The NEEMS will notify of the revised schedule for the

the revised schedule for the exam soon, an official said, adding that the candidates can write to NBEMS at its communication web portal.

The postponement has angered scores of postgraduate doctors who will need for conducting NEET-PG to reschedule travel plans and UPSC examinations,

to reach NEET-SS exam centres. They say the board should have factored in the G20 summit dates when it announced the exam date

announced the exam dates on July 27.

The candidates from Kashmir said that the postponement of exams has added to their miseries as they now will have to cancel their ticket which they had their tickets which they had booked to appear in the examination

They said if the examination centre had been in Srinagar, then they wouldn't have faced such issues, but

have faced such issues, but in the absence of the centre here, they are suffering. After repeated requests to the NBE regarding the examination centre in Sri-nagar, the National Board of Examinations in Medi-cal Sciences said that the required standards of security aren't being met at Srinagar to hold the NEET-SS examination. The aspirants questioned that if the required standards

the Resident Doctors Asso-ciation of SKIMS Srinagar, said that the National Board of Examination (NBE) authorities are not keeping the centre in Srinagar due

to security reasons.

J&K polls to restore democracy

fter the BJP-led Central govern-Assembly elections can be held in Jammu and Kashmir 'anytime now', there is a lot of optimism and hope among the political parties, especially Kashmir-centric which are desperately asking for conduct of polls in the Union Territory without any delay. The prolonged delay in elections to J&K Assembly has virtually made these politicians irrelevant and insignificant. Jammu and Kashmir, which was granted the status of Union Territory in August 2019, has been without an Assembly since November 2018. The erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir was brought under Governor's rule as the BJP pulled out of the Mehbooba Mufti-led government in June 2018. Thereafter, the Assembly was unexpectedly dissolved. Now, four years have passed since the Centre abrogated the controversial and discriminatory Article 370 but there is still an uncertainty over the conduct of the Assembly elections, though the authorities have started preparation for the same. The Centre's statement has brought enough hope among the stakeholders that the state-turned-UT would finally witness the restoration of electoral democracy. Asserting that it is ready to conduct the elections, the Central Government has put the onus on the Election Commission of India and the UT election panel to decide which poll will take place first. In the Centre's scheme of things, J&K elections will have three tiers -panchayats, municipal bodies and the legislative Assembly. Since the revision of the voters' list is set to be completed in a month or so, it is expected that at least one election would be held before the year-end - if all goes well. Going by the Centre's contention that terror-related incidents have gone down by 45 per cent since 2018 and instances of infiltration have dropped by 90 per cent, expediting the poll process is the need of the hour. At the same time, the Central Government and the UT administration need to pre-empt attempts to disrupt the electoral exercise. Forces inimical to peace and stability in J&K will inevitably resort to violence and propaganda in the coming months. Security and surveillance must be beefed up in order to instil confidence in the voters. It is expected that the free and fair elections to the Assembly would help in the restoration of statehood ought to be the next logical step. Though the Centre has repeatedly stated that J&K's UT status is a temporary measure, it has stopped short of specifying a time frame for undoing the downgrading that was done four years ago. It has been almost a decade now since J&K last witnessed Assembly elections in 2014. With the situation improving quite fast and the people have been cooperating in restoration of normalcy in Jammu and Kashmir, it is like a golden opportunity for the UT administration to ensure that democracy is restored at the earliest. The people are now fed up with bureaucracy that can't be an alternative to democracy. What the Centre needs to ensure is that it should not be frittered away.

Insulate cops, CAPF men from communal bias

Na fit of rage after not being allowed by his superior to detrain at a rail-way station, Constable Chetan Singh Chaudhary of the Railway Protection Force (RPF) shot dead Assistant Sub-Inspector Tikaram Meena on the Jaipur-Mumbai Superfast Express on July 31. Thereafter, he went on a killing spree, picking out Muslims, whom he identi-fied from their beards. Three Muslims fied from their beards. Three Muslims tied from their beards. Three Muslims were shot dead from point-blank range, after which Chaudhary reportedly told a burqa-clad woman to chant 'Jai Mata Di' while pointing his gun at her. Fortunately, other passengers came to her rescue and shouted at him, forcing him to extreat. him to retreat.

