Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JKPCC) President Tariq Hameed Karra on Wednesday said that his party is prepared to form a post-poll alliance with any political group or individual opposed to the policies of the BJP. He also expressed optimism that if the undercurrent in the Jammu region translates into votes, the Congress will secure a sweeping victory.

In an exclusive interview with the news agency, Karra stated that if necessary and if need arises, the Congress in Jammu and Kashmir would not hesitate to form an alliance with like-minded groups or individuals to form the next government.

"The post-poll alliance will be formed only with those who are against the policies of the BJP. It could be with any individual who shares our vision, opposes BJP's policies, seeks the restoration of statehood, and stands against the repressive, oppressive, and suppressive measures of the BJP," Karra said.

He however declined to specifically comment over whether PDP will be part of the next government. "As I already told you, it could be anyone who is against the BJP's policies and approach."



Reaping the benefits of peace on borders

The assembly elections in Jammu, particularly in the border villages along the International Border (IB) with Pakistan, mark a significant turning point for local democracy and community engagement. For the first time in decades, villagers in areas like Jerda, close to the IB, were able to cast their votes without enduring the arduous trek of several kilometers to polling stations. This development is not just a logistical improvement; it symbolizes the profound impact of lasting peace and the aspirations of communities yearning for stability and recognition. Until the ceasefire agreement in February 2021, the Jammu division was marred by violence and uncertainty, with villagers frequently subjected to shelling that disrupted their daily lives and eroded their sense of security. The fact that polling stations have now been established within these communities reflects a crucial shift. As former Sarpanch noted, the establishment of a polling station in Jerda is not merely about convenience; it represents the restoration of their democratic rights in a place that has long been overshadowed by conflict. The festive atmosphere in Jerda on polling day serves as a powerful reminder of the resilience and hopes of these communities. For many residents, casting a vote in their own village was an emotional moment, a reclamation of agency that had been denied to them for far too long. This joy was echoed across other border areas, such as Akhnoor and Chhamb, which also recorded impressive voter turnouts. These statistics are not just numbers; they signify a collective desire for peace and progress. Moreover, the establishment of facilities like the 'Air-Conditioned Tourist Bunker' in Jerda, which includes a library and television, is a promising step towards border tourism. It highlights an emerging opportunity for economic development that could transform these previously neglected areas into vibrant hubs of cultural exchange and tourism. If successful, this model could be replicated in other border villages, further integrating them into the national narrative and enhancing their prospects. As residents celebrate their newfound ability to participate in democratic processes. it is essential to recognize the broader implications of this peace. The establishment of polling stations closer to home not only adheres to the guidelines set by the Election Commission of India but also enhances the safety and security of voters in sensitive areas. The presence of polling stations near Border Bunkers underscores a commitment to ensuring the protection of citizens while they exercise their rights. The shift in the political landscape is a testament to the resilience of the people living along the border. Their voices are now being heard, and their needs are being addressed. This growing political engagement is crucial in fostering a sense of belonging and citizenship among residents who have often felt marginalized. The road to lasting peace and development is still long, but the recent elections signal a hopeful trend. Residents are not merely voting; they are making a statement-a declaration that they want to live in peace and that they demand attention to their needs. The voter from Suchetgarh, who articulated her community's hope for continued peace, encapsulates the collective aspiration of these border villages. Study says diagnostic errors can occur in 1 in every 14 hospital patients

NEW YORK, OCT 2

Diagnostic errors are likely to be occurring in as many as 1 in every 14 (7 per cent) hospital patients which requires new approaches to medical surveillance, a new study has stressed.

The study, published online in the journal BMJ Quality and Safety, said that 85 per cent of these errors are likely preventable and underscore the need for new approaches to improving surveillance to avoid these mistakes from happening in the first place.

The study authors wrote that an estimated 85 per cent of harmful diagnostic errors were preventable, with older, White, non-Hispanic, nonprivately insured and highrisk patients most at risk. The researchers sug-

gested that a careful analysis of the errors and integrating AI tools into the workflow should help minimise their prevalence, by improving monitoring ventions.

Centre (KFRC) on Tuesday announced the inauguration of its Telemedicine centre for the Deaf. India is home to over 1.8 million individuals with profound hearing loss, and Deaf people in India face numerous challenges when interacting with healthcare professionals, primarily due to communication barriers.

A significant hurdle is the shortage of certified Indian Sign Language (ISL) interpreters, with only around 300 interpreters available nationwide.

This lack of accessibility often prevents deaf individuals from accessing essential healthcare services, making it difficult to schedule appointments or communicate effectively with doctors.

Latham, who has captained the Test side on nine previous occasions, will lead a 15-strong Test squad including Southee, to India next Friday.

Southee has played 102 Tests for the Black Caps since debuting in 2008, claiming 382 wickets, second only to Sir Richard Hadlee.

The 35-year-old has captained the side in 14 Tests (6 wins, 6 losses, 2 draws) since taking over from Kane Williamson in December 2022, and said the decision to step down was made in the best interests of the team.
