. Be it a goods train, a suburban train or a mail train, we are always trained beforehand. We are familiarised with the electrical, mechanical and electronic equip-ment, among other things. We are taught how to operate the locomotive. One has to be alert at all times. Signal observance is a key and indispensable part of the job. Be it inclement weath-er or a thick layer of fog, you must be very alert when it comes to the signal. The Vande Bharat Express is just like a local train. In trains such as the Deccan Queen and Pushpak Express, the locomotive is courbed with the cal, mechanical and electronic equipthe locomotive is coupled with the rake, and the train is then ready to leave the station. But everything is in

leave the station. But everything is in that same rake in Vande Bharat. I was the first in whatever I did. As a goods train driver, I was the first As a motor woman also, I was the first to drive a suburban train. In Asia, I drove the first local train. I believe that no field is male-dom-ined if only use women chose to set

inated if only we women choose to set foot in that field. It is not like some-



Journey of many firsts

one has said that we women are not one has said that we women are not welcome in a particular profession. The buck stops with us women. It is up to us to take that step and explore that field. I did not venture into this profession worrying about the possibility of facing discrimination. In fact, I have never faced discrimination throughout my career. Once I have my work cut out, I just focus on mak-

ing sure that it is done

Notably, the number of women drivers has also been on the rise. Currently, there are about 1,500 women drivers in India. And in our Mumbai division of Central Railways alone, there are 50 women, myself included included.

I must admit that as a child who hailed from Satara in western Maharashtra, I never had any dream of becoming a loco pilot. Even though

I had a thing for trains as a child, I never aspired to become a train driv-er myself. I had planned to pursue higher education in mathematics and a BEd degree as I wanted to become a teacher. But as fate would have it, I chanced upon an advertisement by the Indian Railways for the recruit-ment of an assistant loco pilot in 1986.

I started driving goods' trains in 1996, and went on to drive local trains when I was promoted as a motor-woman in 2000. I was appointed as a Ghat driver in 2010, and was elevated as an Express Mail driver the follow-ing year. I also earned the distinction of becoming the first loco pilot of a ladies' special local train for Central

I underwent training at the Motorman Training School in Kalyan for six moths. After 1 was finally appointed on February 13, 1989, as an existent driver, there have been no assistant driver, there has been no looking back. Railways in 2000. I have also served as a senior instructor at the Motorman Training School.

I have had the honour of bagging many state and national-level awa over the years, including the muchcoveted First Ladies Award. This one was special as it was given away by then President Ram Nath Kovind at

then President Ram Nath Kovind at Rashtrapati Bhavan in 2018. Having completed 34 years of serv-ice, I can proudly say that I still main-tain an immaculate record. I am set to hang up my boots in 2025. To all the youngsters out there, I would just say there, if you are presimpte about this: this: if you are passionate about something, you must not be afraid to pursue it.

# **Pakistan PM Shehbaz Sharif Accuses President Arif Alvi Of Being Partisan**

MUMBAI, MAR 26: Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday hit back at President Arif Alvi, accusing him of being partisan and following the dictates of his Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party instead of gramining anything to the instead of remaining neutral as the head of the state.

His comments came two days after President Alvi in a letter or after President Alvi in a letter on Friday accused the premier of using disproportionate force against politicians, political work-ers and journalists in recent clashes with former prime minister Imran Khan's PTI. The president who was a mem-

The president, who was a mem-ber of Khan's party before assum-ing the office, had also asked Sharif to direct all authorities to assist the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) in holding the Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa elections as

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa elections as per the orders of the Supreme Court. In his five-page letter to President Alvi, Sharif said that he was writing to "set the record of the government straight" and bring the latter's "partisan atti-tude" on record. bring tude" on record.