Investigations by senior officers of the RPF have revealed that Chaudhary had a bad track record. He is known to have a bad track record. He is known to have brought a Muslim autorickshaw driver, Wahid Khan, to the RPF post in Ujjain in February 2017 for apparently no rea-son and harassed him. He was taken to task after Wahid lodged a complaint with Chaudhary's superiors. On anothwith Chaudhary's superiors. On another occasion, he allegedly withdrew Rs 25,000 from a colleague's account using the latter's ATM card. He is even alleged to have assaulted another colleague when posted in Bhavnagar. Assaulting a colleague is considered a serious offence in the police and paramilitary forces. Yet, he continued to be on the rolls of the RPF.

Senior supervisory officers need to maintain a constant watch on such personnel who have the proclivity to be influenced by radical ideas. As part of the annual medical check-up, they need to be put through psychiatric

There is a dearth of psychiatrists in the CAPFs and police forces. A good number of psychiatrists need to be enlisted and associated with the recruitment process so that hotheads do not make it to the CAPEs or the state do not make it to the CAP's or the state police forces. Their activities on social media will have to be monitored as these play a very crucial role in radical-ising the personnel.

Fabian socialism is past its expiry date

ssues like bankruptcy and solvency Tssues like bankruptcy and solvency would seldom form an integral part of any thesis on national economics and the course of economics. It appears to be presumed by most economists, at least of the conventional kind, that healtenance in which profined to indibankruptcy is mainly confined to individuals and companies, and not counviduals and companies, and not countries. This may perhaps have been because of the existence of an institution like the International Monetary Fund. The IMP has over the years been ready to come to the aid of countries in financial difficulties; albeit on its terms. Speaking of hankmuter, and insal-

Speaking of bankruptcy and insolvency, we may turn our attention to our neighbours. Pakistan is not our only neighbour to be on the edge of insolvency. Nepal and Myanmar (Burma) are not far away; Sri Lanka has just passed vency. Nepai and Myanmar (Burma) are not far away; Sri Lanka has just passed through a crisis and has been brought back to its feet thanks to India; one hopes Bangladesh's exports revive soon

Today's generation might find it hard to believe it, but India also had its brief to believe it, but India also had its brief brush with insolvency; this occurred way back in 1990-91. But it dealt with it with courage and boldness. Instead of vacillating, the country's then gov-ernment did not hesitate to pledge a mass of 50 tonnes of gold to get over

the hump, following it up with a drathe hump, following it up with a dra-matic about-turn in economic policy. The turnaround was decisively guided by the then Prime Minister P.V. Narasimha Rao. It required outstand-ing courage to demolish a pillar of Nebruyianism namely the socialistic Nehruvianism, namely, the socialistic pattern of economy, so affectionately constructed by Jawaharlal Nehru on the outskirts of Chennai (then Madras)

in the year 1955.

While it might have been conceived of as a benign piece of Fabian socialism, the resolution, popularly called the Avadi Resolution came to earn only notoriety in later years. Avadi is a sub-urb of Madras, where Nehru's Socialist urb of Madras, where Nehru's Socialist Manifesto was passed by the Congress. In many ways, the occasion was painted with a sanctity of sorts on account of laying the foundation of one of the two shibboleths of the Nehruvian ideology. shibboleths of the Nehruvian ideology; the other being 'dynamic neutralism', later to re-christened as "Non-Alignment'. Rather similarly, this socialism was given the moniker "commanding heights of the coonomy". Karl Marx might have defined socialism as "From each according to his ability to each according to his ability to each according to his apportunity". But in the Nehruvian system, no individual citize was allutted.

tem, no individual citizen was allotted any share. Thereafter, Nehru's daughter Indira nationalized one industry

after another, justifying her actions as after another, justifying her actions as socialism.' Again, no shares went to the public; in actuality, this was noth-ing short of state capitalism. Under it, instead of any citizen of the country owning shares, it was the President of badio who awayd them.

India who owned them.

