# **Canine on prowl!**

"t is good to see that the UT administration has committed to change the landscape of all major towns and cities of Jammu and Kashmir, But unfortunately little has been done so far to address the problem of stray dogs. The canine menace has become more grim in Jammu and Kashmir with an average nearly 50 cases of dog bite being reported every day in the Union Territory during the last four years. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare had recently claimed that there were 64,300 animal bite cases across Jammu and Kashmir from the year 2019 to till July 22 last year. "As many as 29,263 cases of attacks by stray dogs were reported in 2019 while this number was 18,764 in 2020 and 4947 during the year 2021. There has been a steep rise in the number of animal bite cases as 11326 such incidents have been reported across J&K till July 22 this year," the ministry had said in a document tabled in the Parliament. There had been a lack of district-level initiatives for sterilisation of the stray dogs that has led to multiple incidents of pedestrians and two-wheeler riders becoming victims of stray dog bites across Jammu and Kashmir. Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) officials believed, the approximate stray dog population within municipal limits is between 45,000 to 50,000.M The civic body had decided to work on a two-pronged strategy of Animal Birth Control (ABC) and Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) to effectively control the stray dog population, reduce the incidence of dog bites, and also to curb the spread of rabies," sources said. The civic body has entered into an agreement with a Delhi-based veterinary agency M/s Friendicoes-SECA to carry out the ABC-ARV programme in all JMC's 75 wards. The agency has been given permission for Animal Birth Control by the Animal Welfare Board of India. The need of the hour is that the civic body should take all stakeholders especially local citizens on board while formulating a strategy to deal with the menace of stray dogs. It is the responsibility of the people of the people to shoulder their responsibility so that the population of stray dogs is brought down.

# DESPITE DOWNSIDES, ECONOMY SET TO DELIVI

WITH THE GLOBAL ECONOMY OFFERING NO HELP AND AGRICULTURE THREATENING TO LET THE ECONOMY DOWN. THE FOCUS IS ON WHAT THE MANUFACTURING AND SERVICES SECTORS CAN DELIVER. TILL NOW, PUBLIC SECTOR INVESTMENT IN INFRASTRUCTURE HAS CARRIED THE CAN OF DELIVERING DEMAND. BUT IT CAN'T BE EXPECTED TO CONTINUE THE IQUIRNEY BY ITSELE

IN the new financial year, India is contemplating growth prospects which are stable but do not give rise to a gung-ho mood. This is because there are several downside risks which have to be countered while relying on the inherent strengths which have enabled strengths which have enabled India to become the fastest-growing major economy in the world. In the government's own words, 'downside risks." dominate upside risks." The government has reiterated its expectation that the economy will grow by 6.5 per cent, even as the IMF's latest World Economic Cuttlook has lowered its forecast

Outlook has lowered its forecast for the current year by 20 basis points to 5.9 per cent. The World Bank, on the other hand, has come Bank, on the other hairu, has come up with a slightly better figure of 6.3 per cent.

The reasons behind the optimism being guarded are manifold.

nism being guarded are manifold. Foremost is that the downside facing the global economy remains powerful, with the World Economic Outlook foreseeing global growth to touch 3 per cent, which is a small improvement on the 2.8 per cent clocked in 2023.

the 2.8 per cent clocked in 2023.

A key reason for the global growth prospects being lacklustre is the way the oil prices are going. The OPEC has cut production, which has caused oil prices to rise in April from the lows that prevailed in the previous month. So long as the Ukraine war continues, global commodity prices will remain volatile, with oil prices on the coine down below a noint because going down below a point because of OPEC's manipulation of output. The second source of headwinds

The second source of headwinds from the rest of the world is the financial crisis that has gripped major developed economics after the collapse of Silicon Valley Bank in the US and the resultant turmoil engulfing Credit Suisse, requiring it to be taken over. This turmoil will continue to impede the smooth flow of foreign investment into the flow of foreign investment into the country. Things will not be helped by US policy rates remaining high by US policy rates remaining high and offering an incentive to investors to earn good returns from government bonds instead of taking a risk and investing in emerging economies. But despite these headwinds from across the seas, the biggest uncertainty and risk facing the economy lies within the country



itself — the uncertainty over the monsoon prospects. Severe heat-waves have already hit the country, ratcheting up vegetable prices. Food prices are also high and there is no knowing where they will go if the monsoon fails. Ging by the the monsoon fails. Going by the record of the last few years, the time is ripe for El Nino to strike, doing its bid to send the monsoon

haywire.

