The life term was awarded for two offences - section 121 (waging war against government of India) of IPC and section 17 traising funds for terrorist act) of the UAPA. According to the Supreme Court, life imprisonment means incarceration till the last breath, unless the sentence is commuted by the authorities.
The court had awarded Malk (D-year jail term each under sections 120 B (criminal conspiracy), 121-A (conspiracy to wage war against the government of India) of IPC and sections 15 (terrorism), 18 (conspiracy for terrorism) and 20 (being member of terror organisaterrorism) and 20 (being member of terror organisa-

It had also awarded five-vear iail term each under

sections 13 (unlawful act), 38 (offence related to membership of terrorism) and 39 (support given to terrorism) of UAPA.

Malik had on May 10 last year told the Delhi court he

was not contesting the charges levelled against him that included acts of terrorism and sedition.

The court had framed the charges against Kashmiri

Rajouri-Poonch needs stepped up security

n recent months, twin border districts-Rajouri and Poonch - have remained on the radar of Pakistan sponsored terrorists. Seven people were killed and 14 injured in a terrorist attack at Dhangri village in Rajouri on January 1 this year. Five people, including two brothers, were killed when terrorists opened fire at a house. The very next day two more children were killed when an IED left behind by the attackers went off. The perpetrators of the crime are still at large, though security agencies claimed that they have eliminated one of the terrorists involved in creating disturbance in these districts. Last month, at-least five soldiers were killed after terrorists ambushed an army truck in the Rajouri sector. With security agencies finding it hard to trace out the culprits, there has been a level of uncertainty among the people residing in twin districts. Former Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir Ghulam Nabi Azad has now asked for permanent deployment of security forces in the terror-hit Rajouri-Poonch border areas and strengthening of the intelligence network and Village Defence Committees (VDCs) in the entire region. The demand has come against the backdrop of serious concerns expressed by the stakeholders that such incidents are taking place in Rajouri district as the majority of other areas are peaceful. There is fear and terror among the people here. To allay the fears of the people, there is a need to strengthen Village Defence Committees (VDCs). There is a need to deploy more security forces permanently for restoring confidence among the people in this region. It has ridges and valley. There is a need for strengthening intelligence - both local, Army, police too, so that such incidents are not repeated," the former Chief Minister maintained. The Dhangri terror attack was a wake-up call for all the people of Jammu and Kashmir and it would unite them irrespective of their religious and regional beliefs to defeat it. The barbaric act of terrorism which took precious lives deserved the condemnation in strongest words. But at the same time, such acts warrant people's unity above the case, creed and religion to fight it back with equal force. Security agencies must step up its intelligence set up in the $% \left\{ 1,2,...,n\right\}$ area as the spurt in terror attacks in the region was alarming. It is a harsh reality that after the abolition of Article 370, Pakistan does not want the establishment of peace and government formation (Assembly elections) in Jammu and Kashmir. This was why it tried to mislead the youth of the region by giving them training in terrorist camps, subjecting them to propaganda, and sending them down wrong paths like drug addiction. Pakistan is also try-ing to woo the poor into terror activities through money. But the people of Jammu and Kashmir have understood the mentality of Pakistan and opposed terrorist attacks. It is an open fact that the Poonch region has always witnessed heroic and historic events and battles fought by them in 1948, 1962, 1971 and 1999, and whenever anyone has tried to spread unrest in this area, the people have fought shoulder to shoulder with the Army irrespective of their caste, creed, gender and religion. The only way to defeat anti-national forces is to display exemplary unity and courage

THE PROJECT BETRAYS LACK OF IN-DEPTH AND SENSITIVE UNDER-STANDING OF THE HISTORY, SPIRIT AND ETHOS OF THE SITE

N August 28, 2021, after N August 28, 2021, atter closed-door work that lasted more than a year, the 'renovated' Jallianwala Bagh was digitally dedicated and opened to the public by Prima Minister Narendra Modi. The PM wrote on his Twitter handle: "Join was we inauturate the renovated me as we inaugurate the renovated complex of Jallianwala Bagh Smarak... I also invite you to watch the sound and light show. It would display the horrific massacre of

display the horrific massacre of April 1919 and instil a spirit of gratitude and reverence towards the martyrs."

Although many people watched the ceremony, their resporse was, inonically, the opposite. There were dissenting voices from the families of freedom fighters, social activists and academics, besides culture, bettage and conservation experts. heritage and conservation experts, ournalists, tourists and politicians journalists, tourists and politicians. Some of the expressions summing up their responses were 'erasure of history', 'insult to martyrs', 'corpo-ratisation', 'hideous transforma-tion' and 'great damage to India's collective history'.