He said Alvi's communication in The said AIV's communication in parts read like "a press release of the opposition political party PTI whose one-sided, anti-government views you continue to openly espouse, notwithstanding your constitutional oath/office of President ". He said that the presi-



dent on several occasions violated his oath, including the order of the his oath, including use over a ma-dissolution of the National Assembly in April last year on direction of then prime minister Imran Khan, and also his failure to discharge his constitutional duty to give oath to Sharif on his election a the nime minister. the prime ministe

"Despite the foregoing and sev-eral other instances, where you actively worked towards undermining a constitutionally elected government, I have made all-out efforts to maintain a good working relationship with you. However, the contents of your letter, its tone, and language have compelled me to respond to it," he stated in the letter.

Sharif said that actions by the

law enforcement agencies we re in accordance with the law.

"Regrettably and ostensibly due to your party allegiance, you have failed to note the sheer violation of failed to note the sheer violation of laws, contumacious disregard of court orders, attacking the law enforcement agencies, damaging public property, attempts to create chaos, civil and political unrest, and in short, to bring the country to the brief of composite default to the brink of economic default and civil war by PTI," he said.

He said the agencies complete disregard of law tarnished the image of Pakistan in the international community and cast negative repercussions on the future of democracy and state of human

rights. He also complained that Alvi as president had not once said any-thing regarding the conduct of Khan for his "aggressive, rather militant, attitude of a political

At least 25 people were killed and dozens of others were injured in Mississippi as the massive storm ripped through average lucens on its bourdows

through several towns on its hour-long path. One man was killed after his trailhome flipped several times in Alabama. Search and recovery crews on Alahama. Search and recovery crews on Sunday resumed the daunting task of digging through the debris of flattened and battered homes, commercial build-ings and municipal offices after hun-dreds of people were displaced. Federal Emergency Management Agency Administrator Deame Criswell was scheduled to visit the state on Sunday to evaluate the destruction

Sunday to evaluate the destruction. FEMA Coordinating Officer John Boyle has been appointed to oversee federal

recovery operations. Following Biden's declaration, federal funding can be used for recovery efforts including temporary housing, home repairs, loans covering uninsured prop-erty losses and other individual and business programs, the White House said in a statement. The twister flattened entire blocks, obliterated houses, ripped a steeple off a church and toppled a municipal water tower.

Even with recovery just starting, the National Weather Service warned of a National Weather Service warned of a risk of more severe weather Sunday – including high winds, large hail and possible tornadoes – in eastern Louisiana, south central Mississippi and south central Alabama. Based on early data, the tornado received a preliminary EF-4 rating, the National Weather

# What Are Tactical Nuclear Weapons, Why Is Russia Stationing Them In Belarus Amid Ukraine War?

MOSCOW: In a fresh challenge to Ukraine and its Western partr Ukraine and its Western partners, Russian President Vladimir Putin on Saturday announced that Russia would station tactical nuclear weapons in neighbouring Belarus. Balarus is one of the closest Russian allies. The country also served as a staning ground of the

served as a staging ground of the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. Initially, one of the Russian attacking forces entered Ukraine from Belarus.

Ukraine from Belarus. Stationing nuclear weapons in Belarus would mean that Russian weapons would be next door to three North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) countries as Belarus shares borders with the NATO countries of Latvia, Lithuania, and Poland. Putin's announcement comes at

Putin's announcement comes at a time when the West has stepped up its support to Ukraine. Poland and fellow NATO member and tellow NATO member Slovakia have announced they would send MiG-29 fighter jets to Ukraine and United Kingdom announced earlier this to provide Ukraine with armour-piercing rounds containing depleted urani-

Putin said that Russian placement of nuclear weapons in Belarus is perfectly fine and compliant to international norms. Putin also compared the station-ing of Russian nuclear weapons in Ukraine to US deployment of weapons in military bases in ally countries ntries

However, the immediate reason cited by Putin for stationing nuclear weapons in Belarus was the UK's decision this week to prothe UK's decision this week to pro-vide Ukraine with armour-pierc-ing rounds containing depleted uranium. He falsely claimed that the rounds have nuclear compo-nents. Putin argued that by deploying its tatcial nuclear weapons in Belarus, Russia was following the lead of the United States, notire that the US weapons States, noting that the US weapons are based in Belgium, Germany, Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, and Turkey. He said, "We are doing



usey nave been doing for decades, stationing them in certain allied countries, preparing the launch platforms and training their crews. We are going to do the same thing."