Jawaharlal Nehru long ago, had Jawahariai Nehru long ago, had rather brusquely told the industrialist JRD Tata "Never speak to me again of profit. It is a dirty word". On another occasion, he declared that profiteers would be hanged "from the nearest lamp-posts and trees". Thus, the foun-dation of a non-profit making public sector was laid. Indira Gandhi and her minions neither understood nor bothered about industrial functioning no the need to generate financial surplus-es. On the other hand, Mrs Gandhi once even justified the growing corrup-tion under her regime by dubbing it a "global phenomenon", which meant that her minions helped themselves to money regardless of whether their mistress made any or not

Thankfully, the end of the 1990-91 crisis saw a new beginning. The break with the past saw a new dawn. India's rating by then had slipped to the bottom of the investment grade. Former RBI governor C. Rangarajan in his recent book Forks in the Road: My Days at RBI and Beyond describes how in August 1990, R.N. Malhotra in August 1990, R.N. Malhotra, Governor of the Reserve Bank of India had suggested keeping 15 per cent of gold reserves. The initiative to pledge gold was taken by the RBI. It needed the permission of the government, led by Chandra Shekhar, and the govern ment did show great wisdom and ment did show great wisdom and courage. When gold reserves were moved from the vault of the Bombay office to the airport, the movement along the road was closely monitored. It so happened in the case of one large consignment, the bullion van had to stop because of a suspected tyre burst in one of the cars in the convoy, which later resumed its journey

later resumed its journey.

The shipment of gold to London under financial duress brought out loud and clear the extremely critical situation in which India was then placed. It also brought home to everyone the enormity of the crisis. In a sense, it paved the way for the reforms that were to come. There is more than moral beyond this unfortunate episode in our beyond this unfortunate episode in our history. The first one is that state own-ership of business and industry does not lead to prosperity, starkly demon-strated by the disintegration of the Soviet Union. The second, and more important lesson is that governing a country is like managing a society on a

Security in place for G20 Summit CAPF NSG assisting in arrangements: Delhi Police

NEW DELHI, SEP 1: The Delhi Police is fully geared up for the G20 Summit and has put in place a comprehensive security arrangement focussing on various dimensions ranging from airport security to deployment at venues and anti-ter-

ror measures.

At a press conference here,
Special Commissioner of Police
(Protective Security Division)
Madhup Kumar Tiwari said the
Delhi Police is being assisted by
some Central Armed Police Forces
(CAPFs) and the National Security

(CAPis) and the National Security Guard (NSG) in the arrangements. "There are various dimensions to security — airport security, carcade management, event venues, anti-ter-ror measures, maintenance of general alert. We have drawn up a comprehensive security plan focussing on these measures," he said.

Tiwari, however, asserted that these measures have been taken keeping in mind that common peo-ple face minimum inconvenience.

"They will be assisted by joint commissioner-rank officers and additional DCPs. DCP-rank officers will serve as camp commanders of hotels where the delegates will be staying. Special commissioner of police ranked officers will be having groups of hotels under their com-mand," Tiwari added.

"Today, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a landmark decision by appointing the commission. I am glad that a person of the stature of glad that a person of the stature of Ram Nath Kovind ji has accepted the offer of the PM," Sarma told

the other of the PM," Sarma told reporters on sidelines of a pro-gramme in Nagaon.

The central government has con-stituted a committee headed by for-mer president Kovind to explore the feasibility of 'one nation, one elec-tron' committee the presiding the pretion', opening the possibility of Lok Sabha polls being advanced so that they could be held with a string of state assembly contests.

This comes a day after the Centre

Sarma maintained that multiple elections leads to more expenditure and development also suffers.

Prime Minister Modi ji has correctly realised it and is advocating a rectly realised it and is advocating a system which will take India to a different level. The 23.10 hour count-down for the launch of Aditya L1 onboard PSLV C57 commenced here on Friday, ISRO said.

Of the total seven pay-loads, four onboard the spacecraft would directly view the Sun while the remaining three would undertake in-situ studies of particles and fields at the L1 point

the L1 point. Initially, the Aditya-L1 spacecraft would be placed in a low earth orbit. It would be made more elliptical and later

the spacecraft will be launched towards the Lagrange point L1 by using on-board propulsion systems.

As the spacecraft travels towards L1, it will exit els towards LI, it will exit the Earth's gravitational Sphere of Influence. After exit, the cruise phase will start and subsequently, the spacecraft will be injected into a large halo orbit around LI. It would take nearly four months to reach the intended L1

point.

The Aditya-L1 pay-loads are expected to pro-vide the most crucial information to under-stand the problems of coronal heating. Coronal mass ejection (CME), pre-flare, and flare activities, and their observatoristics and their characteristics dynamics, and space weather.
