



India tells UN it is developing RBI to withdraw Rs 2,000 notes from programmes to reduce risk of losses from all hazards

India has told the UN India has told the UN General Assembly that it accords high importance to disaster risk reduction issues and is developing ambitious mitigation pro-grammes to reduce the risk of losses from all haz-ards, including landslides, floods, earthquakes, heat

floods, earthquakes, heat waves and lightning.

Principal Secretary to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, P K Mishra, said in his address to the Midhis address to the Mid-term Review of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (2015-2030) at a plenary in the UN General Assembly here on Thursday that in India disaster risk reduction is a "central public policy issue". Mishra is leading the Indian delegation at the High-Level Meeting of the General Assembly



of the implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 (HLM) that is taking place from May 18-19 at the United Nations Headquarters

He said that under India's current presidency of the G20, the group's members have agreed to establish a 'Working Group on Disaster Risk Reduction'. he said.

Mishra told the UNGA that India has significantly increased funding earmarked for disaster risk reduction and has brought about landmark changes in its financing architecture. in its financing architec-ture to support the entire spectrum of disaster risk management needs disaster risk mitigation preparedness, response recovery and reconstruc

Three mud houses gutted in fire in Doda

Three mud houses belonging to Gujjar families were gutted in a huge fire in the Dhadkai area of Doda dis-trict in the early hours of Friday destroying prop-erties worth lakhs, police

There were no casualties or injuries in the inci dent and the cause of the fire is unknown.

Sub-divisional police officer Gandoh Adil Rishu said three families were rendered homeless by the incident that took place in a village in the Gandoh sub-division.

The fire erupted at 1 am in one of the three houses and quickly spread to the other two houses, and control of the control of Sub-divisional police

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction is a landmark 2015 agreement to reduce damage, losses and deaths from natural and man-made hazards by the end of

deaths from natural and man-made hazards by the end of the decade.

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 (Sendai Framework) was the first major agreement of the post-2015 development agenda and provides member states with concrete actions to protect development gains from the risk of disaster.

Referring to the 'Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure', presently co-led by India and the United States, Mishra said the initiative is bringing about transformation in the way infrastructure systems are planned, designed, built, and maintained in the 21st century.

'Infrastructure projects are long-term investments. If informed by solid risk assessments, and underpinned by good risk governance, these infrastructure investments can build long-term resilience," he added.

Mishra said India is also working assiduously to improve access to early warning and is implementing Common Alerting Protocol, which will integrate Alert Generating Agencies with Disaster Managers and Telecom Service Providers. "This will ensure dissemination of geo-targeted alerts in regional languages to reach, each one of 1.3 billion citizens of our country," he said.

Applauding UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres's initiative on 'Early Warning for All by 2027', Mishra said India's efforts will contribute to achieving the target set by this timely global initiative.

President of the 77th session of the General Assembly Casba Korosi said eight years after the adoption of the Sendai Framework, global progress has not kept pace with the "urgency of our days" as the known number of people affected by disasters has jumped 80-fold since 2015.
"The shocks ignited by umattended risk- and amplified by Covid-19, conflict, and climate change- have torn through our systems across the world," the top UN official said.
They have left millions homeless and starving, upended supply chains and laid bare the gross inequities of an international financial order that has often prized profits over people, the UN leader's said.

in order to eitsure operational convenience and to avoid disruption of regular activities of bank branches, exchange of Rs 2,000 bank notes into bank notes of other denominations can be made up to a limit of Rs 2,0000 at a time at any bank starting from May 23, 2023," the RBI said.

To complete the exercise in a time-bound manner and to provide adequate time to the members of public, the RBI has asked all banks to provide deposit and/or exchange facility for Rs 2,000 bank notes until September 30, 2023.

Also, the facility for exchange of Rs 2,000 bank notes up to the limit of Rs 20,000 at a time shall also be provided at the 19 Regional Offices (Rs0) of RBI having Issue Departments from May 23, 2023.

As per the RBI, about 89 per cent of the Rs 2,000 denomination banknotes were issued prior to March 2017 and are at the end of their estimated life span of 4-5 years.

The total value of such banknotes in circulation has declined from Rs 6.73 lakh crore at its peak as on March 31, 2023. as on March 31, 2023