Putin said Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko has long asked for the nuclear weapons as a counter to NATO. He noted that Russia helped modernise Belarusian military aircraft last Belarusian military aircraft last year to make them capable of car-rying nuclear warheads. He said 10 such planes were ready to go. He said nuclear weapons also could be launched by the Iskander short-range missiles that Russia provid-ed to Belarus last year range missiles that Russia provid-ed to Belarus last year. What are tactical nuclear weapons?

Nuclear weapons, just like other

weapons, can be categorised into two types – strategic and tactical. Strategic weapons refer to

weapons that have bigger objec-tives, such as destroying clies or larger targets with larger war-wag-ing objectives in mind. Tactical weapons, on the other hand, are limited in their scope and the intention behind their usage is lim-ited to arriving at a particular bat-tlefied outcome. An example of a

For example, an example of a tactical nuclear weapon would be its use to stop adversary's progress in a particular theatre. On the contrary, strategic nuclear weapons would likely be used to bring the enemy to its knees entirely with a massive strike like the United Massive strike like the United States did in World War II when its nuclear weapons forced Japanese surrender. This would mean that the two

nuclear weapons are classified such as per their intent, yield, and range. More formally, tactical nuclear weapons are called "non-strategic nuclear weapons". "Tactical (non-strategic) nuclear weapons (TkWs) typically refer to short-range weapons, including land-based missiles with a range of

land-based missiles with a range of less than 500 km (about 300 miles)

and air- and sea-launched weapons with a range of less than 600 km (about 400 miles)...In some respects, TNWs are more danger-ous than strategic weapons.

JAMMU/SRINAGAR, MARCH 26: A total of 874 ASHAs (Accredited Social Health JAMMU/SRINAGAR, MARCH 26: A total of 874 ASHAs (Accredited Social Health Activists) of NHM, accoss J&K appeared in NIOS Theory Examination for Certification by National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), which was con-ducted at all India Level today. The theory Examination was conducted by NIOS in seven dis-tricts of J&K Jammu, Kathua, Udhampur, Ananthag, Budgam,

Udhampur, Anantnag, Budgam, Kulgam and Kupwara in the designated Centres

ignated Centres. In the UT of J&X, 61% ASHAs of J&K have been certified by NIOS, which is proportionately the highest in the country. MD, NHM J&K, Ayushi Sudan, while giving details informed that the certification of ASHAs has been envisaged to provide a legal and administrative framework within which the ASHA would be within which the ASHA would be eligible and responsible for pro-viding community level care for a viding community level care for a range of illnesses. This would enhance the competency and pro-fessional credibility of ASHAs, allow her to use a set of drugs and point of care diagnostics appro-priate to that level of care and also

provide an assurance to the com-munity on the quality of services being provided by the ASHA. Above all, it would promote a sense of self recognition and worth within the ASHA, Ayushi added. She informed that at pres-ent, about 11263 ASHAs have bean trained in all modules and been trained in all modules and various schemes and about 70% of these trained ASHAs are NIOS these trained ASHAs are NIOS certified. The remaining ASHAs are being trained in all the mod-ules and further shall be certified in a phased manner. Since NIOS has started online registrations now and eased the registrations now and eased the registrations process, the department is target-ing that 1000-1500 ASHAs get trained during every session for

ASHA certification project is a Govt. of India initiative and third level of quality in ASHA & their cadres as they deal with all the National Health Programmes for Pregnant ladies, vaccinations, communicable diseases, Tuberculosis, Leprosy etc. There is a tripartite arrangement between the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), National Health Systems Resource Centre (NHSRC) and the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) to undertake the process of certification of ASHAs. ASHAs undergo ten days' rigorous resi-dential training schedule at dis-tict training sites along with prac-tical and skill testsfor appearing in final theory assumination for certi-Welfare (MoHFW), National final theory examination for certi-fication at All India Level. This fication at All India Level.