Back in 1961, the Jallianwala Bagh had been dedicated as a national memorial to the public by

Bagh had been dedicated as a national memoral to the public by the first President, Dr Rajendra Prasad, after its conservation under the supervision of the Jallianwala Bagh National Memorial Trust created by the 1951 Act. The Trust comprised the Prime Minister as its permanent chairman and the Culture Minister, the AICC president, the Punjab Chief Minister and the Governor as its permanent trustees. The site had been planned to preserve the narrow lane, the only entry to the site, an old well, and a entry to the site, an old well, and a dilapidated wall with bullet marks on it. To mark the point from where the British forces had fired, a stone with an inscription was affixed there. On the right side, an Amar Jyoti was affixed on a rectan-gular platform with the inscription: 'In Memory of Martyrs — April 13, 1919.'

In the old buildings on the left side, a museum displaying old photographs and paintings and the office of the secretary were set up. A pylon in the shape of a liberty flame was added in the centre.



The year 2019 marked 100 years of the massacre. To commemorate of the massacre. To commemorate the occasion, the Union government decided to 'renovate' the site at a cost of Rs 20 crore. The government also amended the Act, removing the AICC president as a permanent member and giving itself powers to remove any nominated member before five years without assistenine any reason. without assigning any reason.

The Archaeological Survey of India and the National Building Construction Corporation (India)
Limited were appointed to supervise the execution of the project by
Ahmedabad-based Vama Ahmedabad-based Vama Communications. Perceiving the site as a tourist destination, the project has ended up defacing the memorial. The project has been conceived and executed without an in-depth and sensitive understand-ing of the history entire and ethose ing of the history, spirit and ethos of the site.

The narrow lane from where the soldiers led by Gen Dyer had entered the site has been ruthlessly

entered the site has been ruthlessly changed.

The cheerful copper-coloured duman figures, mounted on the walls on both sides of the lane, evoke a misleadingly celebratory spirit which runs contrary to the solemnity of martyrdom. The stat-ures of boyes and aldowly sith mon ues of boys and elderly Sikh men wearing the patka bear no resemblance to the people massacred on

April 13, 1919. Renaming the 'Martyrs' lane' as 'Heritage lane' is tantamount to undermining the sacrifice of the martyrs. The stone marking at the firing point has been removed, and the inscription has been installed on the ground. The Amar Jyoti has been relocated. There are galleries showcasing Punjab's history. India's Independence movement and the Ghadar movement with wall-

Ghadar movement with wall-hanging billboards and laser hanging billboards and laser shows. But the space in every gallery is insufficient to do justice to these complex narratives. The visitors face inconvenience as they are jostled and forced to move on. Using the Lakhori or Nanakshahi bricks to rebuild its superstructure, the martyrs' well is made to look like a medieval structure, whereas it is actually a modern one.

The liberty flame pylon, where The liberty flame pylon, where every year on April 13 a contingent of the Punjab Police salutes the martyrs by reversing their arms, now has a lotte pond in front of it. The complete list of those who sacrificed their lives on that fateful day in 1919 has not been prepared and displayed anywhere on the site premises.

on the pathways, the metal railing has been replaced by a wooden railing, which has got damaged in less than a year. The artificial land-

scaping — adding pathways and mounds on the plain ground — gives it an exotic look, compromis-ing the spirit and essence of the site. A platform named 'salvation centre' has been built to project the site of bloodshed as a site of spiri-tuality. Worse, the 'salvation cen-tre' serves only as a selfie spot for the tourists.

In the name of a facelift, the erroneous perception of the martyrs' memorial as a 'tourist destination' and the unwanted additions just to

and the unwanted additions just to use up funds have defaced the site, inviting controversy and criticism. To set things right, all old articles — metal railing, paintings, stone/metal pillars, etc – need to be recovered and reinstalled. A committee of language, landscap-ing and architecture experts with a deep knowledge of history should be formed be formed.

The project implementation ency should be blacklisted and the project grant, along with penal-ty, should be recovered to create a corpus fund for future mainte-

nance.

The three nominated members of the Trust should be well-known historians, conservation experts, social activists, members of families of freedom fighters and artists cutting across political party lines. Once nominated, they should be allowed to complete their term

Federalism sole safeguard against power overreach

IT IS TIME FOR THE RULING CLASS TO LEARN THAT OBDURATE PROBLEMS HAVE TO BE SOLVED THROUGH ACCOMMODATION.