ecently, China increased its defence spending by 7.2 per cent to nearly \$225 billion in 2023 and it was the eighth consecutive year of increase notwithstanding the fact that there was a global unease over its aggressive behaviour. China, which also shares its border with India, has already entered into several military standoffs with its neighbour and its attempt to continuously increase its defence budget is a matter of concern for India. The reports have suggested that China has hiked the allocation for general public expenditure by 5.7 per cent and it dropped enough hints that Beijing is prioritising national security over development. What is worrisome is that it's the second year in a row that the annual hike in military spending has exceeded 7 per cent, reversing a two-decade trend under which the expansion of defence capabilities took a back seat to economic growth. If one counts on official statistics, China's military spending may only be a third of the US level, but is over three times higher than India's. The neighbouring country has even justified the increased spending as appropriate and reasonable, claiming that it faces escalating threats from the outside world. China is already having bitter ties with the United States and these ties are counterpoised by a warm embrace of President Putin. The security challenges range from Chineseclaimed Taiwan to the US naval and air missions in the disputed South China Sea near Chinese-occupied islands. Through increasing the defence budget, China has attempted to give an impression that it is on a mission to strengthen its military power and would not tolerate any aggression, of any kind, on its soil. The responses have included holding unprecedented exercises last August to punish Taiwan for hosting the then US House Speaker Pelosi. China's neighbours are already baffled due to the policy of aggressive, assertive and offensive use of military force. For India, the border standoff in eastern Ladakh stands out as unprovoked belligerence. The world is closely monitoring China's gradual military build-up through its continuous increased budget spending at a time when the National People's Congress set to confirm Xi Jinping's third term as President and head of the armed forces. The neighbouring country now controls the world's largest navy by size and it also aims high by increasing military power. Going by the media reports, China's key areas of spending are most likely to include the commissioning of its third aircraft carrier, the rapid production of new destroyers and fighter aircraft and investments in space technology and artificial intelligence for missile targeting systems. These are quite disturbing signals for China's neighbours, especially India and the latter should accordingly devise its defence strategy to deal with China's growing chal-

LOST ASPIRATIONS AMID ILLUSORY SUCCESS

BLIND CONFORMITY TRANSFORMING BOARD EXAM TOPPERS INTO SOPHISTICATED PRODUCTS

VERY year around this time, when board exam tresults occupy the mental landscape of young students and their parents, we witness the way an aggressively hyper-competitive and obsessively judgmental society valorises 'success' and stigmatises' failure'. Yes, the 'top-pers' become instant celebrities; brand-conscious schools and profit-making coaching centres love to sell their success stories; and television channels further and television channels further mythologise them as they speak of their focused' study, self-discipline and hard work. But then, amid this euphoria of success, we also hear about suicides, depression and shame.

Unhappiness is not limited to the work of the and television channels further

happy. In fact, those who have 'failed' (in the age of inflated marks, even those who get less than 90 per cent marks do not make their parents and peers happy) are stigmatised, and often seen as irresponsible and intellectually dull. Their parents feel embarrassed as their parents feel embarrassed as their neighbours and colleagues show undue interest in board exam results. And these young students who have just begun to see the world are compelled to carry the burden of 'failure'. There is hard-ly anybody who bothers to talk to them, understand the experience of humiliation they pass through, and make them understand that and make them understand that the complex and inexplicable tra-jectory of life does not depend on whether one has got 499 marks out of 500 in the board exams. And what is really ironic is that seldom do we bother to know

about the hollowness of the 'suc-cess' stories. What do these 'top-pers' with 99 per cent marks seek to do? Or, how do they look at the to do? Or, how do they look at the world? Or, for that matter, what do their parents expect of them? As a teacher and keen observer of human existence, I have been waiting eagerly for a 'topper' surprising me by saying that she/he wants to become a theoretical physicist, a mathematician, a his-torian, or for that matter, a social activist like Medha Patkar, a filmmaker like Satyajit Ray, or a liter-



ary figure like Amrita Pritam ary figure like Amrita Pritam.

Even though I continue to wait,
I have not yet found any 'topper'
acquiring the courage to see
beyond the standardised, routinised and 'safe' trajectory. I am tired of hearing the same answer: I wish to become a computer engineer, a doctor or an IAS offi-cer.' There is nothing wrong in regineer, a doctor or an IAS offi-cer.' There is nothing wrong in these useful careers. However, when the uniformity of aspira-tions – often driven by peer pres-sure, parental ambition, middle-class obsession with 'good' jobs, and these days the market-induced neoliberal logic of mate-rial wealth and social capital – transforms all these young 'top-pers' into parrots repeating the same formula, striving for the same goal, and feeling hesitant to think of any other option, there is reason to be worried about. This uniformity is unnatural

This uniformity is unnatural (you do not study science only to (you do not study science only to become a computer engineer; or for that matter, you do not study history, sociology and psychology only to become an IAs officer); it abhors the autonomy and unique-ness of a young aspirant (even a science student might have the undiscovered talent and aptitude for music painting and literafor music, painting and litera-ture); and above all, it transforms ture); and above all, it transforms these 'toppers' into sophisticated 'products' – a bunch of conform-ists destined to live with the mythology of 'placement and salary packages'. Accept it: the never-ending practice of giving and accepting

dowry in an instrumental marital alliance, the normalisation of cap-itation fee in many medical/engineering/management colleges, and social conservatism amid ornamental modernity - these are inevitable consequences of this blind conformity. Think of the other conse-

