Friday congregational prayers were not allowed for the fifth consecutive week at Srinagar's historic Jamia Masjid amid fears of protests over the civilian deaths in Palestine. A statement by the Anjuman-e-Augaf, the managing body of the Jamia Masjid, said authorities directed it early in the morning to close down all the doors of mosque as Friday prayers will not be allowed to take place.

It added that detention of Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, who is the mosque's chief cleric, also continued for the fifth consecutive Friday.

'Repeatedly disallowing Friday prayers at Jamia Masjid and detaining the Mirwaiz is a highly regrettable and authoritative decision which causes great anguish and disappointment among the Muslims of the state and offends their religious sentiments," the statement added.





Take decisive action against Pakistan

akistan seems to have learnt no lesson from its provocations along the borders. Unprovoked shelling and firing has made the lives of border dwellers, on both sides of the dividing line, miserable and the neighbouring countries must bear in mind that its unwarranted actions will only mount trouble along the borders. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has taken a serious note of the killing of a Border Security Force (BSF) head constable Lal Fam Kima by Pakistan Rangers and called it a violation of bilateral agreements. The BSF also took up the issue in the recent incidents in flag meetings with the Pakistani side. The incidents of ceasefire violations and cross-border infiltration by drone or firing are a violation of the bilateral agreements and Pakistan is bound to pay a heavy price for the same. The sniper attack, in which the BSF jawan was killed, shows Pakistan Rangers are deliberately targeting the BSF and clearly violating the ceasefire agreement. Such attempts have been made earlier too. The 50-year-old BSF Head Constable Lal Fam Kima, who succumbed to injuries while retaliating to the fresh ceasefire violation by Pakistan Rangers had saved the lives of 12 of his colleagues in 1998 during an anti-terror operation. He was also honoured with seven bravery awards in his 27-year career in the border guarding force. Deployed in the BSF on April 21, 1996, Kima succumbed to his injuries received in an unprovoked firing resorted by Pakistan Rangers deployed near the International Border in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramgarh sector. The firing started on the intervening night of November 8-9 by Pakistan Rangers and the BSF befittingly replied to the violation of the ceasefire along the international border in the Ramgarh and Arnia sectors in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district. Kima played a major role in an operation in 1998 when there was a fierce encounter with terrorists in the upper reaches of Gool. Border dwellers are the worst-affected due to the cross border firing and shelling by Pakistan. The administrative apathy coupled with unpredictable border shelling and firing by Pakistan forces from across the IB and LOC compound their miseries. What is rubbing salt on their wounds is the slow pace of construction of bunkers along the LoC and the IB. It is a perfect case of official insensitivity towards border people who are highly vulnerable to Pakistan's misadventures for a long time. It became more serious when the government of India itself admitted recently that Pakistan has repeatedly violated the ceasefire. The increase in ceasefire violations clearly reflects the gravity of volatile situations along the borders. In such circumstances, it becomes the government's responsibility to take all proactive measures to save the border population from becoming the easy target of enemy fire. The sorry state-of-affairs can be well gauged from the prevailing situation that the government, particularly deputy commissioners concerned, have failed to construct bunkers-both community as well as individual-in time bound manner, leaving border dwellers to face umpteen hardships besides losing their lives to Pakistan firing and shelling. It is high time that the government of India should initiate a decisive action against Pakistan to ensure that such incidents are brought down.

In the past, depression was often misunderstood as black magic, possession by spirit, weakness of mind, poor willpower, an act to gain sympathy or just plain laziness. However, we have made great strides in breaking the stigma against depression in our society.


We're able to catch the signs early on now but how good are we at understanding it? Probably not as well as we believe. For most of us, the multi-faceted causes of depression, still remain a mystery

Depression doesn't have a single cause

Unlike infectious diseases, there isn't a one-to-one causal relationship or there isn't a single factor that leads to depression for all. According to Dr Satish Kumar, MD Psychiatry, (AIIMS) depression has multiple factors behind it in a depressed patient's brain. But including that of 'chemical imbalance'

Dr Satish Kumar explained that despite all the flak SSRI-based antidepressants receive, they are "one of the wonder drugs to treat depression" and effective at saving lives from suicide. He further said, "Its mechanism of action via different serotonin receptors is well-proved and documented.

Dr Akhil Danda (MBBS, NBD), a well-known psychiatrist in Ghaziabad, shed light on why serotoninbased or even other medicationaided treatment is bashed on.

Major problem with pharmacotherару

"The major problem in terms of pharmacotherapy-based treatment faced by psychiatrists is noncompliance and frequent relapses due to inadequate follow-up and drug adherence. Sometimes, due to this lengthy process, patient loses momentum and doesn't follow up. This paints a misconception about sion? pharmacotherapy," Dr Danda said to Zee News Digital.

Moreover, medicines are not the only option for depressed patients. They can opt for psychotherapy as well based on what their mental health professional deems right.

Researchers of the "The serotonin theory of depression: a systematic umbrella review of the evidence" study were accused of allowing their biases to influence the direction and focus of the body of research. However, Dr Kumar stated that the study will help patients and doctors alike understand the causes of depression and look at a table of options before choosing one.

So, what do patients need to consider when seeking treatment?

In case you get diagnosed with depression, it would be a great idea to go home and research on the illness thoroughly. Better yet, sit with your mental health professional with a bunch of questions to clear any doubts you may have.

Dr Danda feels there is often a lack of education of mental illnesses among patients.

"Education and a patient's socioeconomic status largely affects their understanding of depression and expectations from a psychiatrist. A patient should ideally be psycho-educated about their diagnosed condition and explained their various treatment options. The medications prescribed can improve their condition in various time frames," he said.

Can we blame serotonin for depres-

As far as the credibility of the serotonin theory, Dr Danda clarified that it isn't wise to blame a single neurotransmitter for changes in the brain during depression. There are other neurotransmitters like dopamine, norepinephrine, endocannabinoids.

When understanding mental illness, a bio-psycho-social model of disease offers a good perspective. This includes factors like genetics, other medical diseases, environmental stressors, family situation and person's own way of dealing with problems. Holding one neurotransmitter – serotonin, responsible does not make sense. say experts.

How can you get fatty liver disease without drinking alcohol?

The University of Kashmir conducted interview-cumevaluations as part of the selection process for startups competing for incubation at its NewGen IEDC Business Innovation and Incubation Centre. This initiative falls under the TIDE 2.0 scheme, a startup support program initiated by the Government of India and overseen by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY). The TIDE 2.0 scheme provides grant-in-aid support under two distinct categories, namely Entrepreneur-in-Residence (EiR) and Minimum Viable Product (MVP) Grant. These categories aim to assist nascent stage start-ups across various domains of national interest, including green technology, education, agriculture, financial inclusion (including digital payments), infrastructure and transportation, environment, clean tech, and clean energy.

The primary focus of these support programs is to aid selected start-ups in proof-of-concept development, prototype development, and final product development by offering stipulated grants to facilitate their growth and innovation.
