"The ministers will take the opportunity to progress the futuristic roadmap for the India-US partnership as envisioned by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Joseph Biden, in their discussions in June and September this year," the MEA said in a statement.

It said both sides will also take stock of contempo-

rary regional issues and exchange views about shared priorities for augmenting cooperation in multilateral platforms, and through frameworks such as Quad.

The India-US defence cooperation has been on an upswing in the last few years.

In June 2016, the US designated India a "Major Defence Partner" paving way for sharing of critical military equipment and technology.

The two countries have also inked key defence and security pacts over the past few years, including the Logistics Exchange Memorandum of Agreement (LEMOA) in 2016 that allows their militaries to use each other's bases for repair and replenishment of supplies.

The two sides also signed COMCASA (Communicawhich provides for interoperability between the two militaries and provides for the sale of high-end technology from the US to India.

In October 2020, India and the US sealed the BECA (Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement) agreement to further boost bilateral defence ties.

The pact provides for sharing of high-end military technology, logistics and geospatial maps between the two countries. (Agencies)

Simmering discontent in Ladakh

The discontent is brewing among Ladakhis after the UT administration put in public domain the new industrial allotment policy for the region. The stakeholders and representatives of Ladakh are unhappy over the way the policy was rolled out without taking two Ladakh **Autonomous Hill Development Councils** on board. The issue has snowballed into a big controversy with the Leh Apex Body (LAB) openly asking the UT administration for its rollback. The agitating groups believe the policy is 'a significant risk to the delicate environment of Ladakh as well as an attempt to undermine the authority of two Hill Development Councils'. The LAB, headed by the former MP Thupstan Chhewang took a lead from the front and expressed serious concern over the new industrial policy which envisaged on "providing opportunities of economic growth, entrepreneurship, employment generation for the local youth to participate in the industrial sector by allocating land for the establishment of industries and other related activities. The Body feels that there are a number of other priorities for the administration than hastily working on the industrial land allotment policy which only aims at the establishing medium and large scale industry in Ladakh. It will only degrade the fragile ecology and environment of the region. The LAB has submitted the suggestions for amendment in the Ladakh Industrial Land Allotment Policy as per the aspiration of people of Ladakh, to the UT administration. Others believe that the New Industrial Policy poses a significant risk to the delicate environment of Ladakh and threatens the indigenous cultural identity of the region. The introduction of this draft without the consent of the people of Ladakh is 'undemocratic and deeply concerning', they are of the opinion besides they believe it would undermine the opinions of the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils which would dis-empower the people of Ladakh. These new regulations directly undermine the authority and role of the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils, constituting a severe attack on their institution. It is imperative for both the Councils in Kargil and Leh to unite and stand against this policy, which is clearly against the interests of the local population. The UT administration of Ladakh has drafted the new industrial land allotment policy wherein it has put special focus on providing opportunities to the local youth. The draft policy document, which was rolled out recently, has the main objective to create employment for the local population. The policy also focuses on inclusive and sustainable development in the region. Interestingly, the locals in Ladakh have demanded protection under Sixth Schedule of Indian Constitution and job reservation for locals. The stakeholders have raised their concern over no mention of protection of land to be allotted for development of industry in the region for locals. They have also criticized the UT administration for allegedly not consulting the local representatives including Hill Development Councils while drafting the new industrial policy and apprehended that it would openly harm the interests of local businessmen and natives of Ladakh. The preservation of the environment and ecology, no doubt, needs to be the priority of all but the Ladakhi people must bear in mind that the region is still facing backwardness and it needs industrial revolution for a better tomorrow.