With the global economy offering no help and agriculture threatening to let the economy down, all
eyes are focused on what the manufacturing and services are able to
deliver. Till now, public sector
investment in infrastructure has
certified, the can of delivering carried the can of delivering demand, but it cannot be expected to continue the journey by itself. to continue the journey by itself.

The government is laying great store by private sector investment picking up and delivering the impetus needed to promote judicious economic growth.

Private sector investment has become all the more crucial as private consumption expenditure has

vate consumption expenditure has, till now, failed to deliver. Be it in housing, automobiles, two-wheel-ers or mobile phones, the top end of markets are seeing a robust demand, with the rest of the mardemand, with the rest of the mar-ket remaining distinctly anaemic. As a result, in the post-pandemic period, discretionary spends have emerged powerfully, but spending on the essential consumption bas-ket has remained muted. This has been reflected in FMCG companies continuing to have to live with continuing to have to live anaemic rural demand and sales

are trading down to be able to buy what they cannot do without. Other than anaemic consump-tion expenditure by most residents, what has added to the woes of the private sector is the prevailing high interest rates offered by financial institutions. They have been prompted to do so by the RBI prompted to do so by the RBI pushing up regulatory rates in order to rein in inflation, which remains significantly above the tar-geted 4 per cent. There can hardly be any incentive to borrow money at high interest rates in order to shore up capital expenditure, par-ticularly when the demand for most items of mass consumption remains subfused remains subdued.

In this situation, what are the options left in the hands of the options left in the hands of the country's policymakers so that there is minimal downside risk to achieving the projected growth rate of 65 per cent and, maybe, improve upon it a little? Foremost, the K-shaped recovery that has taken place after the pandemic has waned causing a disproportionate waned, causing a disproportionate amount of additional income to flow into the hands of the top few. has to be remedied. The bottom

has to be remedied. The bottom half of the population must have more to spend so that the rural demand for essentials perks up and the FMCG managers have a broad smile on their faces. There is a need for income sup-port to the poor to continue and, this is important, the rural employ-ment guarantee scheme needs to be made to function better. Besides, small and medium enterprises small and medium enterprises need to be able to access more

working capital in order to expand operations. Schemes introduced by financial institutions at the behest of the government to aid post-pandemic recovery need to continue and become more accessible. A business which does not have an agency rating should, nevertheless, be able to get more working capital without excessive hassle

without excessive hassle.

As small and medium enterprises expand operations with more working capital, they will hire more temporary hands, which will allow their families to spend more on essentials. Over time, this will transmit demand unwards to the transmit demand upwards to the improve its capacity utilisation and signal it to capacity utilisation and signal it to ready its expansion plans. As these get off the ground, private capital expenditure will increase and give the economy the boost that public investment on the infrastructure has till now given. There is also an urgent need to improve the ease of doing business for large-scale high-tech manufacturers who are seek-ing to shift base from Chian to India.

The production-linked incentive

The production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme is being approved for more and more sectors and a con-stant vigil needs to be maintained stant vigil needs to be maintained to address the specific issues being faced by its participants. The PLI has meant more rules and a range of higher import tariffs to enable its participants to deliver. There has to be a sunset for the scheme so that, at the end of the day Indian manuscript. at the end of the day, Indian manu-facturing is able to face competition both at home and globally and

# How best to set up integrated theatre commands

The best option could be to convert the existing five Army commands (Eastern, Central, Northern, Western and South Western) into ITCs. RIGHT after Independence, the requirement of a Chief of Defence Staff (CDS) was felt. The proposal for adopting the CDS system was floated by the first Governor General of inde-pendent India, Lord Mountbatten,

pendent India, Lord Mountbatten, who had first-hand experience of a unified command. This proposal was cold-shouldered by Javaharlal Nehru, the then Prime Ministes:
Thereafter, the proposal was simply put aside. Consequent to the Kargil War, the need to adopt this system came up again. While the Subrahmanyam Committee took up a sumble of issues, it left out the allnumber of issues, it left out the allimportant requirement for some rean. It was thanks to the Arun Singh son. It was thanks to the Arun Singh Committee, based on my presentation to it on the imperatives of adopting the system in its full play (with inte-grated theatre commands or ITCs), that this issue was taken up. To start with, I had recommended two ITCs (Pecides one mountain come for the (besides one mountain corps for the Tibet border) — one for the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and the other being the northern ITC. To allay mis-apprehensions of the IAF, the first theatre commander of the northern ITC should be an Air Force officer with integrated staff from the IAF and

to come up subsequently in a phased However. Andaman and Nicobar ITC was

formed.
Finally, in August 2019, the post of
CDS was announced by the PM (not
as an Act of Parliament) and a committee under the National Security
Adviser met to formulate the role and
powers of the CDS. In January 2020,
Gen Bipin Rawat assumed office as
CDS.

