## **Devise strategies to** mitigate impact of extreme weather

## Covid-19 | Families grappling with vaccine-related fatalities deserve answers and support

global pharmaceutical manufacturer, has acknowledged that its Covid-19 vaccine, developed in collaboration with researchers from Oxford University, may lead to a rare side effect involving blood clotting and reduced platelet count post-immunisation. In India, where the vaccine is marketed under the name Covishield, and produced by Pune-based Serum Institute, an estimated 1.75 billion doses have been administered.

This revelation comes amidst legal proceedings in the United Kingdom, with the company disclosing the side effect, known as Thrombosis with Thrombocytopenia Syndrome (TTS), in response to a lawsuit alleging severe harm and fatalities stemming from the vaccine. Although this marks the first formal acknowledgment in a legal setting, TTS has been extensively documented and recognised in scientific literathe commencement of vaccination campaigns across Europe, prompting tempo-

Acknowledging and thoroughly investigating potential side effects is not an indictment of vaccines themselves but rather a fundamen-

While governments acted out of necessity to address the urgent health crisis, the focus on vaccine deployment must not overshadow the plight of individuals suffering from various side effects. While it may be theoretically untenable to hold governments solely accountable, questions arise regarding the accountability of vaccine manufacturers and distributors, entities with decades of clinical expertise and responsibility in ensuring product safety.

In medico-legal contexts, it is often tempting to dismiss adverse events as isolated incidents. However, in the case of vaccine design, where meticulous testing is paramount, the impact of Covid-19 vaccines on individuals' lives, including ongoing health challenges, cannot be disregarded. Families grappling with potential vaccinerelated fatalities deserve those contending with the enduring consequences of vaccine-related health issues.

In a humanitarian plea, one may ask: Is it too much to expect vaccine makers to lators, has the potential to tal aspect of ensuring public acknowledge that testing may

all, each vial of vaccine, while undoubtedly saving countless lives, may also carry the weight of families mourning lost loved ones or individuals grappling with vaccinerelated health issues. # Plug leakages in fertiliser subsidy

s part of the 100-day agenda of Modi 3.0, the Government intends to administer fertiliser subsidies more effectively and cut down on leakages and diversions to build on the success of neemcoated urea. It intends to conduct a pilot in a few districts on a modified version of the direct benefit transfer (DBT) that seeks to establish a linkage between the land holding of a farmer and nutrient consumption. A proposal in this regard mooted in 2020 is being resurrected. To make urea - a widely used fertiliser that supplies primary nutrient nitrogen or 'N' and constitutes nearly half of India's total fertiliser consumption - affordable to farmers, the Union Government controls its arrivals and track disbursal up maximum retail price (MRP) to the district level. at a low level unrelated to the cost of production/import and mobile and a web application higher. The excess cost over System (m-FMS) that provides MRP is reimbursed to the manufacturer/importer as a subsidy which varies from unit to unit depending on its cost. The MRP of urea is kept unchanged (today's price is more or less the same as in 2002) even as all cost escalations are absorbed by raising the subsidy.

urea fertilisers), there is a 'unibasis for all manufacturers under the Nutrient Based Subsidy (NBS) Scheme. They are free to fix MRP but need to reduce it to the extent of subsidy. Even as the subsidy remains unchanged, rising costs mean ever-increasing MRPs. The Department of Agriculture and Cooperation (DoAC) - in consultation with states - assesses the requirement of fertilisers for each cropping season - kharif (April to September) and rabi (October to March).

The Department of Fertilisers (DoF) prepares an agreed supply plan to cover all the urea requirements from domestic production and import. The states allocate all of the urea

Meanwhile, on the ground, a noticeable change is evident. The absence of worrisome elements such as calls for boycott and threats by militants to candidates or voters marks a significant departure from previous elections characterized by violence and unrest since 1989.

In the context of the 2019 parliamentary elections, which were held amidst heightened tensions in Kashmir, instances of stone-pelting and violence disrupted the electoral process, particularly in the Anantnag parliamentary seat, where nearly 100 polling booths recorded zero voter turnout. The overall voter turnout was dismal, reflecting the prevalent disillusionment and

unrest in the region. The aftermath of the BJP-led government's decision to abrogate Article 370 saw security agencies, including the Jammu and Kashmir police and the National Investigation Agency (NIA), taking measures to target militants and separatist elements. This crackdown led to the elimination of top militant figures and the deten-

The majority of prominent separatist leaders associated with the Hurriyat Conference are now behind bars, with their organizations banned by the Government of India for their involvement in promoting violence and terrorism in Kashmir. KNO

Fear descended in almost all schools of Delhi and many in adjoining Noida and Ghaziabad on Wednesday after receipt of an email threatening a terror attack, which was later declared as a "hoax" by the police and the government. The email prompted disruption of studies, evacuation and massive searches in the schools.

Have registered protest with China on illegal roadbuilding in Shaksgam **Valley: MEA**

India on Thursday said it has registered its protest with China against the road-building activity being undertaken in Shaksgam Valley, a part of Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir that Islamabad ceded to Beijing in 1963,

and also asserted that it is part of Indian territory.

The Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, answering a question on the infrastructure development being undertaken by China in the area, said: "We have registered our protest with the Chinese side against illegal attempts to alter facts on the ground."

He added: "We further reserve the right to take necessary measures to safeguard our interests' without elaborating. He said India has taken note of the activities being undertaken there, and added "We maintain it is our territory."

"We have never accepted the so-called China-Pakistan boundary agreement of 1963 through which Pakistan unlawfully attempted to cede the area to China and have consistently conveyed our rejection of the same.

"We have registered

our protest with the Chinese side against illegal attempts to alter facts on the ground. We further reserve the right to take necessary measures to safeguard our interest," he said. His statement comes following reports that say, citing satellite pictures, that China is building a road in Shaksgam valley, close to the Siachen Glacier.



### Prajwal's overseas departure triggers 'lookout' notice AGENCIES

KALABURAGI, MAY 2

In a significant development, Karnataka Home Minister Dr G Parameshwara revealed on Thursday that a 'lookout' notice has been initiated to capture Hassan NDA candidate Prajwal Revanna, who stands accused of sexual misconduct against women.

Speaking to reporters here, Dr Parameshwara stressed that despite Praiwal's plea for an extended grace period of seven days to appear before the Special Investigation Team (SIT) handling the case, such a provision does not exist beyond the standard

24-hour window. "The issuance of the lookout notice swiftly ensued upon learning of Prajwal Revanna's departure abroad. We have promptly informed all ports and airports about the lookout notice,' affirmed the Minister.

Prajwal, hailing from the lineage of former Prime Minister HD Deve Gowda and son of MLA and former Minister HD Revanna, finds himself embroiled in controversy after explicit video clips purportedly involving the 33-year-old MP surfaced in Hassan recently.

Public outcry has erupted, with protesters taking to the streets to express their outrage against Prajwal's alleged involvement in the sexual abuse case. Meanwhile, Aravind Limbavali, a BJP representative, remarked that the scandal has brought embarrassment to the

During the recent Lok Sabha election, Prajwal contested as the NDA candidate in the Hassan constituency, where polling took place on April 26.
