

A new book on the life and times of former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister and National Conference (NC) president Farooq Abdullah was released on Monday, announced Fingerprint! Publishing – an imprint of Prakash Books Pvt.

"Farooq of Kashmir", written by journalists Ashwini Bhatnagar and RC Ganjoo, traces the journey of Abdullah from his childhood to his rise as a popular leader of Kashmir, who inherited the legacy of his father, Sheikh Abdullah, the founder of NC and the first Prime Minister of J&K.

It also explores the challenges and dilemmas that Abdullah faced as a politician who had to balance his loyalty to his people, his party, and his country amid the turbulent and complex situation in Kashmir.

Good news for sports lovers: Maiden sports University, six physical education Centers to come up in J&K soon

Jammu and Kashmir administration is likely to set-up its first sports university and six physical education institutions in both the regions.

Besides, the colleges of Jammu and Kashmir are also likely to get state of art sports infrastructure.

A top official privy to the decision, told news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), that "A Sports University will be set up in the UT to promote sports as a profession among the youth of Jammu and Kashmir."

"Also, state of art sports infrastructure will be created in colleges of Jammu and Kashmir along with development of six physical education Institutions one each at Peer Panjal area, Chenab Valley area, Jammu area, north Kashmir, south Kashmir and central Kashmir," it reads.

The concerned authorities have also proposed that it will conduct an annual sports festival under the banner of the Higher Education Department that shall be a Union Territory's event.

Besides setting up of sports university, the government of Jammu and Kashmir have proposed that it will 'offer all the applicable incentives of Jammu and Kashmir Industrial Policy to the Foreign Universities and Premier institutions of India, who will set up a campus in Jammu and Kashmir in collaboration with other existing colleges and technical education institutes and universities to promote twinning programs of the students and faculty'.

"A special scheme of facility up-gradation shall be introduced. The Government would support enhancing infrastructure at existing schools, colleges, Technical Education Institutions and universities to deliver the curriculum and conduct the activities as per global best practices in pedagogy,"

About the industry academia partnership, the concerned authorities from Jammu and Kashmir have proposed that, "Industries will be approached to partner with the government and adopt technical institutions for activities such as setting up center of excellence (CoE), initiating industry specific courses providing industrial internships, relevant industry linkages and help in upgrading to latest infrastructure." "The government will facilitate establishment

of training centers in collaboration with industry partners and existing local technical institutions on PPP mode to help skill and up-skill the youth in sectors of immediate demand," it reads. Top officials informed KNO, "We have already

sent a proposal to the Government of India (GoI) and we are sure that it will consider this proposal."

Meanwhile, Principal Secretary, Higher Education Department, Alok Kumar said, "This is a proposal and we are working on it in collaboration with the Jammu and Kashmir Sports Council.".

Hangul sighting in Gurez Valley sparks hope for conservation

GUREZ, SEP 25

The elusive Kashmir stag, known locally as Hangul, has been making frequent appearances in the pristine Gurez Valley of north Kashmir's Bandipora district. Renowned for its magnificent 11 to 16-point antlers, the Hangul, once considered a subspecies of the European red deer, is now recognised as an independent species by wildlife officials.

An official told the news agency that the resurgence of Hangul in the region has kindled hope for its conservation. While these sightings offer a glimmer of optimism, there is still ongoing debate and research surrounding its taxonomic classification, he said.

"Gurez was one of the few locations where the presence of the Kashmir stag had disappeared long ago, leading to its extinction several decades ago. However, the recent frequent sightings of the Hangul are a source of joy for everyone, as it appears that this magnificent animal has gradually returned to the valley," he added. The sustainability of a robust Hangul population

serves as an indicator of a thriving ecosystem and, in turn, contributes to the sustenance of other biodiversity, the official said.

He further said that the Kashmir stag inhabits the forests of Kishtwar and Bhaderwah, in addition to being found within Dachigam National Park in Kashmir, where it thrives at an elevation of 3,035 metres. The wildlife department records paint a concerning picture of its population. In 2015, the population stood at a mere 186, marking the lowest count in any decade. This sharp decline is a stark contrast to historical figures, where the Hangul once thrived with an estimated population ranging from 3,000 to 5,000 during the first half of the last century. Till date, nine censuses have been carried out during 2004, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2015, 2017, 2019, and 2021, and the Hangul population estimates in the past were 197, 153, 127, 175, 218, 186, 214, 237, and 261.