Think of the other consequences of this societal neurosis. From the all-pervading presence of coaching centres and £d Tech companies to the mushrooming growth of private medical/engineering colleges; or from middle-class parents selling their property and land, or taking bank loans to send their children to these lifeto send their children to these lite-killing chambers, to young aspi-rants living with perpetual stress and fear — the madness is every-where. Even if every middle-class parent spends a huge amount of money, not every child can get admitted to an engineering/med-ical college; and even if thousands ical college; and even it thousands of young graduates from Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Odisha take shelter in Delhi's Mukherjee Nagar, visit IAS coaching centres frequently, and spend sleepless nights while reading the 'notes' on general studies, history and spend studies, history and processing the processing the studies of the studies sociology, not everyone can become what they have mytholo-

The fact is that this unhappi-The fact is that this unhappi-ness is not limited only to those whom the system has declared as 'failures' — those who could not become, say, computer engineers, doctors or IAS officers. We require courage to admit that even the pampered 'achievers' remain unhappy. You can be 'suc-cessful', 'powerful' and wealthy — yet discontented and alienated. And the mythology of 'good liv-ing' through the seductive logic of conspicuous consumption or the glamour associated with your official status cannot heal this

Scientific research needs sustained investments

BASIC RESEARCH IS PLAYING A VITAL ROLE IN ADDRESSING GLOBAL CHALLENGES SUCH AS CLIMATE CHANGE AND FOOD SECURITY.

While the scientific community is happy that a large research project is finally seeing the light of the day, the occasion provides an opportuni-ty to examine our approach to such scientific projects, and fundamental research in genarms. The Prime Minister laid the founda A consortium of Indian institutions eral. A consortum of Indian institutions started working on gravitational waves in 2009 and the idea of setting up an observatory in India was born then. The US-based LIGO laboratory formally asked Indian scientists to join its programme in 2011. Research work was initiated and the Indian group submitted a detailed proposal for an



Indian LIGO to the Department of Atomic Energy and the Department of Science and Technology the same year. The project was recommended for funding by a committee on mega science projects in 2012.

After facing red tape for four years, the project got 'in-principle' approval from the Union Cabinet in February 2016. It took probber seway years for the Cabinet to give

the final approval to a prestigious mega project backed by some of the finest Indian scientists. That speaks volumes about the so-called 'ease of doing science' approach. The episode is a reflection of India's stagnating R&D expenditure, which has been a cause for concern for a long time. The Gross Domestic Expenditure on R&D (GERD) as a progentiace of the CIPD has becaused around another seven years for the Cabinet to give percentage of the GDP has hovered around

0.7 per cent for a decade now, according to a report published by the NITI Aayog last year. This is lower than even Brazil (1.16 per cent), South Africa (0.83 per cent), and, of course, much lower than China, which spends 2.14 per cent of its GDP on R&D. With such low contribution, the report said, R&D. perfectives in house the seguin than R&D performance is bound to remain stag-

nant.

Policies set high goals but they are not backed by money and action. The Science Technology and Innovation (STI) Policy of 2013 envisaged positioning India among the top five global scientific powers by 2020. Nine years later, an updated STI Policy, 2022, came up with a reworded and vague goal — placing India among the top five countries in the world in terms of 'quality of research outcome' by 2030. Our policymakers fail to understand that no amount of rephrasing of goals can substitute the need for enhanced funding and focus on basic research.

In recent years, the success in Covid-19 vaccine development and manufacturing as well as the development of digital products well as the development of digital products such as CoWiN and UPI are being cited as proof of India's growing technological prowess, and rightly so. However, we ignore that these achievements are a result of sustained investments in research and the creation and nurturing of institutions over the devadee. the decades.

Technical capabilities were built in statefunded national laboratories and higher education institutions and universities for

several decades, and these have been utilised by the private sector. Take, for instance, vaccine development and manufacturing as well as the generic medicine business in the private sector. The labs under the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and Indian Council of Research (CSIR) and Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) developed capa-bilities to make drugs and vaccines, clinical trials, etc. since the 1970s, and helped the private sector grow. Bodies like the Department of Biotechnology and the Technology Development Board handheld biotech firms Like. Bysex Biotech and Chouble Biotechnics

like Bharat Biotech and Shantha Biotechnics in their formative years. Development fund-ing worth hundreds of crores has flowed to private vaccine manufacturers. All these capabilities developed over the past three decades came in handy when the pandemic

The same holds for achievements in the information and communications technology (ICT) sector. Research in computer science, mathematics and physics has paved ence, mathematics and physics has paved the way for advancements in IT. Fundamental research in algorithms, artificial intelligence, cryptography and networking led to the development of computers, the Internet and smartphones. India made early investments in computer science education at the Indian Institutes of Technology, Regional Engineering Colleges (Rnown as National Institutes of Technology now), and later in the creation of the Indian Institutes of Information Technology. of Information Technology.

ener. Regulatory authorities, such as the FDA and EFSA, have established guidelines and maxi-mum recommended levels for each sweetener. For adults, the recom-mended daily intake of artificial sweeteners like aspartame, sucralose, and saccharin typical-ly ranges from 9 to 23 milligrams per kilogram of body weight.