As far as constituting integrated theatre commands is concerned, no theatre commands is concerned, no operational role has been assigned to the CDS. It is consequent to the formulation of overall strategic war plans related to a two- or even three-front war (China, Pakistan and Indian Ocean Region) that integrated theatre commands would be constituted. In determining their composition and areas of responsibility, a range of factors need to be considered. These include the terrain, enemy capabilities in each sector, where to be completely on the defensive, where to

ties in each sector, where to be com-pletely on the defensive, where to stage an offensive defence and, final-ly, where an all-out offensive is to be launched.

Possibly, General Rawat, in recom-mending only one ITC for the north-ern border with Tibet and a part of POK, tried to Copy the PLA (People's Liberation Army of China) on the one



the number of commands (army and IAF) on the other.

It is both possible and convenient

It is both possible and convenient for the PLA to have a single com-mand on the Tibet plateau due to the type of terrain and excellent road and rail system laterally and to various points on the LAC. On the Indian points on the LAĆ. On the Indian side, the terrain is of high mountains and deep valleys, with poor road con-nectivity, both to specific points on the LAĆ and laterally, making move-ment difficult and slow.The best

option could be to convert the existing five Army commands (Eastern, Central, Northern, Western and South Western) into ITCs. While the CDS must be the overall operational commander, the existing Integrated Defence HQ should form a

Integrated Defence HQ should form a part of the CDS HQ and this setup must stand independent of the Ministry of Defence (MoD). The IAF continues to have some misgivings and reservations on the adoption of the ITC concept. It is con-tended that air power is highly flexitended that air power is highly flexi-ble and can be applied across a wide front on a range of targets, as a whole front on a range of targets, as a whole or in smaller components. Further, the present number of squadrons is inadequate and their distribution among the ITCs would mitigate against the fuller application of arpower at critical enemy targets. General Rawat further muddied the waters by equating air power with artillery on the one hand and pitching for submarines instead of air craft carfor submarines instead of aircraft car-riers on the other, to the consternation

of the Navy's top brass. These observations of the IAF do not hold good, when subjected to a detailed analysis. While currently, the detailed analysis. While currently, the squadron strength is down to 32, this will soon have to be raised to 45, per-haps more. Their distribution among the ITCs would be based on a detailed examination of tasks of each ITC. Secondly, under certain requires examination of tasks of each ITC.
Secondly, under certain requirements, the CDS can temporarily
switch IAF resources from one ITC to

another for specific missions, as is being currently done by the IAF. Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari appears to be reconciled to the idea of inte-grating the efforts of all three services. Till date, we import almost 70 per cent of defence weapons and equip-ment, even though we have had over four dozen DRDO establishments, an equal number of ordnance factories and over a dozen defence PSUs. These establishments need major

changes in their working.
The Department of Military Affairs The Department of Military Affairs in the MoD, instead of being headed by the CDS, should have a three-star defence services officer with integrated staff to direct and control the working of the four establishments—the DRDO, ordnance factories, defence PSUs and DG quality assurance.

It would, in practice, replace the Secretary, Defence Production. This Secretary, Detence Production. This one change will, for sure, bring about a sea change in the output of these establishments and be an appropriate step towards self-reliance in defence weaponry and equipment.



uscious and juicy grapes may look healthy on a breakfast platter but that doesn't mean we keep on pop-ping them into our mouths as ve please along with toast and scrambled eggs. Grapes are healthy and good provided we make them a part of our total carbohyour total carbohy-drate allowance for the day and not have them as an extra indulgence. Particularly for diabetics, any fruit

with its natural sugar should be part of their daily carbohydrate allowance, which allowance, which means incorporating the fruit should be based on two factors, its calorie and glucose yield and what items of equivalent caloric value you can remove to make way for it. "So, if you are going to add fruits to your diet, you will have to take to other carbohydrates to make room for them. The which make room for them. The amount of carbohydrate present in the fruit determines its impact in the fruit determines its impact on blood sugar level. Broadly speaking 100 gm of grapes, which should be about 15 to 20 pieces depending on the size, yield 70 calories. On an average, one medium-sized grape gives one gram of carbs. If we keep this value in our head, then we will know how to substitute will know how to substitute grapes for any other carbohy-drate-rich food you are having. Learn to replace, forgo a slice of