"There comes a time when one
must take a position that is neither safe, nor
political, nor popular, but he must do it
because conscience tells him it is right." We
hardly expect political parties to follow this
sage advice. The one passion that catapults
them into the realm of power and privilege is
the craving for power at any cost. There is little that is moral about politics in India today.
However, we do expect parties to possess the
gift of foresight. They should be able to anticjupte that policy decisions will have far-reaching consequences, not only for a hapless people caught in a vice-like grip of power, but
also for themselves.

Some observers of Indian politics had predicted that the decision taken by the Central
government on August 5, 2019, to downgrade
the status of a constituent member of the

the status of a constituent member of the Union of States, Jammu and Kashmir, to that Union of States, Jammu and Kashmir, to that of two union territories set a bad precedent. We are not speaking of political morality here, simply because expectations that our ruling class will follow the route of ethics have been betrayed time and again. We are speaking of bad politics. Only a short-sighted ruling class sumes that a troublesome political issue that has plagued Indian politics for decades can be treated as a law and order problem. But Opposition parties that sided with the government — the Aam Aadmi Party, Bahujan Samaj Party and Telugu Desam Party — and those that walked out of Parliament



should have foreseen that the act had dangerous implications. In 2019, it was J&K, tomorrow it might be their turn. Witness the ugly spats between Delhi's Lieutenant Governor, spats between Delni's Lieutenant Governor, out to undercut the power of AAP ministers, and the enactment of an ordinance that gives to the Lt Governor charge of the administra-tive services. The AAP should have known that the centralising juggernaut of the govern-ment will not stop with J&K. Still, it sided with the decision. Consider the outcome of

the failure to take a stand. Elected leaders of the failure to take a stand. Elected leaders of non-BJP ruled states are allegedly harassed by Central agencies; some have been arrested on flimsy grounds, and funds are sometimes denied to states. More downgrading of states that are considered bothersome might well be on the agenda. That the Central government was granted sweeping powers became, clear when the

sweeping powers became clear when the design of federalism unfolded in the Constituent Assembly. On August 20, 1947,

Gopalaswami Ayyangar, a member of the drafting committee of the Constitution, reported the conclusions of the Union Powers Committee: that the Centre should be made as strong as possible. This was oddly seen as consistent with the allotment of a range of subjects to the provinces. If any subject could not be accommodated in the three lists - federal, provincial and concurrent - it would devolve to the Centre.

devolve to the Centre.

The Constitution makers designed a quasi-federal system for India. As disorder unleashed by the Partition bred fears of further Balkanisation during the language wars of the 1950s, the centralisation of power in the hands of the Union government intensified.

The Central government has altered the boundaries of constituent states, created new states out of existing ones with the consent of state levislatures, controlled enonponic

state legislatures, controlled economic resources, dismissed elected governments by the indiscriminate use of Article 356, and mposed Governor's rule in states ruled by

imposed Governor's rule in states ruled by Opposition parties.

The Central and state governments coexist-ed relatively peacefully till 1967, when the Regemony of the Congress system was broken by the election of Opposition parties to state legiclatures.

legislatures.

The split in the Congress party in 1969, and The split in the Congress party in 1969, and the intended marginalisation of regional leaders, marked the beginning of confrontation between the ruling party at the Centre and Opposition parties wherever they ruled. In the 1970s and 1980s, excessive concentration of power led to identity wars in Assam, Kashmir valley, Mizoram and Punjab.

Overbearing power exercised by the Union government was consolidated and built upon when the BJP came to power in 2014. The erosion of regional autonomy is part of the ideological agenda of 'one country, one govern-ment, one language, and one religion'. Though regional parties in the South have resisted the onslaught of Hindutva, the relentresisted the onslaught of Hindutva, the relent-less drive to push the agenda south of the Vindhyas, and to control the government ruled by AAP in Delhi, has led to fraying of political tempers, unconstitutional attempts by Governors to interfere with the policies of an elected government, the masterminding of defections in non-BJP-ruled states and coer-cion of political leaders. This characterises the current sorry state of federalism in India. Federalism is under siege.

Federalism is under siege

This portends further erosion of democracy in the country. In the US, Canada and Belgium, federalism was intended to enhance Belgium, federalism was intended to enhance administrative competence through the decentralisation of power in the first case, and accommodation of diverse linguistic/ethnic groups in the other two cases. For large and complex societies like India's, federalism is the only guarantee against further accumulation of power and imposition of a unifying agenda by the Centre.

That this agenda will once again lead to intensified discontent and identity wars can be foretold. It is time for the ruling class to learn that obdurate problems have to be

learn that obdurate problems have to be solved through accommodation, persuasion, inventiveness and decentralisation of power. This is called foresight
