

# A milestone for democracy in J&K

The completion of the three-phase assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir marks a significant milestone in the region's political landscape. As the last phase concluded today, the Elections Commission of India is reporting a tentative overall voter turnout of 63.45%. Finding it hard to manage blood sugar levels? Take heart, limiting your food consumption to a 10-hour window daily may keep your diabetes in check, according to a study.

Following the 10-hour eating window, a type of intermittent fasting, can also help you manage metabolic syndrome -- a group of medical conditions that can lead to heart disease, diabetes, and stroke.

Risk factors attributing to the syndrome include elevated blood sugar, high blood pressure, and high cholesterol -- key factors for poor heart health.