Another official said the species is facing a significant threat due to its vulnerable population, declining numbers, and habitat vulnerability.

"We are actively engaged in researching and monitoring the Hangul population within Dachigam National Park and its surrounding landscapes. As an endemic species and a vital part of our Union Territory's wildlife, the Department of Wildlife Protection is unwavering in its commitment to safeguard the Hangul," the official said. KNO

A change in Centre's approach?

Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, a prominent political and religious leader in Kashmir who has been involved in the region's political and separatist movements for many years, was set free four years after he was put under house arrest. Mirwaiz got emotional and broke down after he appeared before his people at Jamia Masjid for the first time. Being the religious head of the Jamia Masjid in Srinagar and the chairman of the region's main separatist group, the Hurriyat Conference, Mirwaiz has both social and political clout in Kashmir Valley. Mirwaiz's release has several potential significance because he has been a key figure in the political landscape of Kashmir. His release could signal a change in the government's approach toward Kashmir or its willingness to engage with local political leaders. It could also be seen as a gesture aimed at initiating a dialogue. It also appeared to be an unannounced Confidence-Building Measure (CBM). The release of a prominent leader like Mirwaiz Umar Farooq could be viewed as a CBM to create a more conducive environment for peace talks or negotiations between different stakeholders in Kashmir ahead of the much-talked about assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, though it is not clear as to when these elections are to be held. The restoration of the democratic process in J&K and the holding of Assembly elections are the key demands of all organisations as this process has been on hold since the abrogation of Article 370 by the Central Government on August 5, 2019, when the erstwhile state's special status was revoked and it was bifurcated into two union territories— J&K and Ladakh. A day earlier, Mirwaiz had been detained along with top political leaders and hundreds of separatists and Internet service was suspended under the stringent Public Safety Act. How the release is perceived by the people of Kashmir can also be significant. It could impact the local population's sentiments and opinions about the government's policies and actions in the region. Former Chief Minister and sitting MP Farooq Abdullah was released from detention in March 2020, while another ex-CM, Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) president Mehbooba Mufti, was freed in October that year. On both occasions, there was good reason to hope that their release would pave the way for the resumption of the electoral exercise in Jammu and Kashmir. Many others, including politicians, continue to be under detention. They need to be set free. Depending on the broader context and the conditions of Mirwaiz's release, it could have implications for the ongoing conflict in Kashmir. It may influence the dynamics between various groups and actors involved in the conflict. The development has come against the backdrop of the recent assurance of the Solicitor-General in the Supreme Court – which was hearing petitions against the abrogation of Article 370 that the Centre was ready to hold elections in J&K 'any time now', even though it could not specify any timeframe for the restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood. The release of a high-profile Kashmiri leader can attract international attention and scrutiny, potentially leading to diplomatic discussions or statements from other countries or international orga-



However, the people were annoyed with the way the Legislative Assembly is being delayed without any reason, and referred to the rumors about attempts to delay scheduled Urban Local Body and Panchayati elections in J&K.

"Certain elements do not want a peaceful atmosphere with an intention to delay elections in J&K with one reason or another. The anger among the people should be addressed without further delay by holding Assembly polls in J&K," he said.

He said that some of the top ranking bureaucrats do not want elections because they run the Govt as per their wishes and they fear their power will be taken over by an elected Govt.

"If we form the next Govt, we will identify such elements in the Govt who are bent upon to create differences among the union and state Govts and show them doors," he said while criticising the officials responsible for creating disorder in J&K.

He said that the elected representatives are responsible to the people and these babus are not answerable to anyone.

"The issue of NHAI, Toll Tax Collection, poor planning in Smart City Project, involvement of mining and liquor mafia etc are such examples that Jammu will not forget and the elected Govt will seek answers from babus," he said.

He however assured the people that the Apni Party is committed to revamp the living standard of the people by providing them a stable Govt that would represent both the regions equally.

Subsequently, the stranded family was shifted to Police Post Zachaldara for night stay by the joint team where they were also served with refreshment. Moreover, their stuck vehicle was toed from the spot by a JCB which was arranged by the Police and later escorted them up to the main road where from they resumed their journey to their home," police said.
